Dear EVO:

The answer to the narcotics problem is plain and simple to anyone who looks at the problem objectively, with a true interest in being helpful and successful in stemming the malicious aspects of narcotics usage.

1. Legalize marijuana. The only bad thing that competent people have been able to say about marijuana is that "it leads to stronger stuff." This is plainly false, having as much truth as to say smoking cigarettes or drinking alcohol, either of which a junkie is likely to have done prior to his habit, caused his habit. However, in the sharedness of their illegality, marijuana and heroin do turn up in the same places. Many children who would never associate with the majority of junkies, find themselves meeting junkies on their way to obtaining some marijuana. As marijuana is attested harmless by nearly all competent authorities, would it not be in the best interests of society to legalize marijuana, making available in non-criminal places this popular intoxicant?

2. Make heroin and methodone freely available to all junkies. Many middle-class people are unaware of the constant terror and financial loss suffered, by those who can least afford it, in bad neighborhoods. The junkie problem is acute in New York City, more than half of our crime is attributed to it. Private suffering and great public cost, through prison, hospital, and welfare programs, are poured down the drain of this usually-endless habit. How then to best "war or crime"? Take the profit away from the pushers, and take the junkies out of the dilemma of becoming criminals to support their habits, simply by making heroin and methodone freely available to all junkies. For a few cents a day, the public can save the hundreds of dollars a week that each junkie costs, and make our streets safer. As the program would be limited to present addicts, no new ones will be created, whereas today's junkies "push" heroin to support their habits, thereby making new junkies. Methodone, along with suitable programs, should be available to those who want to cure their habit. As is commonly known, methodone will stop the craving for heroin and make it impossible to get high.

3. Expose the dangers of psychedelics, amphetamines, and barbiturates, but do not associate their use with criminality.

Why is society unwilling to help itself in these simple ways? Why has President Johnson called for a war on narcotics, with more police enforcement and stiffer penalties against small users, leaving as ever the real sources of heroin unhindered? Why is the same approach that has suited the Mafia so well for so long, and exponentially increased crime, why is this approach proposed anew? One might think that someone high up wants to keep the Mafia in business. Then again the Johnson administration has shown a general persistence in wrong approaches (and little follow-thru on right approaches).

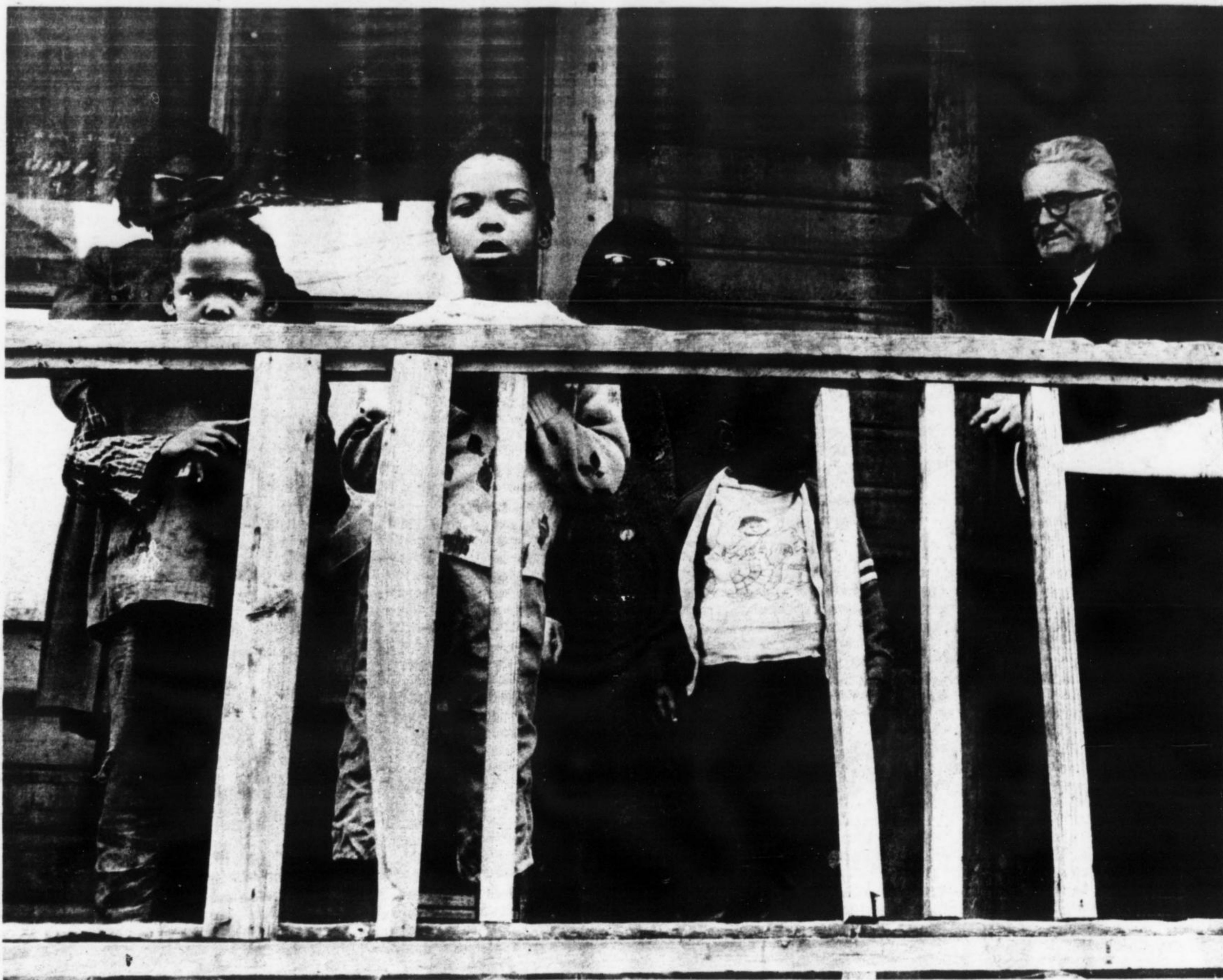

When we come.

"Five of our people were charged with sedition last Fall and Winter. We were accused of trying to overthrow the government of Pike County, Kentucky — and I might say we plan to do that very thing as soon as we find out how to do it."

That was Carl Braden quote and unquote. Carl and Anne Braden are running an outfit called the Southern Conference Educational Fund (SCEF) that has been working and organizing black and white people in the South for thirty years. Carl is here in New York to meet nice people interested in the Southern movement and who are against the government.

Carl, if I quote you on that you'll be thrown in jail immediately, I said.

"Shit, I've been in so many jails I've lost track of 'em. I don't give a damn. Mind you, we're going to do it peaceably. Non-violent direct action. Political action is basic to everything. Non-violence is a weapon."

Is this the philosophy of King, I asked.

"We start from political action as the base of organization and we call it non-violent direct political action, whereas the civil rights movement has, until recently, started from non-violent direct action mounted on demonstration. The difference is that with a demonstration you get the specific thing you want, if you're lucky. With our approach you attempt to change the personnel in power and so are able to effect more than one change in the structure of community life. This way you can make basic changes. Even the cops in Louisville have got the message. Years ago they used to beat black people as a matter of course. Now they don't as a general rule. Louisville used to be just like Birmingham is now, but we've been working on making changes."

Carl doesn't believe in demonstrations unless you have political power to underwrite them. Gandhi's demonstrations were always bolstered by enormous political strength in the sense of the numbers he could mobilize to march and to fill up the Indian jails. It was never a question of appealing to the conscience of the British colonialists — who were as racist as white Americans.

What's the biggest thing going on in the South?

"The race between the right wingers (the Klan and Wallace) and the civil rights movement to organize the white population." (Civil rights? I thought that was passe — "Okay, HUMAN rights might be better. That's what we've been working for all along.")

"Whites of all social and economic strata are seeing that they have an identity of interest with the black people's movement. They feel it's strength and they want to relate to it. The outcome of the Memphis dispute has impressed them. The fact that the black people have organized and are making gains has shown whites the strength in organization."

All this sounds unreal, I told him; it seems impossible that white people in the South would see a common community with the blacks. Carl replied "for instance in a story coming in the next issue of the SOUTHERN PATRIOT, the newspaper published by SCEF and obtainable by subscription; about a mountaineer named Fulcher who lives in West Virginia and who has decided that coalition between black and white is necessary."

Fulcher, Carl says, is typical of many of the oppressed white people of the South. This man is working on the Poor People's Campaign to get people to march from Bluefield, W. Va. to Washington. These

will be poor white people and they will ride and march to Washington and will join with the black caravans who are starting from Jackson, Miss. on May 4. The route from Jackson goes through Nashville, Tenn. on to Knoxville, Danville and Washington. Fulcher's group will join them. Until recently, Fulcher didn't think black people were worth fooling with. He is a former coal miner who has been unemployed for many years. He became chairman of his local Community Action Program in Mercer County, W. Va. and became involved with the local people in the movement. On March 14 he went to Atlanta for a meeting with King and other representatives of minority groups in the South and was impressed with the organization and resultant power of S.C.L.C.

"The usual picture of the Southern white comes from the fact that the articulate whites have been the right wingers, like the Klan, who have been organized. White people who are potential allies of the black movement have not been organized or articulate and are only now finding their voice. SCEF is organizing them now. Our organizers go into plantation and mining country and work with people around issues as they see them. We emphasize the approach that their problems can be solved by putting their own people into power rather than putting pressure on the politicians who are now in power."

"Right now the Poor People's Campaign is in need of volunteers for their march on Washington D. C. which will be coming up soon. They will be present at the April 27th march in New York City. Look for their banner. They need help distributing pamphlets and other things. Contact them at 1158 Bway (entrance 27th St.) or call 532-7200."



To loot or not to loot is the trick question until Mayor Richard J. Daley decides to shoot Hubert Horatio Humphrey, one of several nervous pretenders to the American throne.

It is Joshua Daley who dutifully promised last Easter Monday to shoot his looters. And Humphrey who vowed months ago he'd be out there in the fire getting some clean underwear if he were black.

Yes, Sir!

Daley, who once agreed with J. Edgar Hoover that Martin Luther King was the most notorious liar & troublemaker in America, instructed his Chicago policemen "to shoot to kill" arsonists and to "shoot to maim or cripple" looters. And children? "You wouldn't want to shoot them," Daley said. He would use Chemical Mace to "detain them."

So there we are, ladies & American gentlemen, the looters are laughing & we must shoot to dike their laughter and, maybe soon, this year, next year, the months after, every black on the street is a looter, no more need for Sniper Excuse, mace them & shoot 'em, the black bastards should stop brushing their teeth if they don't like whites.

But there is a difference, Sir, another consciousness stalking the fear & greed of an odious racial privilege that makes it o.k. for Daley to do "responsible looting" (patronage) while he promises to shoot even Humphrey — if he were black.

This iniquity was pointed out the same Easter Monday at the funeral of Harlan Joseph, the 19-year-old divinity student who was shot in the back by Trenton, New Jersey police Tuesday after King's death.

"I'm not here today to say that the death of Martin Luther King and the death of Harlan Joseph are the sins of any single individual — not at all," said the minister. "The blame rests with corporate society, the social order, our way of life." And rights officials say the police falsely accused the Lincoln University sophomore of looting & that affidavits taken from witnesses allege that Harlan was actually trying to prevent disorder when he was shot. But the police said he was looting, and the police are honorable men. So back to hypocrisy.

Even the aging Daughters of the American Revolution (before electing Mrs. E. Frees Seimes president general until 1970) demanded suppression of black sociopolitical uppityness by "all available means." except kissing 'em.

And our Mayor Lindsay said, "We happen to think that protection of life, particularly innocent life, is more important than protecting property or anything else. We are not going to turn disorder into chaos through the unprincipled use of armed force.

"In short, we are not going to shoot children in New York City," and he is against macing looters.

But New York police already has the power & the glory to shoot to kill.

But this shooting could lead (Attorney General Ramsey Clark said) to "a very dangerous escalation of the problems we are so intent on solving." And more indiscriminate use of military force (already rampant) could provoke organized counterattack by blacks, encourage "terrorist and guerrilla tactics," and risk "permanent alienation among minorities."

"The more oppressive a police department becomes, the greater is our desire to resist, to the point where we don't care whether we live or die any longer," said the Rev. James E. Groppi, Roman Catholic priest of Milwaukee. And, "If he (Daley) uses that kind of treatment, he's going to get some return gunfire. To shoot a 12-year-old kid for stealing a six-pack of beer — I think it is immoral."

So the trick runs from Daley who wants to kill to blacks who know they must not be killed to the Attorney General who has to be aware of the general abuse of power by police throughout the country in matters of civil rights & other issues relevant to the salvation (or destruction) of this nation, supposedly a free home for everyone.

A large segment of law enforcement agencies in the country feel privately or publicly that all rioters should be shot on the spot to restore order & peace to a country which lives so well off warring. And the merchants want protection. Most of them don't care how it is done, but they want it. One New Yorker is suing the Mayor & the City for \$250,000 because police did nothing to stop kids from looting his store after the King assassination. And black and Puerto Rican merchants are demanding that the city repay them for losses during the mourning scrimmage for merchandise.

So let Humphrey dream of looting & be confronted by nightmares, for it is the same HHH who believes that the problem with Negroes is they don't have Jewish Mothers.

But this is the kind of logic that makes Presidents.

Out of this maze of taxation, there are certain cliched premises developed over the years that we must abandon when looking at the tax structure of this country.

- 1) The tax system, including the income tax is a fair and equitable system.
- 2) There is always representation for those who are taxed and never any for those who are not.
- 3) Under a capitalistic system, taxation does not necessarily have to favor the rich and the powerful.

In the beginnings of the federal income tax, the idea of a graduated tax scale was thought to have democratic overtones. The higher the income the higher the tax was a simple plan and had wide appeal among the masses. But as America's productivity grew and its civilization became more complex, loopholes were needed in the tax law to give the industrious and the rich the ability to invest and prosper. The capitalistic system could not be molded at all to fit into any kind of democratic tax structure. As the art of lobbying grew into a way of life in the halls of Congress, powerful groups took advantage of the loopholes and convinced Congress to legislate in their favor. The capital gains tax was born allowing a man to make a sizeable profit while only leaving a maximum of 25% of that profit in the taxable category. At that very moment, the tax shelter was initiated. Congress also in later years introduced into legislation, under the Internal Revenue Code of 1933, tax shelters for the Oil and Gas industry allowing for a 27% depletion deduction in order to stir up more investment and greater development in the industry itself. Banks and life insurance companies, long considered the funnel for almost all investment capital in this country, were quickly afforded tax protection. Corporations, in general, were favored with all kinds of considerations to allow their working capital enough time and leeway to produce the most profit without the tremendous tax bite being taken out. The rich taxpayer was afforded the protection against an overwhelming tax burden under such guises as trusts, income splitting and charitable foundations. As the loopholes opened up, the tax structure began to fall more heavily upon the middle class, and as in no other country but America was there such a substantial amount of people who made up this category, the tax structure, instead of crumbling, stood firmly rooted to the ground like a pyramid. The rich had their protection and the poor had their excuse.

The inequities of our tax structure are not only of a vertical nature. In March of 1965, Secretary Dillon, who was then the Secretary of the Treasury, noted in a speech before the American Bankers Association that "vertical equity — has unintentionally drawn attention away from the equally serious problem of horizontal equity — the unfair tax treatment of different individuals at basically similar income levels." Mr. Dillon decried taxes which discriminate against individuals whose wealth comes from earned income and dividends, taxable, not only in the year of receipt but also as well at death. He noted it allowed other individuals to invest in growth securities which are not taxable until death.

Other inequities and misapplications of the tax laws have never been more obvious than in the laws pertaining to charitable foundations. In a treasury report on private foundations released in February of 1965, the treasury stated five major problems that existed:

1. Self-dealing: that is loans made to substantial donors, or to any of the foundation's officers or trustees; any member of their families, or to a corporation controlled by them.
2. Family use of foundations to control corporate and other property.
3. Delay in benefits to charity.
4. Foundation involvement in business.
5. Financial transactions unrelated to charitable functions.

The Treasury department pointed out the need to broaden the function of an independent management within the area of charitable foundations. After all, the treasury concluded, once a tax deduction was allowed for a contribution the money somehow became transmuted into public funds which the public had at present, the right to administer. This public administration would deter private parties, within the foundation, from shifting a substantial measure of the financial benefit of the foundation's tax exemption to themselves and also prevent the private foundation from converting its tax exemption into a self-sufficient device for production of capital thereby ending its reliance upon contributions and eliminating the scrutiny of its varied activities.

There remain now a couple of words to say about the existence of religious charities under a democratic government and they have to do with both separation

of Church and State and representation without taxation. The Church, in the past, has always been a tax free organization and yet has always been able to bring to bear a great deal of pressure upon the various governmental institutions that legislate our laws. Consider the fact that the State of New York has not, to this date, revised its abortion laws although the majority of legislators are willing to do so and the majority of people who pays taxes for their fair share of representation in the state government are in favor of a fairer abortion law. This is certainly proof positive that our democratic government does not work basically upon representation but also upon the amount of pressure one group can apply upon all other groups by working with the legislative bodies of the land, and this because our tax system leaves the financial ability of certain groups in tact to do so by not taxing them at all. We must realize that by not taxing the Church we are giving them the use of property to produce income which because it is not taxable creates much more pressure on those properties that are taxable to make up the deficits in City, State and Federal budgets now in existence. In essence, what we are doing is requiring all taxpayers to surrender a charitable donation to the Church without giving these taxpayers the right of free choice to donate or not to donate their income to specific charities, I agree it is an indirect donation, but it exists nevertheless and creates an imbalance of responsibility upon those who are now footing the bills.

Moving toward a more general view of representative democracy, the social problems that exist in our society are tied hand and foot to the United States Income tax system. Americans have never favored taxation without representation, but on the other hand, neither have we favored representation for those who can ill afford to pay taxes due to their lack of income. It is because of this reason that the poor, who are mostly Negroes, have had to organize into pressure groups which operate mainly outside of society. They were never really included in the mechanizations of society to begin with and therefore their problems were left to fester in the streets and slums of the poor man's existence. Only after the riots of recent months has Congress come to consider their plight, but the solutions offered have been typically American. One such solution was to get Private industry to participate in providing jobs for the disadvantaged and to develop lowcost housing projects. To get private enterprise to participate, it has been suggested that favorable tax considerations for these corporations be given.

LIST YOUR EXEMPTIONS AND SIGN ON OTHER SIDE.

The day after April 15th most of middle-class America breathes a sigh of relief. The tax returns are in and the money is long on its way to the counting house. The war machine is given its lubricant and the Congressmen of this nation come out of hiding thinking of that dreadful time in the future when they may be required to raise the taxes of the citizens that they represent in order to forestall an inflationary trend that may be headed in the direction of the country's economy like bad weather. It is also a day, unlike any other day, filled with the nightmares about a runaway tax computer auditing every tax return in the country; of an unfriendly Internal Revenue Agent's face smirking at you from behind his desk of inquisition while you just sit and wait for him to empty your pockets of all the hidden income you've neglected to claim and listen to the music from the motion picture "Pay or Die" that is being piped over the musac system installed in the waiting room for your amusement. It is also a day of fear when you might have to give up that deduction so dishonestly claimed under the heading of contributions.

There was a time when Americans had never heard of deficit finance and unbalanced budgets, but that time has long since faded into history and one remembers it as a pastoral fairytale with a happy ending. There was also a day when no income tax existed nor any such inconvenience seemed to be evident upon the horizon of the American economy. Now the Federal tax guide is crammed with over 10,000 pages of laws, rules and regulations and is still growing in complexity. It is a strain just to lift the book, let alone read it, and the federal income tax is not the only intrusion upon our private lives. BLOOD, SWEAT, AND TEARS 'FIRES' KOOPER

New York's Blood, Sweat, and Tears, one of the first of the highly touted big brassy, rock bands is having personnel problems, apparently a genetic disease of such large groups. (Rumor has it two of Mike Bloomfield's horn men are leaving the Electric Flag). Formed by Blues Project alumni Steve Katz (lead guitar and vocal) and Al Kooper along with Bobby Colomby (drums), the band has been racked by tactical infighting between the Katz-Colomby faction and Kooper. This has resulted in the departure of the organist-vocalist to pursue a career in production, composing and arranging although a new band for Kooper in the near future seems probable. Blood, Sweet & Tear's Columbia album has been selling well and the band appeared to be really beginning to move commercially.

THE MOTHERS OF INVENTION made their final New York appearance at the Fillmore Saturday night. They're moving back to the West coast after living here for over a year. So fantastic was the last set that an appreciative audience sat enthralled till almost 4:00 a.m. If all of the Mother's performances are special, this session was great. Two hours with two encores featuring superb musicianship and brilliant satire by the most advanced and integrated musical group in the country made for a memorable goodbye. We hope Zappa's dislike for New York won't keep them away too long.

It should prove interesting to see what these rock and roll professionals produce without Kooper's dynamic leadership and elaborate arrangements. For it was the confident Al Kooper who took control of Blood, Sweat, and Tears during its formation and provided its strength and direction while garnering much publicity in the hip rock magazines and establishment trade papers. Although this was the first experience as group leader for the composer of "This Diamond Ring" and former member of the Royal Teens, (the former a million seller by Gary Lewis and the Playboys and the latter group of "Short Shorts" fame), Kooper fancies himself a mini-Zappa. "My head," explaining Kooper, "is a cache of forty thousand

Some publications can't afford to pay much and we have arranged to set up non-competitive non-exclusives at lower prices." POP-WIRE is located at 420 Lexington Avenue. The phone number is 686-0121.

Awareness is catching, and like death and taxes the one constant in Civilization that human existence up till now has been unable to avoid. In the 20th Century it moves at a much faster rate than in any other previous time in History. In the last three years, since the advent of the Underground Press, the birth rate of words and publications has risen despite the TV tube contraceptive.

To match the already structured Underground Press Syndicate with its hundred or so publications being spewed out of offbeat bohemian communities, and the one hundred and twenty five off-campus newspapers localized under the banner of the Liberation News Service with telex wires working in New York, Washington, D.C., Detroit and San Francisco; the High School Independent Press Service (HIP) was recently formed.

Located at 34 W. 17th St. on the fourth floor, HIP will function as an aid in building a radical/political consciousness in high school students, and broadening it to help students view local action as part of a national rebellion of youth.

The service will compile and circulate a weekly mailing of high school news, which will be received by all of its members. A photography service will also be set up, in which high school photographers will be available on one-day notice to cover stories in schools which don't have their own. HIP will also have reprint rights of LNS and UPS stories and utilize their reporters when necessary. It will also maintain its own file of artwork, stories, and poetry sent in to their office by member publications.

HIP has already established a membership of twenty five publications from Beverly Hills, Calif. to Greensborough, N.C. to Long Island, New York. Its future plans are to establish workshops in radical journalism and printing which will be conducted by adults with experience in these fields. Other future plans consist of fund-raising events, using mainly high school talent, to buy an offset press which would be for the use of the High School Independent Press.

HIP is a necessary outgrowth of events. AWARENESS is spreading faster to the younger section of the

Below are extracts from Appendix 3 to Annex N Civil Affairs, of USINCEUR OPLAN NR 100-1 (U), emanating from Headquarters United States European Command.

It is in effect a draft treaty of occupation, giving the US Forces the right to put down civil disturbances, make arrests, and act with total immunity from the civil law of the country that signs it.

The document, accompanied by an authentication (marked TOP SECRET), is signed by Major General B. E. Spivy, Director J-3 Division. This is dated October 1962. Whether this means everything is out of date I am not in a position to say — however the draft is marked to be "Downgraded at 17 year intervals, not automatically." Nor can I say whether this agreement has been signed, and with what countries. Correspondents of larger newspapers might care to find out, or Congressmen could try asking questions in Congress. Already the Dutch newspaper "De Groene Amsterdammer" has broken the story (on March 2nd) and Dutch MP Hein van Wijk has put questions to his government. So far the English and American Press have ignored the story.

What follows is a draft of the emergency SOF Agreement will be concluded in the form of an Exchange of Notes between the Foreign Ministry or other appropriate authority of (country) and

the US Ambassador, or Commander of the US Forces in (country).

SUBSTANTIVE PROVISIONS
2(b): The US Forces shall have the right to occupy any area or facility considered necessary for the accomplishment of their mission or for their safety and continued security, as determined by US military commanders (emphasis added) and to install such equipment therein as they shall deem necessary for these purposes.

(c): Military commanders of the US Forces may take such measures as they deem necessary to provide adequate security for their installations, personnel and equipment, and for the movement of supplies and personnel in () . . . In the event of acts of violence against US installations, equipment or personnel by persons other than members of the US Forces, such persons may be apprehended by the US Forces and turned over to the Government of () for appropriate disposition in accordance with the laws of that country.

(d): In the event of internal disorder which may materially affect the mission or security of the US Forces, such as armed violence or widespread rioting (emphasis added), the Government of () will endeavour to quell such disorders with its sources. However should these measures prove ineffective, or should the Government of () request assistance, or should the US military commander consider that the Government of () does not possess the capability of quelling such disorders effectively or in time, the US Forces may take such action as the US military commander deems necessary, either unilaterally or in cooperation with the Government of () (emphasis added).

(e): The Government of () shall make available to the US Forces such information and intelligence reports as will assist them in achieving their mission or as the US military commander requests (emphasis added).

(g): No civil action shall be brought in the courts of () against any member of the US Forces.

(m): The Government of () will furnish to units of the US Forces, free of charges of any kind and without present or future US liability for claims arising out of the US use thereof, installations and facilities which are deemed to be necessary to support US Forces in their mission . . . The US Government will be under no obligation to restore these areas to their original use or to repair roads and bridges utilized by the US Armed Forces . . .

(n): . . . Authorized operators of vehicles of the US Forces shall be exempt from compliance with the local laws and regulations pertaining to the operation and use of vehicles

(r): The Government of () authorizes the US Forces to bring nuclear weapons into (); to station them at such locations as may be deemed necessary.

(t): This agreement shall come into force immediately upon being signed by both parties and shall remain in force until ninety days after the departure of the US Forces from () unless previously terminated by mutual agreement . . .

Final Clause

4: The Embassy of the United States of America (the Commander US Forces in ()) avails itself (himself) of this opportunity to renew to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs the assurances of its (his) highest consideration.

SATYAGRAHA (after Gandhi's movement in India) will be conducting a world wide fast May 12th—15th on most U.S. college campuses, as well as in Canada, England, Japan, France and possibly Germany, Denmark, Holland and Sweden against the war in Vietnam.

Their principles are simple: 1) an obligation to humanity to sacrifice in an effort to end the war and; 2) that violent means cannot bring about truly lasting peace for they foster only

more widespread and violent reaction. They advocate noncooperation (with laws such as the draft with which one cannot morally agree) and nonviolent protest (such as mass fasting).

In Washington, D.C., Carl Levine Publishing house will be taking up the cause and trying to undercut the bad talk with, probably, bad books. The publicity they will release will run the associative gambit like "We don't say Melina Mercouri is a Communist but . . .".

And we don't say the Greek Junta is CIA inspired or facist but . . .

Kuromiya was arraigned in Federal court on \$500 bail for trying to unlawfully use the mails to send "an obscene, indecent and crime-inciting" poster.

Cuba Nostra Libre?

The Cuban underworld elements appear to have moved into New York City as an area of operation with 3 probable actions over this past weekend.

On Friday nite past, El Tiempo — the local pro-Batista rag sponsored an affair at Town Hall commemorating the invasion of Playa Giron in 1961. With all their circulation and the Cuban exile population of a few hundred thousand in this area, he was only able to draw 800 in a hall that seats 1500. It would have passed unnoticed by all other media except that some-one set off stink bombs and cleared the house (including Sen Javits).

A few years ago, one automatically would have blamed the Pro-Castro elements, however, in this day and age, they are in minority here and are not in a position to "make waves." That nite, on TV and radio, Stanley Ross (editor of El Tiempo) at-

tributed the stink bombs to a Miami based terrorist group which uses the monniker "Poder Cubano" (Cuban Power).

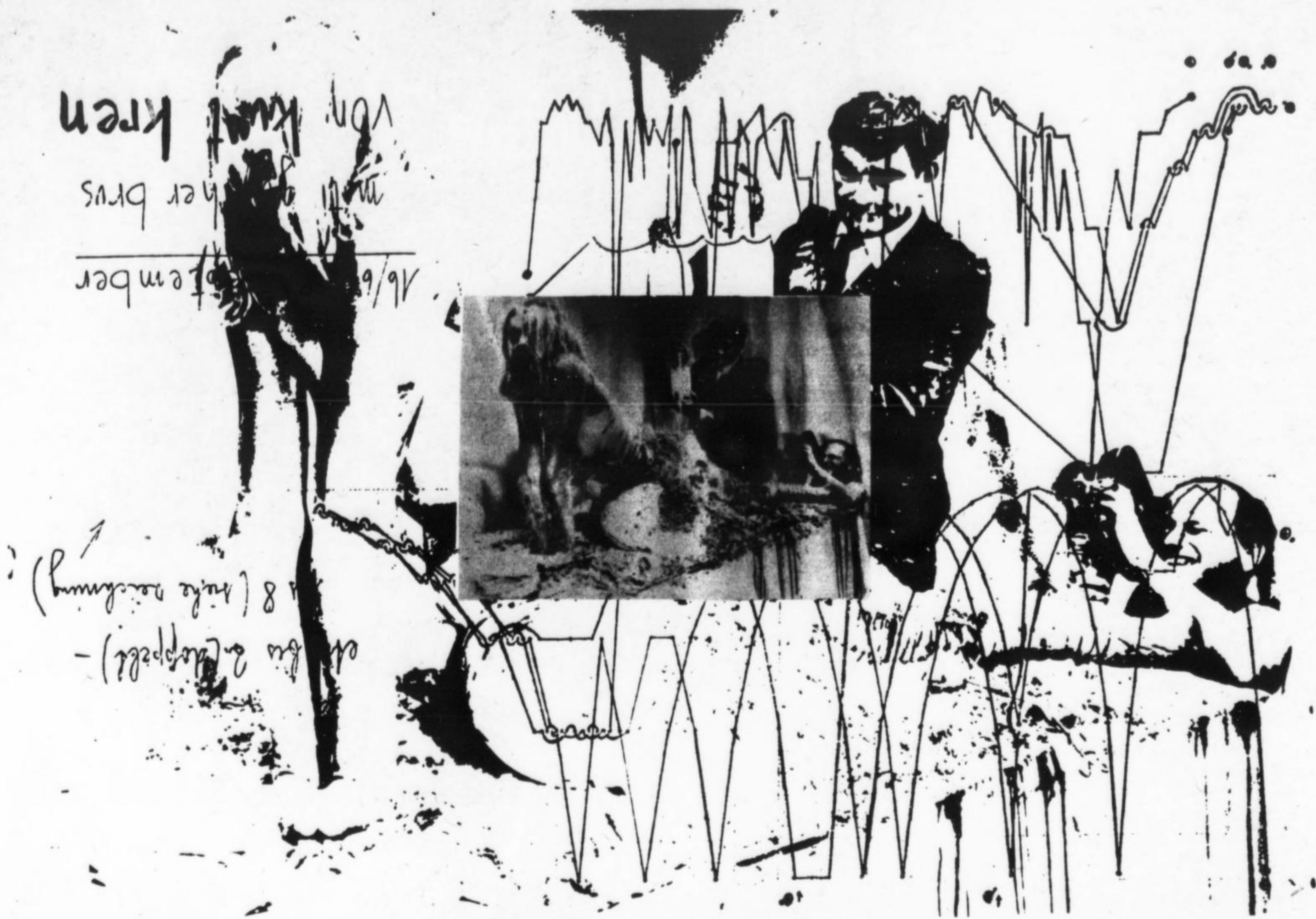
This group of exiles appears to be sympathetic to the gambling and whore-house interests which were among the first to be shut down and driven out of Cuba by Castro and which we so graciously accepted into this country as "refugees." They are basically unaligned politically and do not operate with a political ideology as a base but have been conducting a terrorist operation in Florida against other Cuban exile groups, leaders, supporters (and the CIA) on the pretext of intimidating these people to "contribute to their 'revolution'."

Between Fri nite and Sunday, Stanley must have received a "message" because in his editorial in Monday's El Tiempo he changes his story and blames

pro-Castro elements. At the same time, the doorways of the Spanish National Tourist Office and the Mexican Consulate were bombed and a sign with the inscription "Cuban Power" was left at the site of the Spanish bombing. Both Spain (Franco) and Mexico have been tolerant of the Castro government and therefore would not be the targets of pro-Castro elements or sympathizers.

NOTE: This group is also against the return to power of Batista because of the necessity (in that eventuality) of his starting with a regime that would be essentially reformist on the surface and not co-operative towards the former vice that existed in Sin-city (Havana) of the Batista days of old.

NAKED LUNCH—Talk with Viennese Filmmaker Kurt Kren and Jon Hendricks.

Kurt Kren was born in Vienna, Austria, and is less than 40. He is about 5 feet 2 inches, hides bright eyes behind black glasses and always wears a funny little tan cap. In the morning hours he is normally sleepy and tired. He loves to eat and drink. His favorite food is fish. He is soft spoken, very human, friendly, but one thing is sure: he has character and talent. I love him. He came to New York with very little money, which he got by selling one of his films to the Museum of the 20th Century in Vienna.

Kren's films are unusual, strange, shocking, artistic and all very short. Each one lasts about 10 minutes. They are 16mm. in color or black and white. Some are abstract, some realistic-surrealistic.

He showed four at EVA. I interviewed him and Hendricks after the screening at the Naked Lunch. Three of the films I saw had been in color, the last one a 1967 movie, was done in black and white. He had not enough money to do it in color. This film, called 20th September is Kren's most shocking and controversial one. Its theme is drinking and pissing, eating and shitting. It is a powerful film, tough to do and tough to see. Also all the other films have a lot to do with food, we all went to eat at the Naked Lunch—Kren ordered ham.

Kren does films of Ott Muehl's Happenings, and Gunter Brus', who does destruction-events. Both artists belong to the Institute for Direct Art in Vienna. Besides Kren, Muehl and Brus some other artists and filmmakers are connected with the Institute. In 1965 Hermann Nitsch the Orgy-Mystery-Theater man belonged to the Institute. He left it 1966 went to Germany and now lives in Munich. He showed his Theater recently here in New York and in the University of Cincinnati. He went back to Munich pleased with his New York and Cincinnati stay and thinks America is great. He loves New York and wants to come back.

Kren will go to Washington University, St. Louis; Missouri, where he has been invited by visiting Professor Udo Kultermann (from Germany) to show his films.

On May 12 Kurt Kren will show his films in the New York Cinematheque, 80 Wooster Street.

L.P.: In your press-reviews, Kren, I often noticed the German word: "Verfremdung" applied to your films. What does this mean in English?

K.K.: "Verfremdung" is a word which Bertolt Brecht used for the technique of his "Reality-Plays." "Verfremdung" is a changed reality, a transformed reality, not the real Life-Reality. The actor remains the actor, he is not the murderer, or the peasant or the soldier, he is the play of the real thing, the changed transformed reality.

L.P.: Do you apply this technique of "changed transformed reality" to your filmmaking?

K.K.: Yes.

L.P.: Tell me about your films.

K.K.: My film Mama and Papa is played, directed and written by Otto Muehl. "Ulla" a Wiener Maedel (Viennese Chick) is the blonde beautiful star. It is a film of physical sensuousness, colors, movement. I cut the frames and I repeat the actions very fast. In this way I do a kind of destruct-film, technically. It was done in 1964.

L.P.: The movie seemed to me abstract. You use food, the female body, eggs, flower, blood, all these substances for Form, and Muehl as the actor in it, becomes part of the transformed reality of all these substances, in a strange kind of direct action. I completely forgot, while looking at the film, the subject matter. I only saw the movement, the quick changing, the cutting, the actions, the speed, the staccato. What was the second color-film called?

K.K.: "O Tannenbaum." It is also a work by Otto Muehl. I filmed it in Vienna.

L.P.: I think this film is like a speed-dance: colors and bodies are moving in space, they float, bodies tremble and wriggle, the materiality of substance is extremely sensual, the skin of the bodies plays a role, the colors are physical, eggs, blood, flower, yellow, red, white, a rose is photographed lying on genitals, all these pictures are surreal, . . . very poetic, beautiful, forms appear and disappear, very beautiful . . .

K.K.: The third film you looked at was titled: "Cosinus Alpha." It's a mathematical term.

L.P.: Why this name?

K.K.: For practical reasons. Police, Customs, etc. . . . It is a material action, ten minute 16mm. film in color. Two female bodies are used. They are Art-models. They are filmed in slow or fast motion. It is one of my most provocative films, underlining optical sensuality. I show images of truth, direct truth.

L.P.: The last film, done in 1967 in black and white

because you had not enough money for color-film, is your most daring, shocking, sensational one, isn't it?

K.K.: Yes, it is, and it was my own idea. Gunter Brus did the action, played in it, directed it. It's called 20th September.

L.P.: Why?

K.K.: It's my birthday.

L.P.: You are born under the sign of Virgin.

K.K.: Yes.

L.P.: Why did you select this theme of man drinking and eating and excreting: in popular language pissing and shitting?

K.K.: Because I think this is what everybody, everyman, female, child, animal does all the times. It is the most natural function of man and animal. If we don't excrete our food we get sick. But these natural functions are taboo in our social life. So we, Brus and I, wanted to do this True Film, True to life Film. 20th September.

L.P.: It's a tough thing to do such a film, and it's a tough thing to look at. It will get a lot of controversial comment, if it is shown here, don't you think?

K.K.: Yes, I suppose so . . .

L.P.: What's the philosophy behind this idea?

K.K.: I wanted to make conscious to people things which are always kept secret, all the time, . . . functions which are socially taboo.

L.P.: If those ideas and actions come into the open, do you think this will help us to become better human beings?

Jon Hendricks: When Kren uses blood, flower, etc., there is a great directness in his artistic form, in the processes, he does not cover up, he is real . . .

L.P.: Where did you show this film before in Europe?

K.K.: In Hamburg and in Cologne, Germany.

L.P.: What was the reaction of the public and the press?

K.K.: It got a good review in the "Welt" in Hamburg, they described the film, as it was . . .

L.P.: That's very extraordinary, because the "Welt" is a "Springer" paper.

K.K.: Yes, but they were quite open-minded about it. It was shown in Hamburg in a big movie theater, and there were no police.

Hendricks: I would be very ironic if one couldn't show Kren's films in New York, when one can see men killed on the screen every day, men dying . . .

L.P.: Jon, would you consider the 20th September P &

Eugene's is a possessive proper noun and it is followed by a "!" a "?" a "." or a blank—just take a ride and go look at the flag. It is also ridiculous, up there on East 54th Street. Saturday night, it was Sold Out! As the A-lined blonde brightly explained. Equally firm, I assured her I wouldn't step foot inside Eugene's unless I had to—and I had to. She pursed her lips and looked at me from the left-hand entrance desk. The equality-ridden, negro fat kid who sat next to her sort of stared past us in that little entrance-way, over at the hat-check girl on the other side. I thought maybe his Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Button was winking at the hat-check girl's Eugene McCarthy for President button, but he was just twitching his shoulders. Everybody had those buttons on, plus a little name-plate. When you ask the Clean-for-Gene boys, what time is it? They snap out their right arms, make a clean twist of the wrist and report the exact time. Everyone is that clean. Anyway, the American Magic Mime Troupe manager finally appeared looking like a white Sammy Davis, Jr., beads and all, and we were ushered to the Ladies Room, where six of his "people" were waiting to go on. "Now, people, be nice to the Press," he said and left. The Ladies Room was sort of crowded; six of them; two of us Press, and the Ladies Room attendant, who was there first. "Just think of us as—roses," one of the male mime-people explained. "American Beauty?" I asked, and he thought for a second. "Mmm, nooo . . . I think something a little darker." I asked about their political leanings. One of the girls laughed. "We'd appear at a Nazi Demonstration if they asked us," but then added, "But we have standards" when everybody looked at her . . . A man burst into the room: "OK, you fellas, waddya think you're doin' in the Girl's Room? You don't belong in here, you oughta be inna Men's Room." They explained that would leave Eugene's patrons without a bathroom, so he took a meaningful look around and left, pacified. We left without buying even one McCarthy sticker . . . From 24 Roses I went to the Mothers of Invention, a different breed of Flower People—who made a farewell appearance at Fillmore East, before splitting for L.A. Zappa even said thank you, boys and girls. Wow. . . .

Sunday night La Mama presented Leonard Melfi's "Having Fun in the Bathroom." Seven men enter and sit on cubes-cum-toilet bowls. This is La Mama: the men drop their pants and stand in their matching blue boxer shorts. Not bad for self-control; only 2 out of 7 have hard-ons. Five of the men are together downstage. Two sit on marble cubes upstage and are Pop Singers, one rock, one psychedelic, they sing a song called "Having Fun, etc." Five females enter, who play Switchies-Match Game with the 5 men: mean, even shitty exposes of everybody's dirty, little secrets. Several morals are metaphorized in the two-hour-long

long play. Life is a bowl of turds: It is not always so simple to either make it or get off the pot! Constipation may be psychosomatically so powerful that you think you are going out of your mind: The best things in life are those full releases: And make up your own.

For those who enjoy bathroom games for two or more, and who have not seen "The Beard" and who have suffered from either constipation or diarrhea, the play will be on Off-Broadway this fall. For those who no longer go to theatre, the play will be a flick next year under the direction of Michelangelo Antonioni who is busy invading the Underground and getting—finally—good scripts for his movies so maybe they will be more than beautifully filmed shit-pieces, pardon the pun, like "Blow-Up."

La Mama is closing for 2-3 months after next week's production and will re-open at 74 East 4th, in a big loft with offices and everything. The last play will be "And Then There Will Be Light," by Raphael Bunuel (the son). Rochelle Owens will have two one-acts as the first offering at the new address. And the foundation grant daddies were happy, and gave \$\$\$, and so La Mama grew into a big mother.

. . . Another Son of the Underground, Sam Shepard, is now back from Rome and out in California. Antonioni is also . . . working with? Using? Being used by? . . . Sam on yet another film, this one in-process, location San Francisco. Sam-in-the-East has a new play "Red Cross," at Provincetown Playhouse. The opening was to be this past Monday, but something happened. On the same bill is a play by John Guare called "Muzeeka," which is about the complexities of modern life—not to be too different these days. Shepard's plays are hard enough to explain after they are visible, and interpretations are ridiculous anyway, so just go see this one if you still go to see plays at all.

A different kind of theatre is Ed Bullins' "The Electronic Nigger and Others," which has been title-changed to just Ed Bullin's plays—but is still at the Martinique, 32nd and Broadway. It seems the good white liberals were afraid to go see the plays under the original title, thinking that a big bull nigger was going to use an electrified cattle prod on the audience or something. Bullins is more subtle than that, at least. The plays are good enough to be worth more than the pass-over they got in the column last week. The first, "A Son, Come Home" is a moody vignette about the Generation Gap, clothed in contemporary black South Philly idiom: bittersweet and softly tragic, the son delivers a eulogy from Webster's Unabridged, the definition of "anachronism." "The Electronic Nigger" is a computerized Uncle Tom who has picked up all those habits which people call either smart-ass or uppity nigger—depending on their background. Anyway, being black and human pays, because it is the young black creative

writing teacher who gets the beautiful black ass; the Electronic Nigger gets a sex-starved white school-teacher and some other peripheral intellectuals. "Clara's Old Man" is great. There is a huge, black jelly-rolling bull dyke named Big Girl and the whole stage sort of emanates from her left hip. For the sensation seekers, there is also a spastic girl (named Little Girl) and a burgeoning boy-girl relationship, split into a triangle by Big Girl, since the girl Clara belongs to Big Girl.

Black Theatre at its best stars real people in real streets shooting and ducking those real bullets. These plays are one reality removed from that, but they confront the same emotions . . . Bullins is currently out in California, land of Eldridge Cleaver and other Black Panthers. He will be back in time for a benefit for Eldridge Cleaver and the other five jailed men. Sorry, I don't know their names, but then no one else seems to, either. The benefit will be at the Fillmore East, May 20th, and money is gonna be raised to pay the lawyers so the bail money can be lowered.

"The Concept" is like "The Hawk" or like "The Connection." It is different from the other plays: the cast are all members of Daytop Village which is a group of addicts working towards being ex-addicts. They are presenting the play which was done at La Mama last year and got very good notices. This time, there will be a full run at Sheridan Square Playhouse, 7th Ave. and West 4th St., previews on April 25 . . .

If you prefer, Theatre for Ideas is having a benefit May 3rd, speakers will include Norman Mailer, Herbert Marcuse and Schlesinger, Jr., and they will discuss the future of democracy. (*) For those who think this is not really theatre but politics, just think about today's politicians. Just think, too, about the psycho-drama events of the past few weeks, topped, of course, by the King assassination, and find something going on inside anywhere which is better produced, directed, or acted.

(*) Theatre for Ideas says it is difficult to sustain the "decent poverty" which gives the group its character, so it is charging a minimum of \$10.00 per ticket. Send check or money order to 112 W. 21st St., N.Y., N.Y. 10011. It might be better to put the ten bucks towards the paperback editions of any of the speakers.

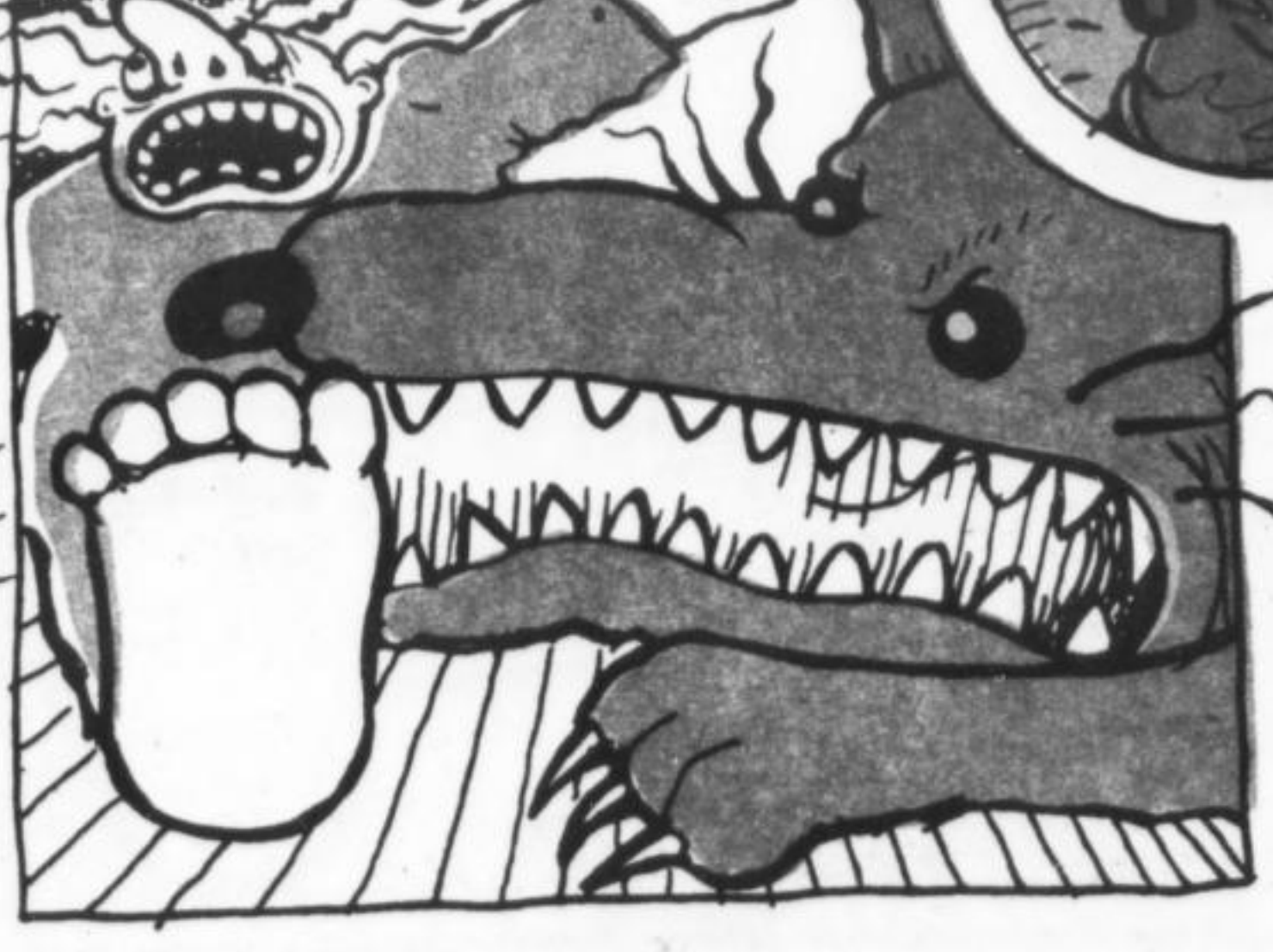
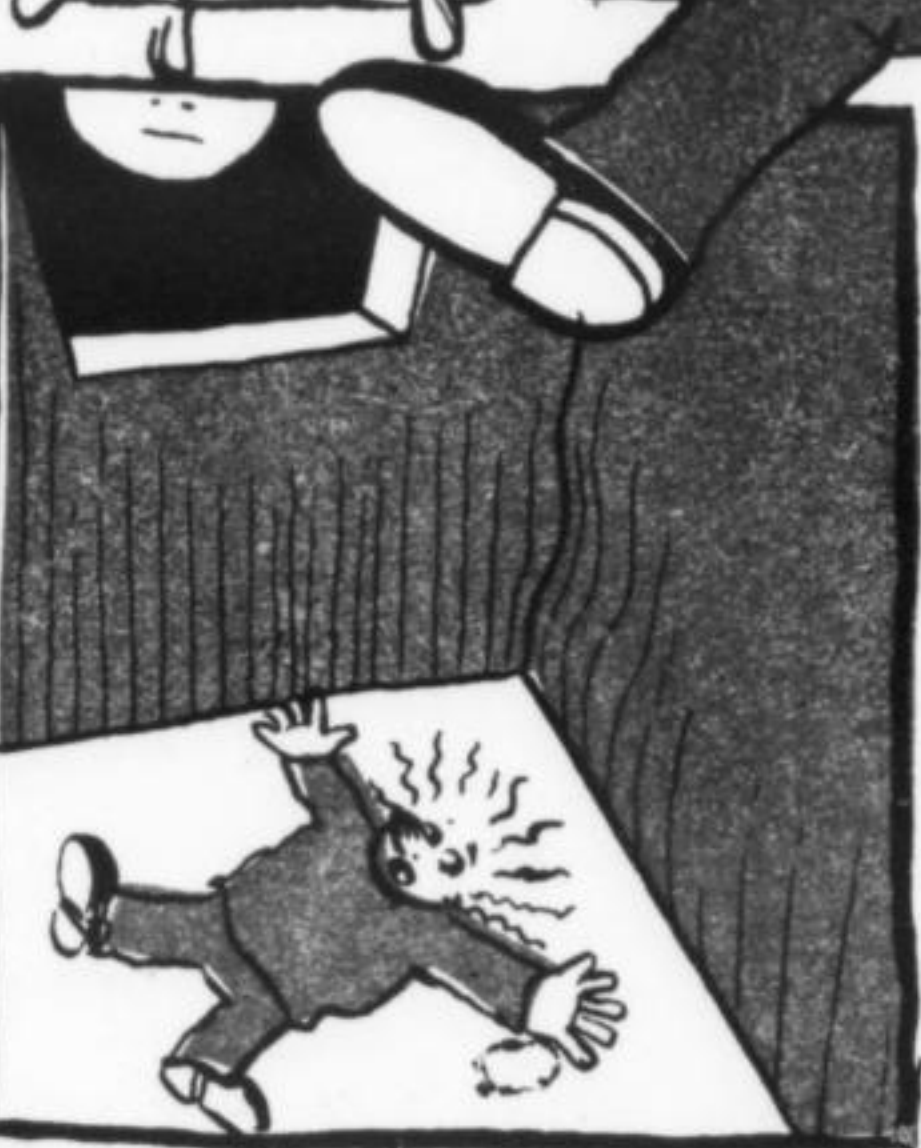
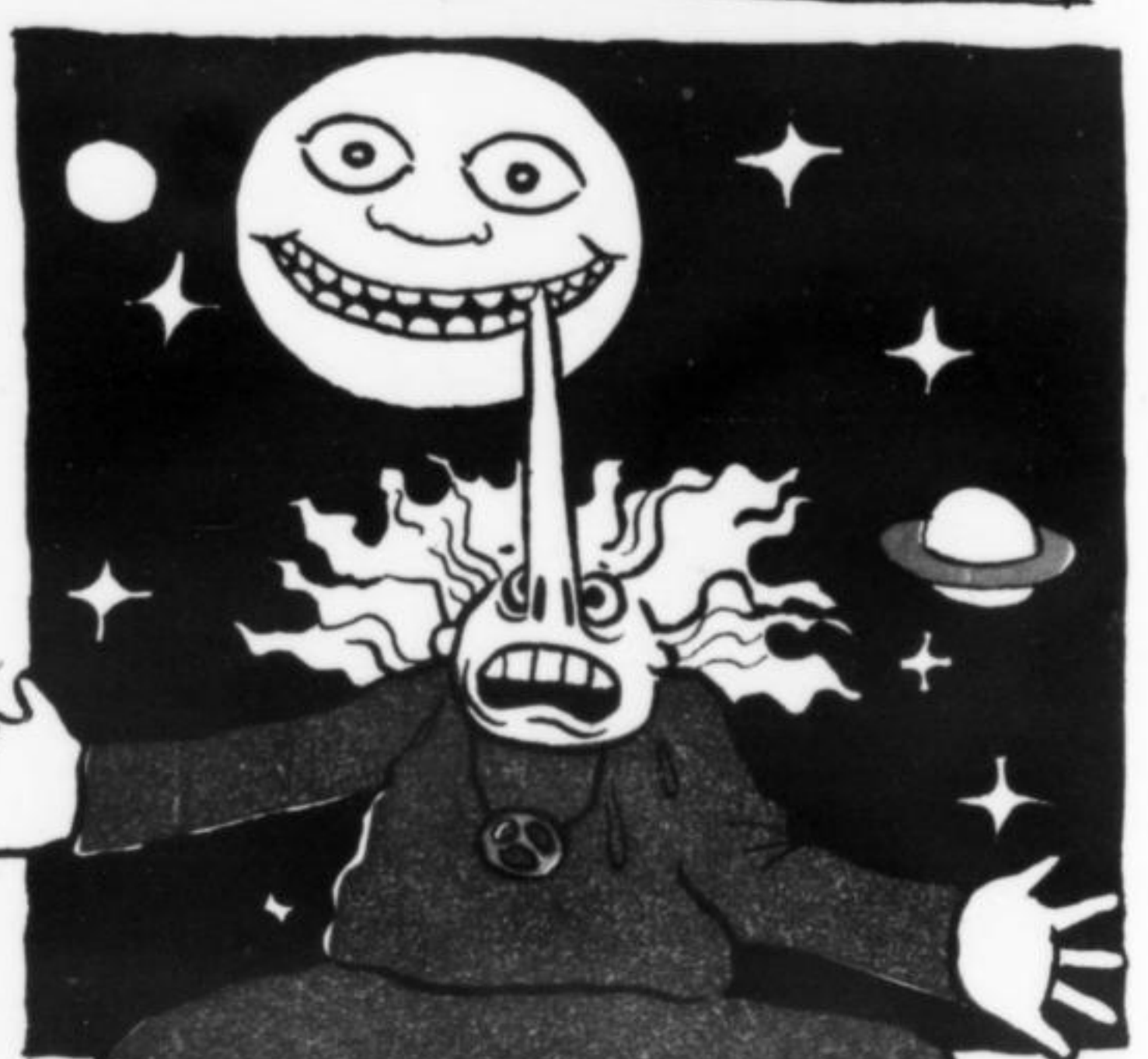
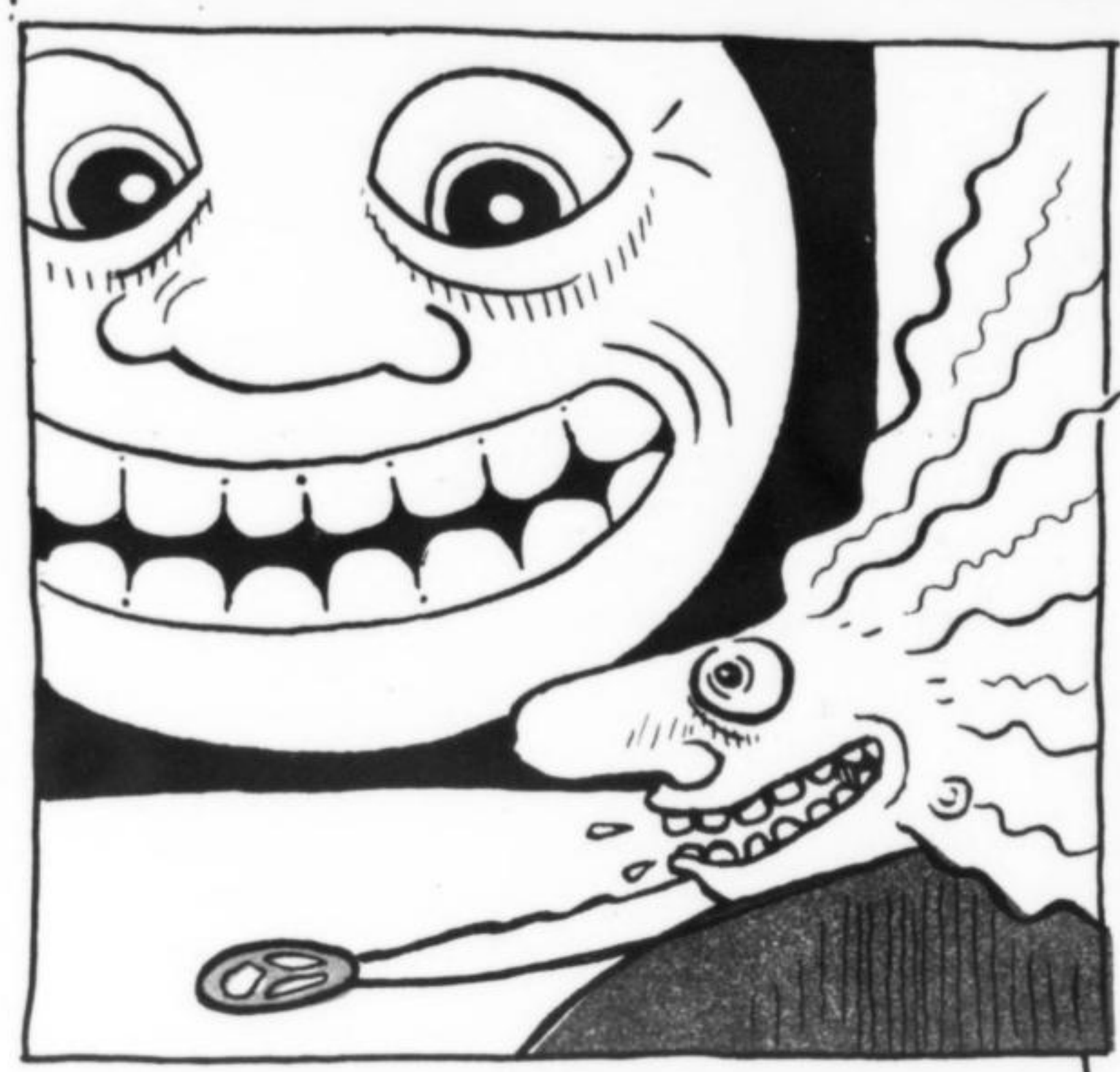

DR. STRANGE



If any building in New York City were to be sanctified as the Pop Cathedral it would be the Capitol Theatre on Broadway, home of Cinerama.

For years now their 70mm projectors have been painting the screen with the biggest and most mediocre images ever to fill man's retina. Sunsets and roller coasters. Only its dimension has saved it from obscurity. Quantity is one thing—but quality is another.

From a fine art point of view it was a freak. A B grade picture with elephantitis is still a B grade picture. It seemed a more improbable birthplace for a prophet than the manger in Bethlehem. But—only in America. And so . . .

2001 HERALDS NEW ERA IN MOTION PICTURES

Over the years now, Stanley Kubrick has made a number of good pictures and a few exceptional ones, the last being "Dr. Strangelove" nearly 5 years ago. He has always been a good director, but it is only in retrospect that one can see the seeds of the monument that his new film "2001" actually is.

ADVENTURES IN A MOLECULAR UNIVERSE

The film has a comic strip quality to it. One travels through it panel by panel. It's the poor man's guide to the molecular universe. A film designed for everyman to encourage him to think and meditate on a probable origin and a possible destiny. It is the most amazing of all gigantic productions (\$10,000,000 worth, I believe) in that it does not talk down—is not condescending.

The problem with most science fiction films is that they try to make the irrational rational—cut to lab . . . c.u. of scientist explaining his theory . . . pause for 15 minutes while audience takes 40 winks.

ACCENTUATE THE VISUAL

But Kubrick knows better. Knows that if you can't make an abstract theory visual, then you don't fuck with it—at all. Hence, all things are made plain but never simplified. I don't think that there is one superfluous frame . . . one superfluous image . . . one superfluous movement . . . one superfluous line of dialogue. Indeed, one of its main joys is the severe limitations that he has placed on the use of dialogue.

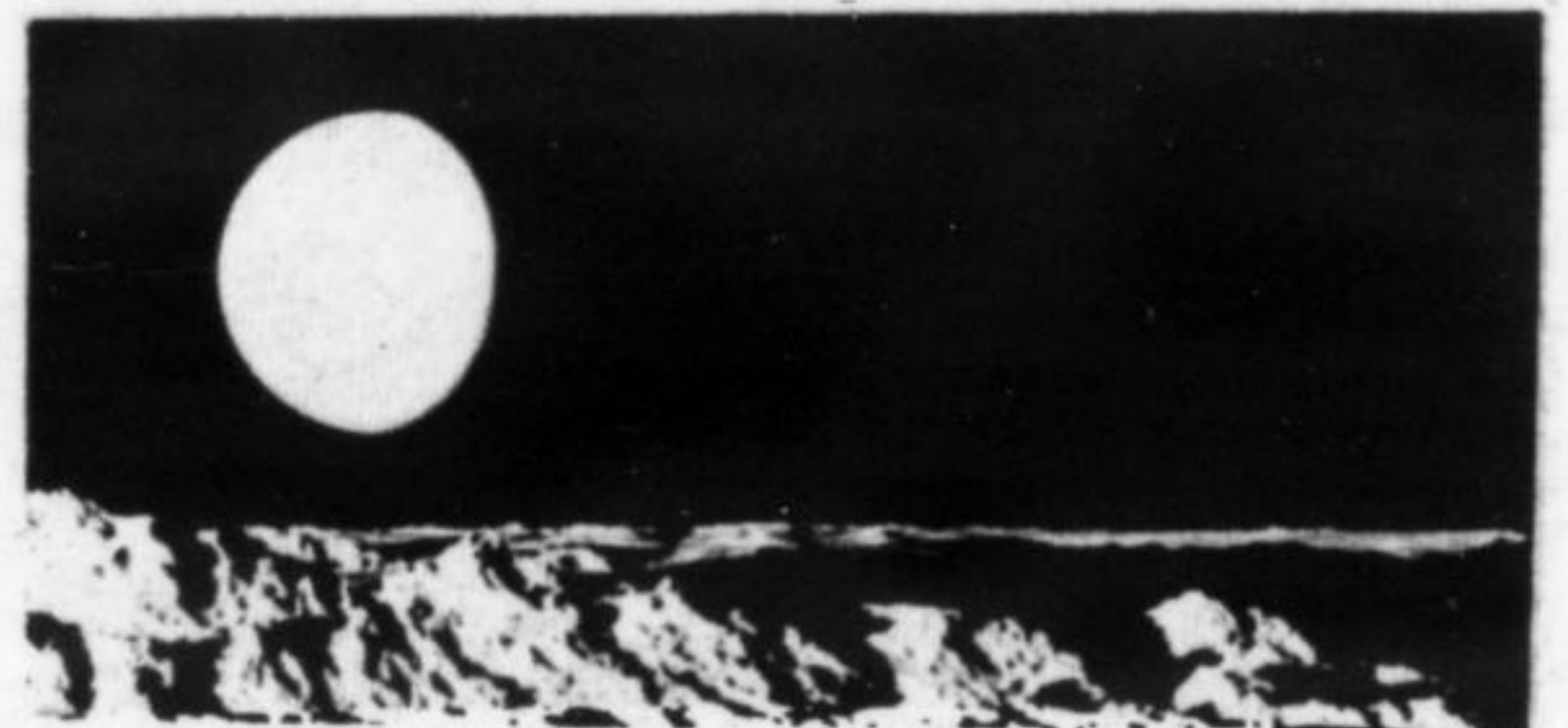
SPACE TIME IS NO LONGER A BARRIER

For me, "2001" is one of the greatest films ever made. It's a primer for all students of film technique and is as dynamic as anything Eisenstein has ever made. It makes public many of the techniques and vocabulary of the avant garde—which is the vocabulary of now—and it uses them with ease and clarity and without any self-conscious arty-craftiness.

TAKE A TRIP WITH KUBRICK - THE NEW WONDER HALLUCINOGENIC

In the beginning there were the apes and it might have stayed that way were it not for an X factor. Scientists hate X factors—there's no accounting for them—but for an artist like Kubrick it's the trigger that sends him Jupiter and beyond that into the space-time continuum. Jupiter and beyond that into the space-time continuum. Here, all known frames of reference disintegrate making the empires of men and Howard Johnson the minuscule fly-by-night things they really are.

In the beginning there are the apes and in the end is that which we have been seeking since Herman Hesse crept into our craniums—The Magic Theatre. Now playing at the Pop Cathedral.



hour of the wolf

Once upon a time there was an artist who was in a bad period. Having gotten away from his thing he felt very hung up because his muse had deserted him and also because an old childhood guilt was re-asserting itself.

He began to feel hedged in. On one side, his wife, a sweet simple girl, was trying to blend her soul with his. On the other side were the sophisticated folk, who, having a vested interest in his old style of work, wanted him to continue to produce the old thing. Their motives were purely selfish and they didn't give a damn how the artist felt about it. The artist, with considerable justification, felt that his soul was not his own.

The result of a situation such as this, is inevitable. That's my interpretation of "The Hour Of The Wolf"—at the 34th Street East—and I'm sticking to it.

Both the people and the setting are dark and gothic and Bergman's magic touch takes this tale out of its cliched setting and turns it into another masterpiece.

But like almost all his movies, it will only affect you profoundly if you have been there yourself.

Someone suggested to me that it should be subtitled—"The Parable of Jackson Pollock." I don't know, but it's a good thought.

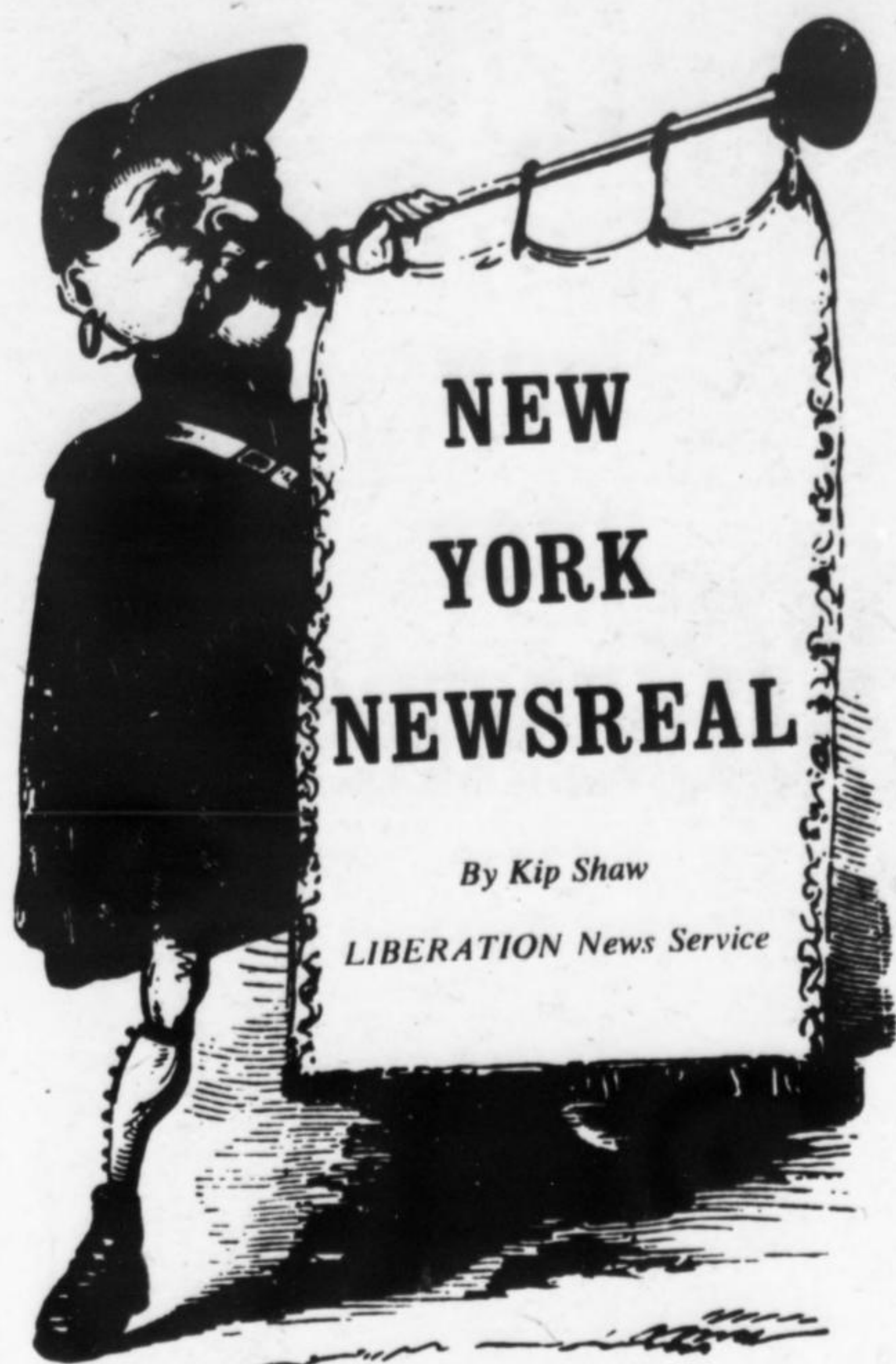

NEW YORK NEWSREAL

The first thing you do is get mad. Mad at the evening news for distorting the real story. "I was at the Pentagon. I saw the tear gas. They can't say it wasn't used."

But they do say it. And you get mad.

"Network news is entertainment. It's wholesome — for the whole family. It's supposed to soothe. It is designed to maintain the status quo." The speaker is Allan Siegel, a founder of Newsreel. All the founders of Newsreel were furious about TV coverage of the movement — especially at the Oct. 21 Pentagon demonstration. Siegel: "TV camera crews did film what went on at the Pentagon midnight Saturday night, but it just wasn't shown on TV."

At the end of January, about 40 people got together and formed Newsreel — an alternative to the medium of TV. They've made ten films so far — about two hours of footage altogether — and they showed it all for an audience of several hundred at the New Yorker Theater in New York City recently, in a special midnight session.

"We're not trying to compete with the mass media, but instead trying to reinforce it," Siegel said before the showing. That attitude was reflected in the style of the films. There was no attempt to copy TV's phoney objectivism. Instead of emphasizing facts and figures, the Newsreel films attempt to get across the mood of an event. And they succeed. Stylistic devices employed include a hand held camera, moving through a crowd to give a personal viewpoint; film montage with interviews on sound — sometimes with a person talking on film with a different voice on sound.

Perhaps Newsreel's most powerful film was the one on the Pentagon demonstration. (Other topics include the garbage demonstration of New York's group called Up Against the Wall, Motherfucker, and a study of the Boston Draft Resistance Group.) In the Pentagon film, they successfully show military brutality, as well as the beautiful sense of community which was generated there by the participants. Also captured on film is the confusion and fright of the uptight MP's.

"We're existing in another culture. The people running the mass media aren't participating in our culture and can only present an external viewpoint," said Siegel.

This other culture portrayed by Newsreel seems at first to be largely anti-war, anti-draft, anti-establishment, anti-racist, etc. But at the same time, there is a strong "pro" feeling in the films. Phrases such as "a sense of community" and "how we want to live our lives" pervade the films. Something new and positive is coming out of the "anti" movements of today. No one really knows what it will be yet, but from viewing the anti groups of Newsreel films, one has an immediate sense of this new concept of community, a community of affirmation.

Distribution of Newsreel films is as unorthodox as the style of the films themselves. They sent out 15 free copies of the films to people in 15 cities, who in turn distribute them to various groups.

Do the films merely get shown to people in the movement, or is an attempt made to reach people not yet involved. Siegel: "We reach the middle class through such groups as the Quakers and other



church groups. And the YMCA has put our films on their master movie list send out to all their chapters."

Financing of Newsreel is a problem. They're in the hole, but you somehow get the feeling that they'll get out of it. The audiences will get them out. People seem to be so sick and tired of seeing regurgitated candy cotton on TV that they don't seem to mind handing out \$2 at the door and putting a couple more in the hat during intermission.

A new community needs new media, and Newsreel is part of it. If the movement remains, Newsreel will remain — and be an integral part of it. (For information about Newsreel, write to them at 28 West 31 Street, New York, N. Y. 10001.)

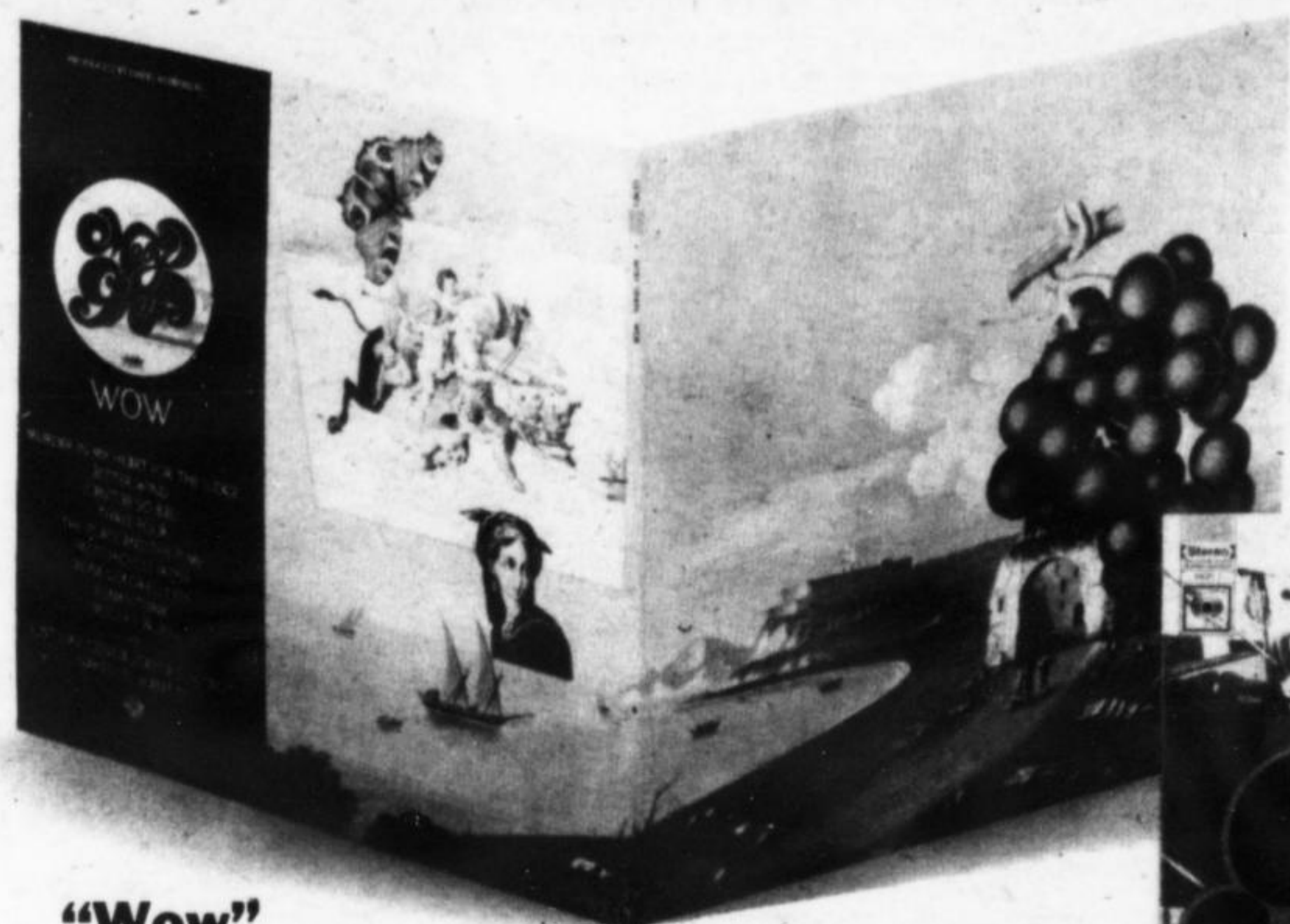

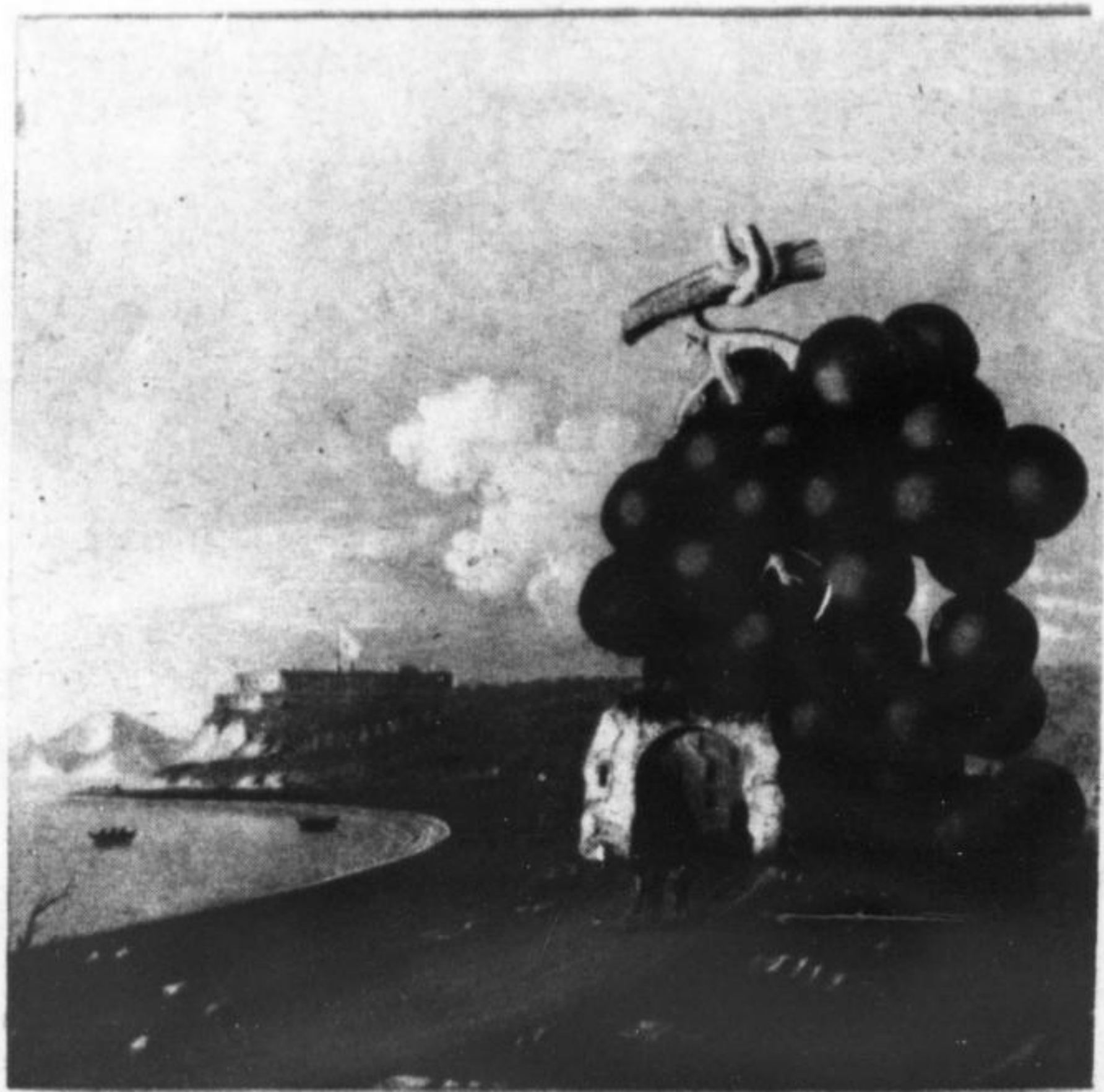

SPOCKROCK

At one time he was a mere doctor he said & spent most of his time tending babies who grew into students and eventually, by their social commitment & militant forthrightness, helped him to care about the future of this country and the world and therefore cuss like he does now from rally to rally across the nation in dignified restraint.

And last Saturday he came to the Lower East Side, Benjamin Spock who put diapers into Genesis. And the East Side, dragging its comfortable neuroses along, came out to see him.

"It's very friendly down here," he said to a young lady.

"Yes."

"And what do you call yourself — a hippie?"

"Sometimes."

"Well, I've been called that too."

And asked what keeps him so trim & erectfaced he said, "Laughter. I can still laugh. And young people are doing so much today. Working so hard. In my day kids weren't so moral and daring; but then the issues weren't so deadly."

Dr. Spock was the featured speaker in the Tompkins Square Park rally for peace & freedom sponsored by Lower East Side Peace Parade Committee which drew several hundred people to the park where they, these people, paid some more audio-visual dues to peace.

Dr. Spock confessed his indebtedness to young people who had helped him to make up his mind about taking an active role against the war in Vietnam, or the "last imperialist stand," according to your politics. Said jokingly his wife preferred he be sent to the jail in Danbury Connecticut, nearer home than Leavenworth.

("Stuffed with so many sex & political perverts,") said a former guest.

No place for a baby doctor, said Paul Krassner. "Scum bag," shouted a heckler, tremblingly old, superpatriot.

"BOOOOOOOO."

"Bunch of draft dodgers," a companion said and heckled all afternoon to the sound of drums.

Re Johnson, Dr. Spock said Americans have been fooled too many times and now find it difficult to believe a President who is trying to gain at the negotiating table what he can't in the jungle & cities of Vietnam with bombs, elephants & speed. McCarthy & Kennedy, hot on coalition government (to include Vice-President Ky, Asia's No.1 Pro-American Opium Smuggler), veer only slightly from Johnson's hard position of astute craftiness and crass parental confusion.

But, said Dr. Spock to wild applause, "we have to be talking about letting the Vietnamese choose their own government."

"Hey, Spock," said the heckler, "you go to Vietnam, you bumpkin you."

It must be understood that private enterprise will always go where its capital can produce the most revenue. The income to be made in slum areas because of tax considerations does not preclude the income from being taken out of these areas and invested into other locations where the investment climate is more suitable. The tax incentive plan only guarantees a profit to the corporations involved and does not necessarily guarantee the development of the area and the personal income of its residents. In all other times of disaster, the United States has met the situation with the outpouring of funds directly to the people involved, but we somehow do not consider areas of poverty in the same circumstances. Our tax structure is such that we are unwilling to allow the advancement of funds to a people who have not paid for their fair share through taxation in the past or bank on the possibility of a future return of such funds. We are only willing to lend these funds when a plan of compromise is brought forth giving the richer portion of society a tax advantage.

The day after April 15th most of the middle-class breathes a sigh of relief, but religious foundations remain exempt from this anxiety of taxation. The rich, who spout the advantages of free enterprise, are being supported by legal tax evasion, while the poor are laid to rest in the files labeled "unprofitable investments." It is not considered enough to be born or be naturalized into American citizenship. One must buy his fair share of representation in a democratic society such as ours or, at least, be willing to accept the worst.

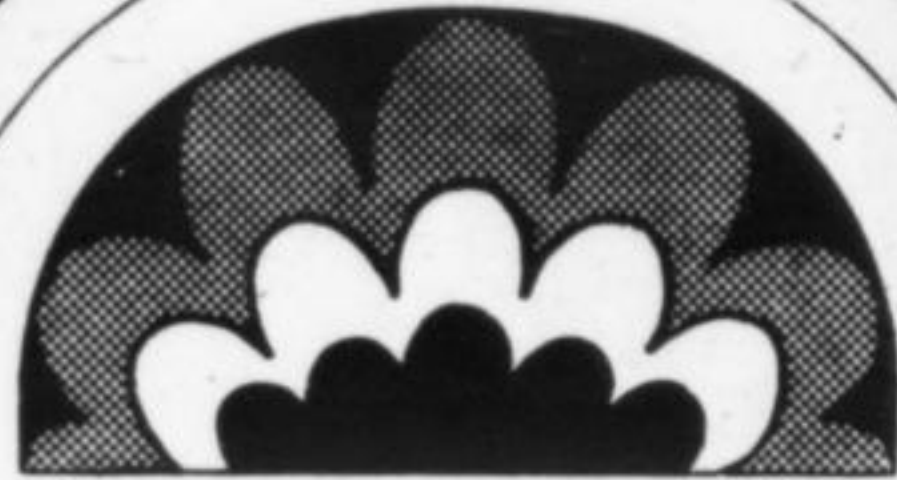

OCRATES

BY EUGENE SCHOENFELD, M.D.

QUESTION: I recently, at the advice of my friends, drank a bottle of Romilar C. F. cough syrup. This was supposed to get me stoned. It did just that. After about 20 minutes my arms and legs got limp. I could hardly think and slurred when I talked. I laid down and found myself hallucinating.

About an hour later, I got real sick and threw up, after which I couldn't walk. My pupils almost covered my whole iris. I went to bed that night and found myself hallucinating in double vision with my eyes open. The next day I had chattering teeth and every time I took a deep breath I would end up yawning which would make my whole body go limp.

I feel fine now (3 days later). What possible damage did I do to myself? Is what I did illegal?

ANSWER: I first heard about dextromethorphen cough syrups and tablets used for "highs" from a British ex-commando in Copenhagen in 1965. Apparently, it had not appreciably benefitted the ex-commando. He often went about bopping peaceful Danes on the chin in pubs such as Laurits Betjen and the Pilegaarten.

Recently, I treated a girl who had taken half a bottle of such cough syrup at a rock dance. As a result, she was semi-comatose, incontinent of urine and required hospitalization. Her boyfriend, who had taken the same amount, seemed normal, except for dilated pupils.

Nothing is known about possible long term harmful effects after frequently using large amounts of dextromethorphan.

Buying cough syrup is not illegal. Using it to get high may be against the law though that's hard to prove. You're missing the point if your chief fear about this incident is violating a statute.

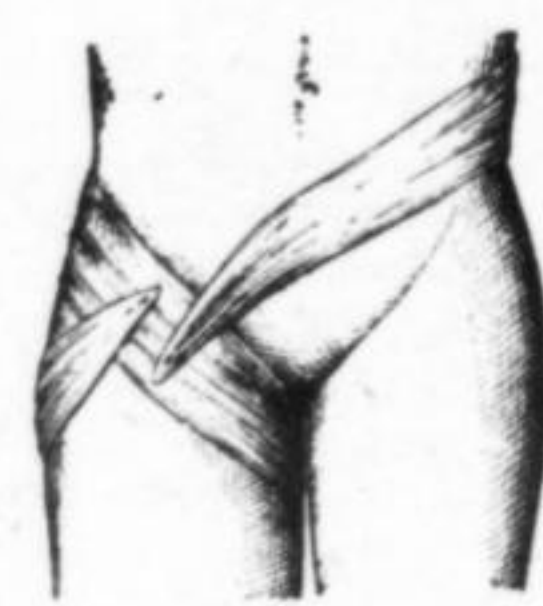


FIG. 212. Plaque d'une aine.

QUESTION: This may sound ridiculous but I swear it's the truth: on four different occasions I have been to parties where a goodly amount of grass was smoked and everyone else gets turned on but me. It's obviously not the quality of the grass since everyone else got high — and it couldn't be a put-on because they were different groups of people.

Have you heard of this happening before? What can I do about it? I've been instructed by experts, so that's not the problem either. My only clue — I take 10 mgms of Librium 3 times per day under doctor's orders (for neurodermatitis). Could that turn me off?

ANSWER: There are two possible answers to your "problem." One is the great variation of responses to drugs. The spectrum of human experience is such that some people will have no reaction to a drug such as marijuana when almost everyone else having the same quantity will be under (or over) the table. Your friends have no doubt told you, in addition, that the effects of marijuana must be anticipated and learned.

But the most likely cause for your not feeling the effects of marijuana is the daily use of a tranquilizer. Bad psychological reactions to marijuana are rare, but when they do occur they are often treated with Librium or other tranquilizers in order to bring the tripper down.

QUESTION: Both a friend and I discovered a physical side effect of marijuana. We found that, when stoned, we are unable to crack our knuckles, which is a regular habit of ours. Would you explain this phenomenon?

P. S. We just spoke to another friend who had no difficulty in cracking his knuckles. We are now more confused than ever.

ANSWER: Maybe you cats are so loose even your knuckles won't crack!

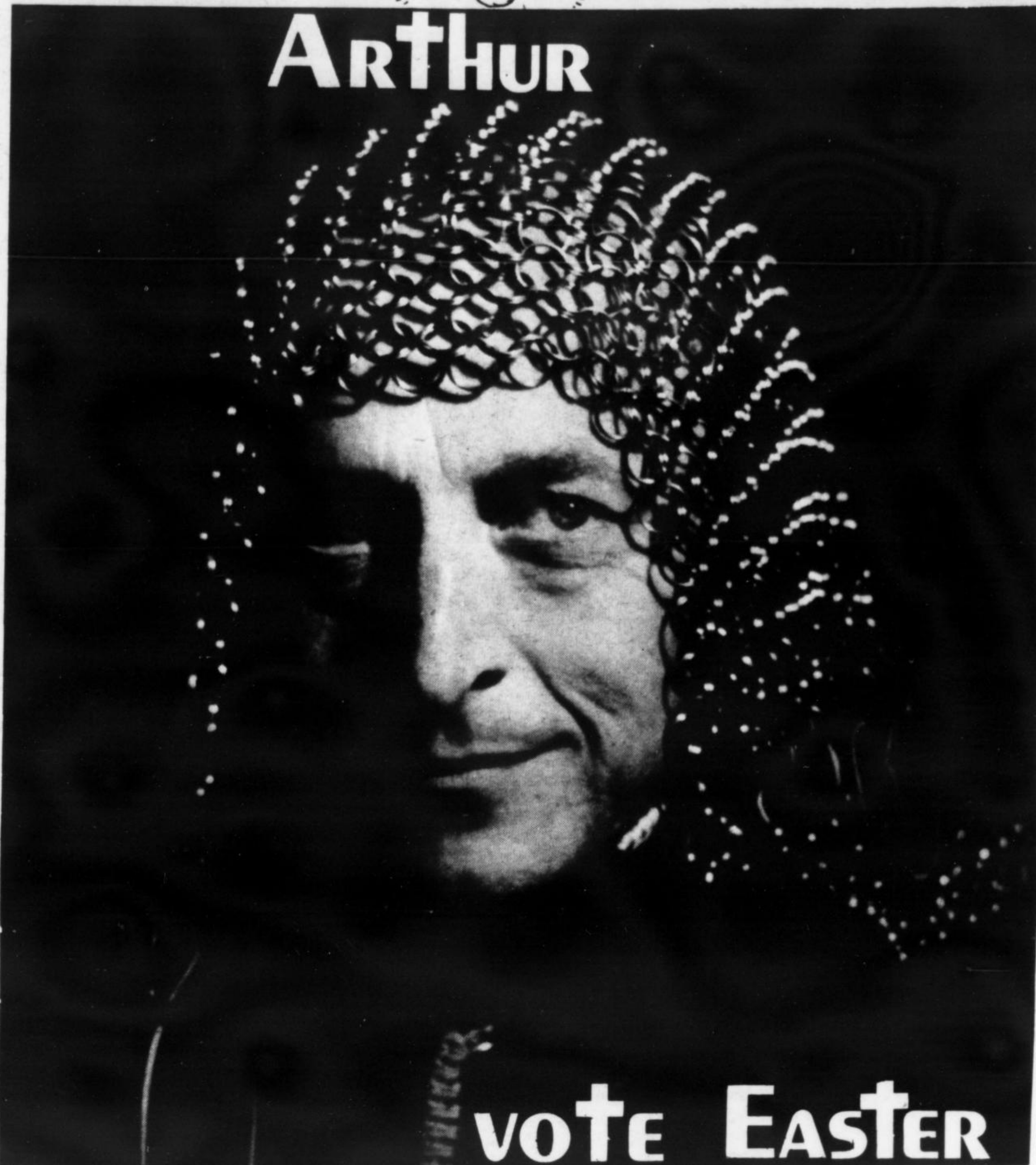

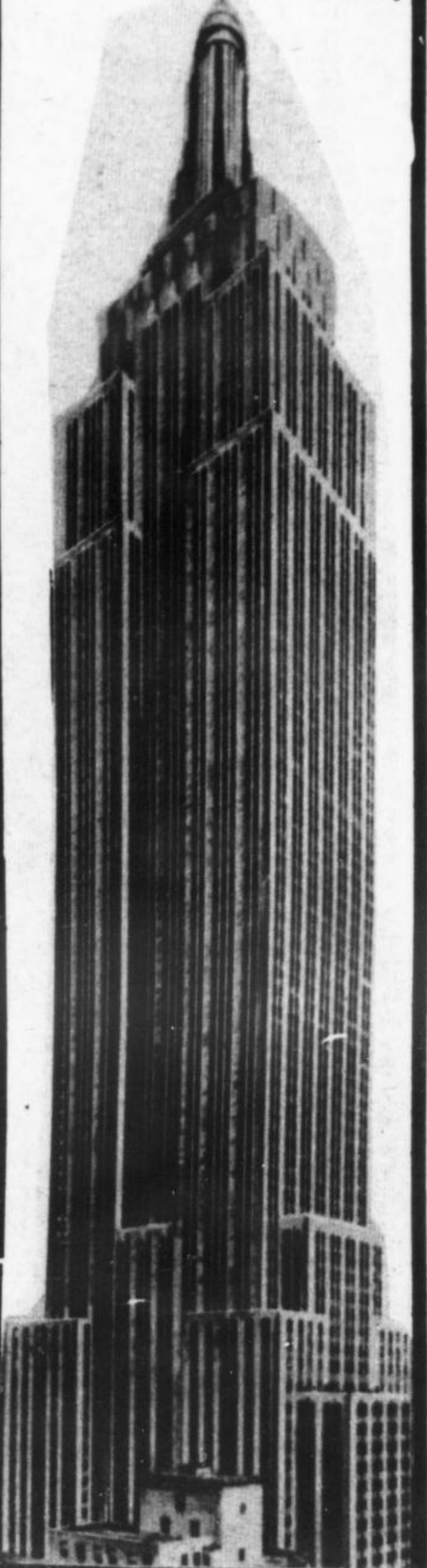

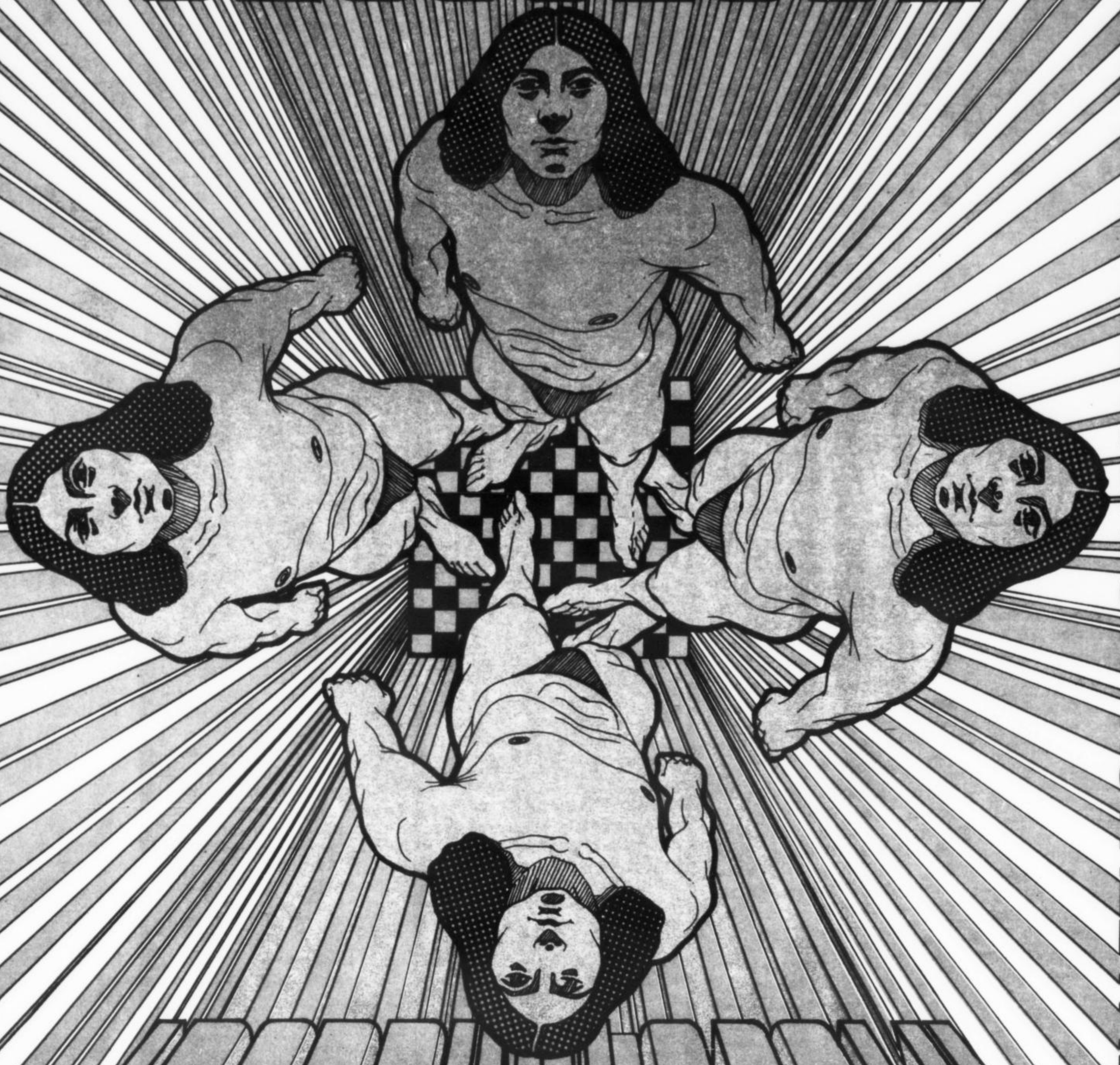
