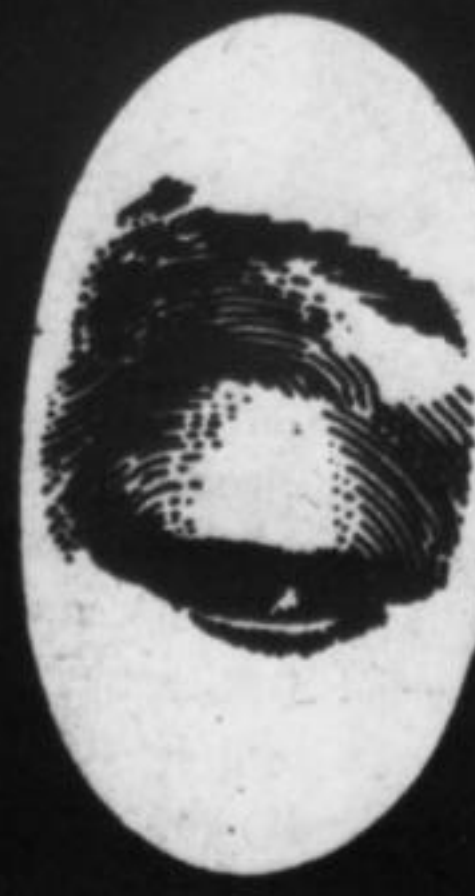

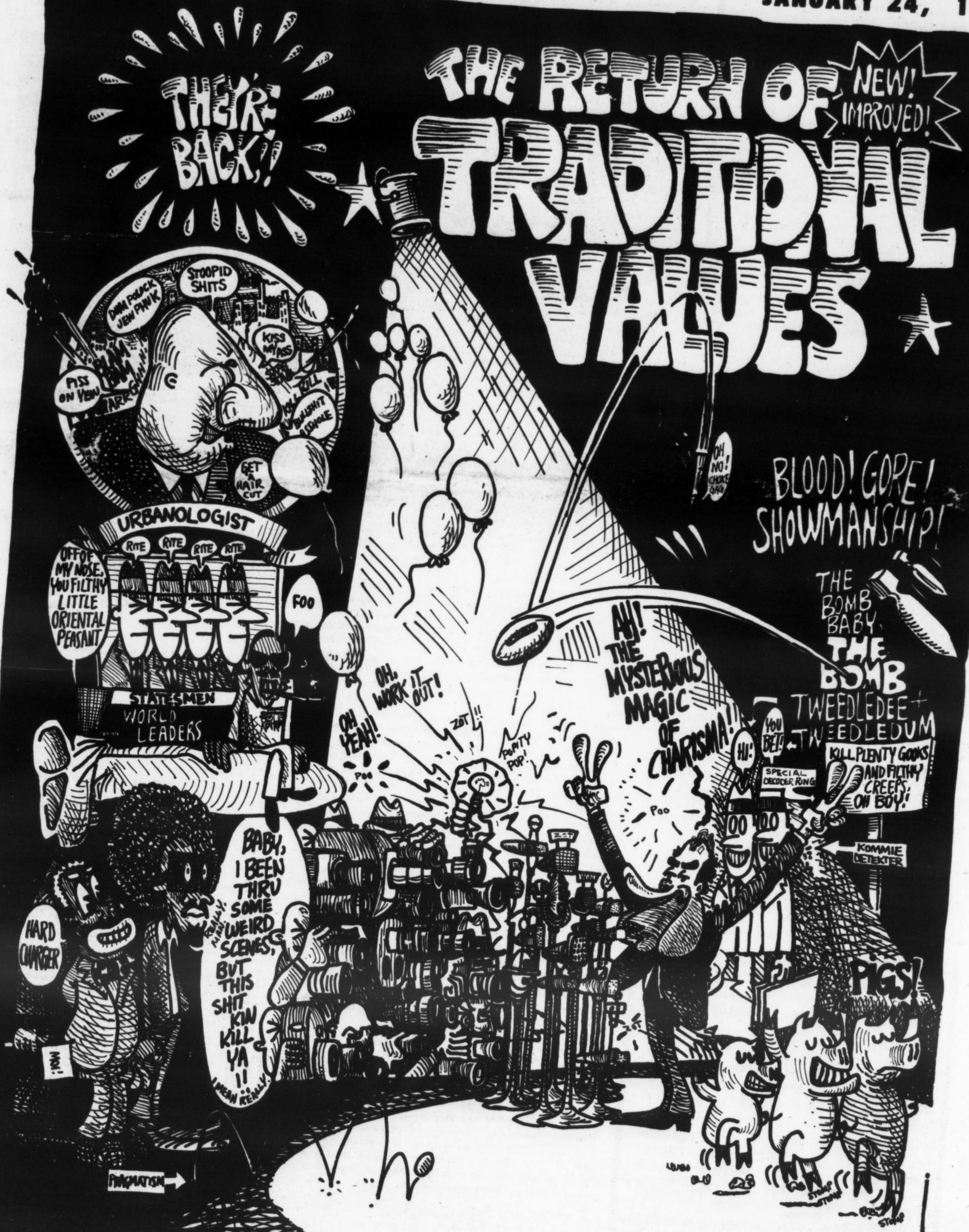

Dear EVO,

As a former professor of Chinese Civilization and a person with many friends in China and Tibet, I must say that I found the Tibet of your recent article hardly recognizable. I, at least, have visited Tibet.

"The Red and Yellow Hats" lived off the work of the bulk of the Tibetan people. Much of this has thankfully ceased. Nevertheless there are more than 3,000 monks practicing in Tibet today.

Chinese is not the language of instruction in Tibet today although it is offered as a secondary tongue. Exceptions are five small Chinese community schools. Journals exist in Tibetan, and there is an Academy, a University, theatre and radio—all in Tibetan. Most of these are new and do not reflect an effort to assimilate the Tibetans.

A little known fact is that Nationalist China also claims Tibet. It is shown on all Nationalist Chinese maps as part of China.

It is of value to print partisan statements, but it is also important to be fair. All lamas were not saintly scholars—many were filthy, lazy, parasites.

Tibet today enjoys autonomy, the highest standard of living in its history and a deep respect for its cultural heritage.

Dear EVO,

While in the city over Xmas vac. I picked up a copy of your paper and would appreciate the opportunity to make a few comments on one of your editorials.

You propose for government the use of "functional organization", whereby "the process which works best is adopted, and the process which is shown through performance to be less efficient is discarded." This idea has been dealt with over the years in the literature of political science. Though not an expert in that field, I understand that the idea of allocating governmental resources according to notions of economy and efficiency rather than "political" considerations arose earlier this century in an effort to have "experts" take over control of the decision-making functions of city government from the machine politicians.

Insofar as you merely advocate use of the most efficient means available for a job which is going to be done in any case, I wholeheartedly agree with you. "Political" considerations are, however, the result of whatever pressure an official's constituency can bring to bear on him, and insofar as such pressure can be democratically exerted I really don't think you would disapprove. I think the solution to the problem you have in mind with your denigration of "politics" would be improvement, perhaps through organization, of representation so that all groups with an interest in a government decision could have a voice in that decision proportionate to their interest therein. (I am accepting for the sake of argument the legitimacy of government.)

The difficulty in assuming that criteria of efficiency are adequate in making what are now political decisions is implicit in your statement of the aims of such a system: "Instead of the location, design, and materials of a housing complex or dam being determined by political factors, they would be construed and located so as to be of maximum effectiveness in meeting the needs for which they were intended." I am afraid that in advocating that such decisions be made scientifically or economically and, therefore, by "experts" in some sense rather than by politicians, you are implicitly ignoring values which I am sure you hold. Your statement of purpose begs or ignore the central question involved in a political decision, prior to a choice of means: namely what end is to be fulfilled, i.e. the choice of which and whose needs are intended to be met by a given project.

Does Chicago build an extension of its present hospital or construct a new building on the South Side for more convenient service to ghetto residents? The extension plan could be more cheaply implemented—according to ordinary criteria of economy and efficiency. So whose needs are first to be considered—those of the taxpayer or the South Side differently, depending on whether the ordinary definition of efficiency is used, or one which takes human considerations into account. Suppose more families will be displaced by the cheaper housing complex or highway plan than by a more expensive or less efficient one; what to do?

From a human viewpoint the answer is obvious: at the time my hypothetical question was raised in Chicago, it took ghetto residents an unconscionable amount of time merely to get to the hospital, let alone obtain service. But to assume that decision will automatically be made so as to take humane criteria into account ignores the facts of limited resources, competition therefore, and our resulting present situation. It is the function of politics, imperfectly as it now operates, to make such judgments of value; criteria of economy of efficiency in mere dollar terms might often dictate starvation for some (N. B. our urban situation and the world around us); and to believe that such inhumanities could be readily eliminated by the simple decision to make government "scientific" ignores the "needs" or desires, in any case the interests, of those who presently benefit, in innumerable situations, at the expense, inconvenience, or even exploitation of others.

Behind your entire argument for "scientific" government lie questions of value (as to whose needs will be met) which are ignored in your editorial. So long as government benefits anyone as the result of coercive action on others, there is more than a question of efficiency involved. Shall the U.S. government end military conscription in favor of a volunteer army? The goal of military "defense" (I assume a great deal for the sake of argument; to get down to basics would require more space than you have) might not be met with maximum effectiveness or efficiency in such a scheme; but the argument could be made on noneconomic grounds that if the government wants to wage war, it should pay the full market price thereof and not be permitted to enslave some individuals for the alleged "benefit" of others. This decision involves a question of the taxpayers' pocketbook vs. the unwilling young, which cannot be answered on the kind of grounds you propose.

I want to include on behalf of the arguments contained in this letter my own apologies for what is undoubtedly somewhat sloppy presentation and poor organization. I think they deserve expression, however, and so I've severely limited the extent of my commentary, ignoring for the moment questions of legitimacy of government coercion, the morality of warfare, etc.

INTRODUCTION TO DESERTER INTERVIEW

D. is a deserter from the American army. He was stationed in Germany for 3 months before he decided the Vietnam war was illegal and immoral. On March 26th, 1968, he took off for Sweden. He lived there until August 26th, 1968 and then returned to Stateside for the purpose of getting a discharge on the grounds of desertion. He was 2 months in the Stockade at Fort Dix.

One day last week, he walked into EVO and told HIS story.

EVO: Why did you desert?

D: I came down with orders to go to Vietnam and I refused to go. The Army told me to wait and see, but instead I reenlisted for 6 years, took the money and split for Sweden. I am against the war.

EVO: Were you against the war when you joined the Army?

D: No. I didn't know anything about the war while I was in the States. In Germany I found out how bad the war was. The Vietnam war was none of our business.

EVO: Did you have any idea when you deserted where you were going?

D: No, I just split for Stockholm, but once in Stockholm, I turned myself over to the in Stockholm, I turned myself over to the Swedish Police authorities who directed me to the ADC, American Deserters Committee. ADC got me a foreign passport, resident and working permit. They found me a place to stay and put me on to a social bureau. The Social Bureau gives you money for food, 85 kroner, plus they pay your rent and give you a wardrobe of clothes.

EVO: Did you meet any other American deserters?

D: Yes, quite a few. There are about 200 deserters over there. Most of them you meet at meetings run by the ADC. They meet every Sunday for the purpose of discussion, information on jobs, apartments for rent, and to introduce new members. Mike Vel is the pres-

ident of the organization and has been in Sweden a year. He is not a deserter, but a draft dodger.

EVO: Who supports ADC?

D: It was originally supported by a Swedish lawyer, France Gordon Frank, who left the organization because he felt it was being corrupted by narcotics. The organization is now supported by different American peace movements and the Belgian, French, and Russian governments. They send us money and literature.

The organization was originally run by Ray Jones, an American soldier from Germany who had deserted. He was one of the first to desert to Sweden. He left, returned to the States for discharge purposes, served 4 months in the stockade and then disappeared in July of 1968. It was later discovered he was an informer for American Military Intelligence.

Mike Vel took over the ADC after that. The organization is now falling apart. Vel takes money from different peace groups and foreign governments slated for ADC and spends it on himself. He bought a Mustang for himself. His slip-ups are monumental. The Swedish government wants him out of the country because he is spending the money to buy drugs to sell at a profit. Other governments are dropping their aid because of the bad name he has brought upon ADC. ADC's own members are leaving the organization.

Vel would send members to peace festivals in European countries like Poland or Bulgaria. He knows that it was against Swedish law to send American deserters who are in Sweden less than a year to foreign European countries. This maneuver pissed off the Swedish authorities.

If the members of ADC don't get rid of Vel, it will be destroyed within 6 months time.

EVO: How many deserters come straight from Vietnam?

D: There are 20 deserters from Vietnam in Sweden. There are organizations in Vietnam setting up escape routes for American deserters there but they are not active as yet. The American government has been trying to break it.

The Viet Cong has helped American soldiers to desert. The Cong has escape routes capable of moving 100 deserters out of Vietnam. It takes the Cong 6 months to set up an escape route, but they haven't been activated yet because of informers and the fact that American GPs who desert are afraid to put themselves in the hands of the Viet Cong.

Some of the American GPs who deserted from Vietnam and who are now in Sweden were helped by the Cong. They went to Red China, then to the USSR and spent 2 weeks as guests of Kosygin at his house.

EVO: You came back to the States to serve time for being AWOL and to get a discharge. What were your experiences in the stockade at Fort Dix?

D: I was beaten up many times by the guards and shunned by the other prisoners. They hassle you with cold showers, dry shaves and beatings. I want to mention names: Sp. 5 Maggines, Sp. 5 Young, PFC Downey, Lt. Hinderlighter, Sgt. Watsel; These are the main guards at the Fort Dix Stockade who perpetuate brutality on prisoners, especially deserters.

I'd like to give advice and a warning to any future deserters who will be imprisoned at the Fort Dix Stockade to go see Major Cashman or Major Carter. Both are hip and are sympathetic towards deserters who have been brutalized. The prisoners at Fort Dix Stockade are now organizing. They have a working underground that can get letters out to lawyers, family, etc. They can even get dope, booze, etc. into the stockade.

The 532nd Military Police Battalion which just got back from Vietnam has replaced the old Military Police guards assigned to the stockade. An interesting note is that two-thirds of this battalion, at one time or another, have been prisoners themselves in American stockades in Vietnam. What I am trying to point out is that the whole system is fucked up. The 532nd Military Police battalion, as a result of their own sojourns in prison, understand prison life, and are now hooking up the Fort Dix Stockade underground to alleviate some of the many pressures the prisoners are under there.

UN MEETS MORE, TALKS LONGER

UNITED NATIONS HEADQUARTERS — The United Nations 23rd General Assembly which end Dec. 21, 1968 spent 1,147 hours and 10 minutes talking, it was reported by the UN information office.

The September to December session, including its committee meetings, talked 150 hours and 20 minutes more than the 22nd General Assembly.

Total meetings, both official and unofficial, in the 1968 session were 2,580, 88 more than 1967.

The UN also consumed 3,476,322 pounds of paper for its various documents in the last year. Translators in 1968 produced 205,000 pages of work.

However, no report was made on whether these pages were read.

SAN FRANCISCO — The Black Panther Party here has issued a statement supporting the "Oakland Seven," white leaders of the anti-draft action at the Oakland Induction Center last year. The seven went on trial early this week.

The Panther statement said the Oakland action occurred "When white students for the first time were forced to fight the pigs (police) in defense of their lives and political beliefs."

"The same Oakland pig department a week later attempted to murder our Minister of Defense, Huey P. Newton... (who) was railroad... to prison... after a racist grand jury indicted Huey. This same grand jury indicted the Oakland Seven."

The statement also included a list of demands made by the Seven, who spoke on behalf of the Stop the Draft Week Committee. The demands include: "amnesty for all political prisoners in the United States, an end to the Selective Service System, withdrawal of foreign troops from Vietnam and all capitalistic forces in that Southeast Asia nation, and freedom."

BRITISH PRESS TIGHT ON POT

LONDON — A report by a special committee to the Home Office calling for sharp reductions in penalties for possessing cannabis (pot) has run into strong criticism from the press here.

The large circulation Daily Mail said that the report and recommendations prepared under the direction of Lady Wootton would be "bound to mean that more people will take cannabis, just as softer gambling laws have produced a colossal boom in gambling."

The Mail also said that experts have found "alarming links between cannabis and crime or insanity in Cuba, India and Asia." However, other experts have found no such evidence.

The Guardian's response to the Lady Wootton report was:

"The logic of information now available tends towards the legalization of cannabis. There are two principal objections. One is the international law on narcotics control which includes cannabis among the forbidden drugs, along with opium, heroin and the rest. No country could lightly opt out of the international agreement... The second objection is the uncertainty about the mental and social consequences of cannabis smoking in moderation."

And the Daily Sketch, a Conservative paper, says the Wootton committee "is misguided by claiming it is doing no more than give way before public pressure."

The Sketch says the pressure is only coming for the "legalized pot lobby," not from the overwhelming majority of the British public. "The best thing to do with this report is to dump it in the wastepaper basket," it said.

Meanwhile, no United States official agency has produced anything like Lady Wootton's report and recommendations. Sad fact.



POT-SMOKERS' PARADISO

PARADISO and **Fantasio** are in Amsterdam. They are two pot clubs where young people can use soft drugs with minimal risk of prosecution. They are partially subsidised by the City Council as part of a new experiment.

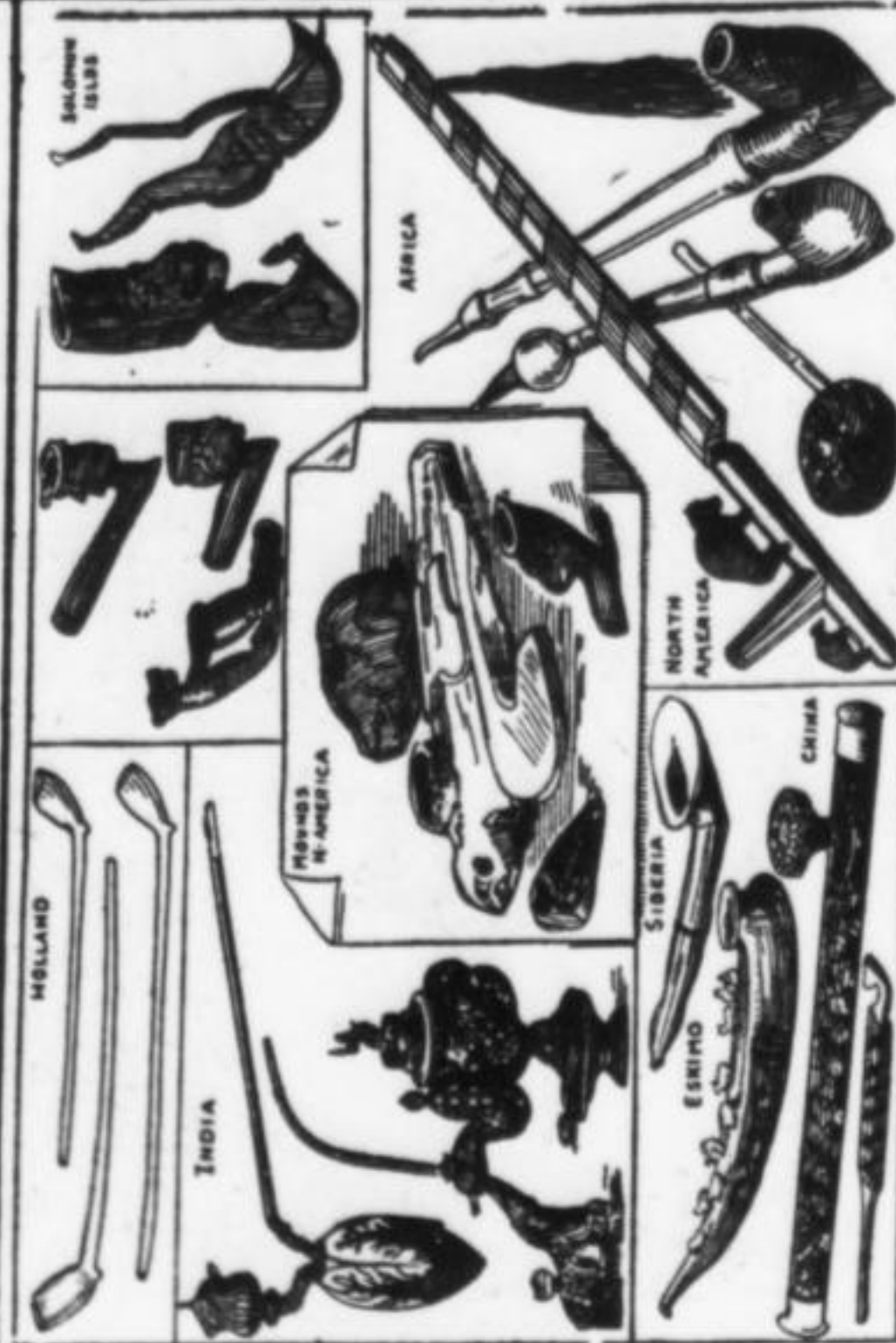
Besides taking pot, young people at these clubs may drink beer, dance, strip, make love, or do almost anything else for relaxation. Contraceptives are on sale. Hard drugs are banned.

Now, however, the leader of the extreme right-wing party has asked the public prosecutor to start proceedings against the mayor of the city and the clubs' directors.

Nico Toorenstra, the director of **Fantasia**, is 33. He is a qualified social worker, a university-trained sociologist, and a lecturer at Amsterdam's Social Academy. He too is threatened with prosecution, but is willing to go to prison to defend the right of young people to use cannabis. He even takes his own children, aged two and five, to **Fantasio** in the daytime. "They think it's terrific," he says.

RIO TRANSVESTITES FIGHT DRAG DANCE BAN

RIO DE JANEIRO (LNS) — Rio's transvestites have begun a campaign against an official ban on drag dances, long a feature of the pre-Lenten carnival in Rio. An order banning the dances was signed recently by the state security secretary. A spokesman for the transvestites said they'd show up at the gala balls at the Municipal Theater and classy hotels in high drag. "In any case, I doubt if anyone would spot us, even the police," one queen told reporters.

FLYING HIGH WHILE FLYING HIGH

LOS ANGELES (LNS) Western Airlines has revealed that many of its passengers are turning on—on board. Wayne Litchgarn, manager of customer relations, said that the aroma of marijuana has become commonplace in aircraft cabins. "Now we have three problems which sometimes cause annoyance to passengers—cigars, pipes and marijuana," he said. "And some people get quite indignant when you tell them smoking pot is not allowed."

STUDENTS ASSOC. TO FIGHT POT LAWS

WASHINGTON, D. C. (LNS) Citing statistics which reveal that 16,000 students have been busted on drug charges this fall, leaders of the National Student Association have announced counter-attack plans. Court challenges will be mounted on the constitutionality of federal and state laws. College affiliates will be urged to organize their own campaigns. NSA will disseminate information on arrests and legal rights.

The American Civil Liberties Union has also announced plans to oppose all criminal penalties on the use and possession of marijuana.

BRAIN WAVES WASH ON THE SANDS OF PEACE

UNITED NATIONS HEADQUARTERS — Recent research into brain waves seems to indicate that this phenomenon has an effect on peace, the UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization says in its quarterly magazine.

The current issue of "Impact of Science on Society" carries an article by Prof. W. Grey Walter who has been doing research on brain waves, and their several manifestations.

Walter indicates that certain brain "rhythms" distinguish individuals who think by using visual images and others who think abstractly. Walter discovered that "profound incompatibilities can result from these differences in thought processes."

"It may even be that serious crises between nations," Walter says, "... have arisen because the negotiators have different types of imagery and can only talk at cross purposes..."

"Perhaps a diplomat should have his (brain wave) type endorsed on his passport."

The work by Walter is being distributed by UNESCO on a worldwide basis, nothing unusual these days, but

this feat represents a surge towards a possibly better world, and that's not a daily possibility.

A vast underground of communication has been created by the UN its 24 years—not only through the diplomatic corps but also through the world of technicians who do the mechanics of our age. The iceberg of the UN has its General Assembly and Security Council obvious and above the surface. But just below this tip is a mammoth body probing the oceans, peering into space, peering into the earth, searching the thing called man, quiet.

The UN has become in many ways the clearing house for the passage of thoughts and ideas which can not respect national boundaries.

Look at what the UN is participating in now.

Research involving mental tests that will help predict individual life spans has already begun. Prof. G.O.M. Leith, thinking "it would be of value to know at what point (mental) differences become manifest and to know whether individual life spans can be predicted," said he found that the growth of intelligence does not end at age 15 or 16 as many have held.

In his paper called "Age, Personality and Learning Aptitudes" Leith said his work led him to find that among pre-school children "acceleration or deceleration in mental growth can be associated with the parents' way of dealing with their children. During the pre-school period, children who are emotionally dependent on their parents suffer relative loss of ability."



"After starting school, gains in measured aptitudes go with such qualities as aggressivity, ability to take initiative and competitiveness..."

Learning aptitudes are affected by non-intellectual factors, Leith reports, factors such as family environments which encourage persistence and foster independence rather than situations in which impulsiveness and immediate gratification dominate.

Other work on the mind involves a new view of the brain's mental faculties and processes. A Prof. A.R. Luria has reported to UNESCO that mental activities are actually complex functional systems, operating networks woven by a number of linked individual physiological factors, each factor having its own locus in the brain.

Turning to other fields of endeavor, the UN, through UNESCO, is now embarking on creating a world ocean forecasting system.

The system, called IGOSS (Integrated Global Ocean Station System), is aimed at providing oceanic information and forecasting service for the use of fishermen, shipmasters, health authorities and even surfers.

Work, supervised or participated in some way by the UN, also is being done in technological agriculture, atomic energy and a multitude of other fields, all of which make up the ecosystem of this world.

ISRAEL PAYS PART OF BEIRUT DAMAGES

TEL AVIV — Israeli-based insurance firms which are federated with the international Air Insurance Organization have received a bill of \$50,000 to cover their share of the payment going to Mideast Airlines and others who suffered \$40 million worth of damages as a result of the Dec. 28 Beirut raid.

Israelis also have been informed that premiums for the war risk clause on shipping to and from Israel would be increased 25 per cent. One insurance official said that the Tel Aviv government is attempting to avoid assuming the war risk coverage itself.

Meanwhile, it was reported that the Jews have agreed to accept a note from the government of Ghana which demands full compensation for its VC-10 Ghana Airways plane that was hit in the raid meant as a retaliation for the damaging of an El Al plane in Athens and the murder of one passenger. Ghana had leased the plane, marked only as a Mideast Airlines craft, to the Arabs.

The Foreign Office move may be an indication that Israel will make an arrangement with Ghana over the lost plane without reimbursing the Arabs as the United Nations resolution calls for.

It is presumed that the Arabs likewise will be billed for covering the damage done to the El Al plane.

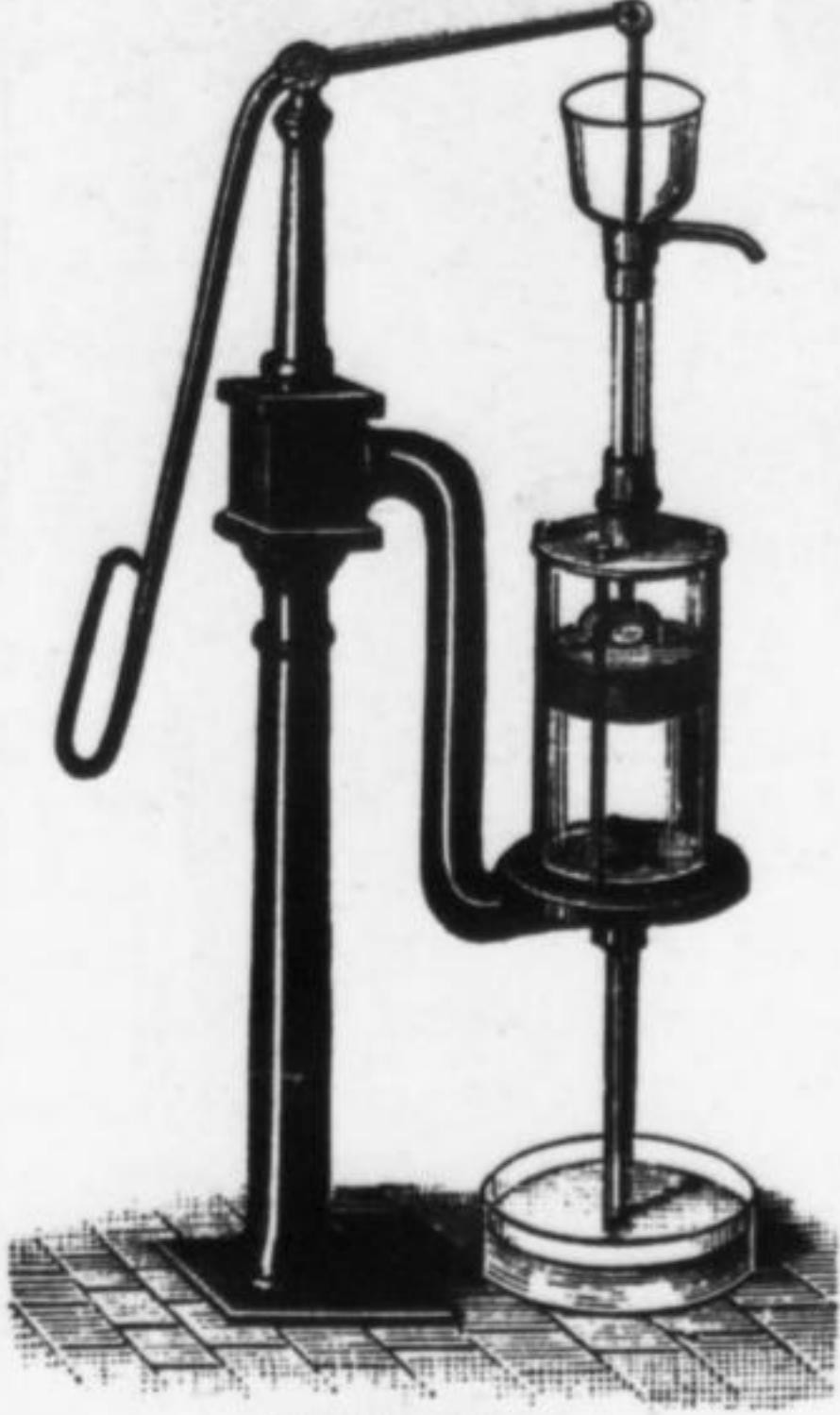
PLALGUE HITS CALIFORNIA

SAN FRANCISCO (LNS) — The strike at San Francisco State College, nurtured painfully into its third month by black and third world students and radical whites, is about to tear through the California educational system with the crippling ferocity of the Hong Kong flu.

The carrier of this plague is, oddly enough, the AFL-CIO. Their 400-member American Federation of Teachers chapter at San Francisco State has given the striking students their latest alliance in the struggle to maintain and expand the strike. Now the AFT teachers at San Jose State (60 miles south of here) have gone out on their own picket line, and others appear sure to follow.

Meanwhile, Ronald Reagan employs all his mellifluous persuasiveness to ask the State Legislature for yet more laws against "criminal anarchists and latter-day fascists." And General Semanticist S.I. Hayakawa treats newsmen to his daily press conference.

Outside, a half-mile-long picket-line of up to 2,000 students of the College's main entrance under the gaze of San Francisco police. Smaller picket-lines

halted deliveries at other gates. Most of the picket signs were neatly printed AFT placards demanding union recognition and campus autonomy. But even Dylan appeared: "STRIKE another match, go start a new, 'cause it's all over now, Baby Blue."

Picketing Monday, Jan. 6 was exuberant. Tuesday, a small group of pickets left the main line chanting: "On Strike, Shut It Down. On Strike, Rip It Up. On Strike, Blow It Up," outside Hayakawa's office around noon. Nearly 800 pickets joined them, when a voice over the administration loud speaker pronounced these demonstrations disruptive and illegal. AFT pickets were then pulled out of the line by their captains. And hassles broke out as student strikers refused to give Solidarity returned shortly, though, with the arrival in force of the cops. up their AFT.

Wednesday, the police initiated confrontation by driving a wedge through the picket line to "provide access onto the campus." Strikers were shoved out into six-lane 19th St. and mounted police rode into the fray. A San Francisco Chronicle reporter was badly beaten and arrested after he followed a plain-clothesman out of the line.

The college administration, for its part, matched the police escalation in court, by obtaining a temporary restraining order directing the AFT to cease their picketing.

So, once again, the strike has an opportunity to drag an ally (the teachers) to the Left. Again, the students seem to have taken a force which might have coopted and exploited them and turned it into a buffer on their flank.

And the injunction against the AFT may now be pushing the Union outside of the law into the area where radical potentials almost always bloom.



GREEK BUST PLATE BUSTING

ATHENS — The junta government of Greece has declared that busting plates and crockery in Greek taverns is a bustable offense.

The plate smashing is a traditional sign of approval given to performers and players of bouzouki music. Such appreciation on the part of patrons is now worth up to six months in jail, and another three months if the offender is "arrogant and provocative."

Moreover, the rightwing authorities have banned the taring of shirts and coats in taverns—the alternative gestures of the enthused bouzoukist.

INDIANS FIGHTS FOR RIGHTS

ELKO, Nev. (LNS) — Oscar Johnny, sub-chief of the Western Shoshone Nation of Indians, has proposed a "Congressional investigation of the conduct of the Bureau of Indian Affairs and their so-called tribal councils and inter-tribunal councils."

The Nevada Shoshone leader has accused the government agencies of "petty dictatorship" and of exercising "unlimited power over the lives and lands of the Indian people." Oscar Johnny and other Indian leaders are seeking to organize their people for militant action against "over 100 years of wrongs and mismanagements by the Bureau of Indian Affairs and Bureau puppet government."

In a letter to Liberation News Service, Oscar Johnny said that states are beginning to pass anti-Indian legislation, and he urges the Indian community to remain vigilant. He also reiterated his support for John Rolling Thunder Pope, who had proposed a camp-in and demonstration at Carson City, the Nevada capital. The action was postponed when anti-Indian legislation was withdrawn.

Oscar Johnny argues that the Federal government organized unrepresentative tribal councils and does not allow many people to vote. The following is a list of grievances submitted by Oscar Johnny as a representative of the Indian reservation at Okyhee, Nevada (for further information, write to Oscar Johnny, 110 Iv-er St., Elko, Nevada 89801):

1. JOBS: Jobs on the Reservation to which the Indians are supposed to have first choice are given to white people although there are Indians qualified for the work. The only Indians who are hired are the relatives and friends of councilmen.

2. WATER RIGHTS—WILD HORSE DAM: The Owyhee Indian wants first

priority to all water from the Wild Horse Dam.

3. SURVEY RESERVATION: A survey to determine the original boundary lines of the Owyhee Reservation as of 1879.

4. TRIBAL COUNCIL: We recommend that the present tribal council be abolished and that tribal affairs be returned to the Indian people, to have their own chief and council.

5. LAND: We wish to maintain the tax-free status of our land. Not to be mortgaged or sold.

6. CHAIRMAN COUNCIL: The Owyhee people are in the dark about what the Council does or how much money is used and for what. We recommend that the Chairman of the Council should always make a report to the people.

7. BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT: We do not want any reservation lands leased to non-Indians.

8. BUSINESS LEASE AND RENT MONEY: A report should be made on how much lease money or rent has and is being paid by stores and businesses on the reservation.

9. RANGE FEE. At the present time we pay for reservation range at double the rate of what white people pay for similar range on the public domain. Range rights should be free to Indians.

10. BUREAU OF INDIANS AFFAIRS: Bureau of Indian Affairs office to be abolished at Owyhee.

11. HOUSING: Tribal housing should be reserved for Indians, instead of white people.

12. CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS: We wish the Wheeler Howard Act and the Constitution and ByLaws thrown out, all puppet government abolished.



WASHINGTON BLACKS SEEK TO ARREST A CONGRESSMAN

WASHINGTON, D.C. (LNS) — The Black United Front of Washington, D.C., has called for the immediate arrest and jailing of Rep. Joel T. Broyhill (R-Va.) as a deterrent to future violence in Washington. The Front has charged Broyhill with making inflammatory statements. It also called upon President-elect Nixon to sponsor a statehood bill for the District of Columbia in 1969. The front is a coalition of moderate and radical black groups.

OWSLEY IS FREE AGAIN

LOS ANGELES (LNS) — Augustus Stanely Owsley III, 34, the acid man, has been acquitted of a recent drug charge. Superior Court Judge Paul W. Egly ruled that there was insufficient evidence to connect Owsley with the alleged sale of 500 caps to an undercover agent at Los Angeles International Airport on Jan. 24, 1968.



We Bombed In Miami

Like a budding clot of Southern California — laced with slices of Teaneck and midtown Manhattan — the city of Miami trembles expectantly on the coast of Florida, waiting for the word, that signal, the soundless disintegration of some invisible membrane . . . The town's full of jes' plain folk, cops and restaurant owners and Mafia and retired oldsters, they live and carry on just like they used to back in Cincinatti and Buffalo — except here they live cacooned in plastic, their contact with each other and with us facilitated only through communications devices of an electromagnetic nature . . . Living quietly in Miami, nearly forgotten in the excitement of our Sixties, waiting for that abrupt ineffable **pfoof** — that lurching release of spiritual pressure — that finally Their Way may slide like blood along the neon gutters of America to points West and North and Everywhere.

Miami is Loser Town, that is, it's the archetype of all the Loser Towns of America — the innumerable tract-development clusters around Los Angeles, for instance, and the pretty commuter towns that bed like lilies along the great Megalopolitan smog-bog between Boston and Washington. The people who live in these places have lost everything but myths, and it seems to be Miami that has taken to synthesising myths for the comfortable consumption of the losers. Loser Town: it gave us Richard Nixon, himself such a wrung-out perpetual loser that you do not fold, spindle, or in any way rattle this President under penalty of his serious approbation, displeasure, and blindpanic. It is hoped in Miami that Nixon will be the agent implementing this **pfoof**, the inundation of all America with the Spirit of Miami.

But this article isn't about Miami or Nixon, sorry, this is a sports story on the Super Bowl last Sunday. The Spirit of Miami was significantly absent from the Super Bowl, except for the halftime importunities (which featured the All-Negro Florida A&M Marching Band, celebrating with many bizzare formation maneuvers the Great American Heritage. Actually, it's safe now to disclose that they were coding secret messages to Kathleen Cleaver, informing her that her husband was safely enroute to Cuba on Tony Rome's yacht). For

this blessing we must thank the New York Jets, who by becoming World Football Champions most poetically destroyed the latest myth that the Spirit of Miami was striving to foist upon all of us. By pounding the daylight out of Baltimore and sending Colt quarterback Earl Morrall out of the game, Namath and Snell and Sample and Beverly saved the us from yet another seizure of the American Coma, no, that doesn't work, the American Dream.

A lot of advance newspaper sports copy got dumped about the end of the second quarter of that game; a lot of furry black ulcers were grumbling in a lot of gamblers' bellies by that time. The Jets were 17-point underdogs going into Sunday, understand, and the advance copy had a lovely myth to illuminate. It must have been irresistible to write that copy, it was such a **very** pretty story by the Schlitz-drinking standards of America. Before we get to that myth, though, let's dig on the last one for a bit.

ABE LOMBARDI AND THE GREEN BAY ESAUS

There are two basic precepts shoring up this myth, and the first one is that pro football, a Team Sport if ever there was one, demands of its athletes that their individuality be subordinate to the strictly mechanical nature of the teamwork. This is a myth as firmly impacted into the nature of Post-War (that war, stupid, not **this** one!) America as the aesthetic of the military crewcut: while we aren't **essentially** a military society, our respect for the artifacts of WWII is still extravagant in the most influential sectors. And up 'till the 1968 Super Bowl, there was no more mechanical, crewcut football team around than the Green Bay Packers.

The Packers were all **kinds** of mechanical: when Ken Bowman snapped the ball up under his crotch to Bart Starr, the air then fairly stank with motor oil as the Green Bay Packers ate up the yardlines like some enormous remote-control lawnmower. And remotely controlling all that precision hardware was the erstwhile Avatar of the current myth, coach Vince Lombardi.

Forget that Middle European name. Lombardi was more American than Mom's apple pie ever **dared** to be. Fancy-ass sociological

hacks called him a Father Figure, and in this for once they were fairly correct: Lombardi was fat and jolly, a right fatherly old figure, and also he was ranting and raving and implacable and supernaturally Demanding. The father who devours his sons, the sons who offer themselves up by the worshipful forksful — that was that myth, for three years. As long as Lombardi kept pushing his men beyond all conceivable limits of physical endurance — as long as they kept it up and **won** for him, season after season — America had an edifying myth to behold and be uplifted by.

Somehow, myths being myths, I can't find it in me to scoff at the Packers for this blind, suicidal fealty. Playing pro football is like getting up on a big horse that invariably bucks you off and stomps you until you get out from under it; and then you climb back on again, knowing damn well you'll get bucked and stomped again . . . And again . . . And again . . . The Packers were known to play whole afternoons with fractured ribs prodding insistently at their lungs, with audibly leaking kidneys, shin splints up to the collarbones, like that — and even it if was all for the sake of the Old Man, there's something there that stirs me. But for Schlitz-drinking America it was the figure of Lombardi, that glorious old father figure, pushing his boys bloodily to three straight NFL championships and three straight Super Bowls — 'One more title for Coach Lombardi,' the Packers prayed all the fall of '67, and when Lombardi retired the next spring they just collapsed, disintegrating into wasted filaments of myth-completion. They was Used, and this year they hardly threatened.

Morrall Myth Meets White Shoes

This year a new myth was called for, a distinctly Miami sort of myth in respect of certain Presidents-elect, and Earl Morrall competently provided us with one, up 'till the third quarter last Sunday. It was the Myth of the Redeemed Loser, and it fell out when Joe Namath confronted it in his pretty white shoes and his \$400,000 arm.

Briefly, this is the way the advance sports copy read: Earl Morrall, who had spent his strong silent type career overshadowed by other NFL quarterbacks, was supposed to have driven the Colts roughshod over the Jets. Morrall had worked three other NFL teams as backup quarterback before coming to Baltimore; and Baltimore itself had squandered a tight end on Morrall only because the regular backup quarterback for Johnny Unitas was out with injuries. Then no sooner did Morrall join the Colt Machine (much like the Packers, under coach John Shula) but the legendary Unitas messed up during early season practice and turned his invaluable arm into a sort of Slinky Toy.

So Unitas was benched for the season. It was Morrall — this tragically underrated taxi-squad veteran, so the advance copy went — who coaxed the Colts to the leadership of the National Football League. Morrall's light, they said, long stifled under the bushel imposed by three NFL front offices, had supernovaed. It was a big deal then, understand, winning the NFL title — and with Morrall, it had the makings of a myth fit to edify every Schlitz-drinker in the country. The Super Bowl — the play-off between the NFL and AFL champs — was supposed to be an exhibition of sorts, the romantic culmination of this year's myth.

Bear with me, it gets funny now. There was no question, before Sunday, but that the Colts would pulverise the Jets. The American Football League is only nine years old, and the Jets are much newer; the NFL's been around since the Works Progress Administration, those guys are **real tough pros!** It is the second precept of the NFL myth (now extinct) that the AFL is below the consideration of such as the Packers and Colts. 'That Mickey Mouse league.' Vince Lombardi used to scoff, 'that's \$15,000 every January for whoever wins the NFL title.' Even Vince had trouble getting his boys up for the first two Super Bowls (Oakland and Kansas City, both losers) — it was laughable.

RATS, LIES & HISTORY

The first office call I received this year was from the FBI. I thought, ah, my "informed sources" inside the department were offering the lowdown on the burgeoning nixonstructure. But, of course not. His name is Mr. Conrad. Conrad, he says. Soft & easy. What can I do for Mr. Conrad. I don't have anything on Adam Clayton, I agree that Biafrans are starving & the Pope has been enuchized. What Conrad? He mentions Jerry Rubin. Yes, Rubin. I know Rubin. Conrad asks whether I wrote a certain article last August published in EVO. "PIG BUTCHER" Talking about plans for the Chicago Guilt Orgy. GOVERNMENT STUDY DISCLOSES CHICAGO POLICE RIOTED. Yes, I remember the article. I wrote it. Yes. I had mentioned in the article somewhere "before Rubin emplaned for Chicago." EMPLANED. To take a plane. To fly. To cross state lines. Federal property. He wants me to help clear up the great mystery. They want Jerry Rubin. His lip they do not like. They know he was in Chicago. They think they know. Apart from the fuss that they have to determine you crossed State lines before indictment (well, Tom Hayden, Rennie Davis, Dave Dellinger will soon be Federally charged for helping to put Mr. Richard Nixon in the White House. Personally, I have nothing against Mr. Nixon. He deserves what he has. His victory. He uses his political influenza well). So these these people are up for grabs. For helping Dick come. But one they really want is the Rube. Badly.

They'd love to shave him. Dismember his intuition.

Anyhow, back to Mr. Conrad.

You see, there were two Rubins in Chicago. Rubin A & Rubin B. Either Rubin A or Rubin B was seen here or there; and the whole alm of the law spent days tailing Rubin B when it was suddenly discovered that B was not A, and A something else. Maybe the Statue of Liberty. The embarrassment was uterine pink.

So will I testify? Will I, when subphoeaed to Chicago (or was it Washington, Sir?) tell whether Mr. Rubin flew or walked. Whether he was A or B.

"C-O-N-R-A-D," he said.

"Conrad," I said.

Listen to this, Conrad. My Uncle Murray has problems. With his rats, Con. On November 21 after Rubin A or B, Health Commissioner Edward O'Rourke, speaking from intimate friction, announced that rat bites had declined 50% over the last five years. Before 1963 (he could have said DURING WAGNER) they were 700 a year, and DURING LINDSAY they were 368. Imagine! The rats were pissed. The rats knew they were giving. O'Rourke introduced the new campaign (after Chicago, mind you) STARVE A RAT TODAY, (he may eat you tomorrow). Novem-

Now, listen very carefully, Mr. Conrad. You must work to indict these rats. We can't have these human beings despoiling our imagination. Before 63 the city couldn't move into ratinfested areas with permission from landlords. And, since it doesn't pay to get rid of lawabiding rats, the lords had a point. But, before another line, I'll say this for John Lindsay . . . it was hip of him to make uncle Murray (H. Raphael) head of the Bureau of Pest Control. War is war, and in times of war the best minds are for worse ends. Anyhow the city was using \$1 1/2 million, and applied for \$2.6 million of the \$16.4 million supposedly appropriated by Congress to control rats on a national scale, Washington, Chicago, California, Ohio, New York. And our rats were tougher. More sophisticated. Cheesed & hamburgered around in fur coats.

So what do the rats do? Those no good rats! Well, rats are like people. They energize & scheme the same lust and thirst for life. Like blacks, they attack the death of their imagination. Park Avenue. The rats sent one division to wreak havoc among the sophisticates who were starving them on television while sending the cheese to Biafra. Some rat warriors crossed Park Avenue. Strolled past doormen at the exclusive apartment buildings where even Sammy Davis has to prove he's a Jew. These rats were strange. No flinching or pausing. I thought of Chicago. They marched beautifully. People started calling Uncle Murray. DO SOMETHING. So the island that devides the north and south roadways between 58th & 59th streets was laced with special poison.

Then this gem from Frederick S. Kent, Assistant Commissioner for Environmental Health Services:

"I think it's interesting that as soon as rats are spotted on Park Avenue we get calls. BUT IN THE GHETTO THEY WAIT FOR RATS TO BITE."

Ghetto: I have one here, Mr. Kent. Now

Kent: Hold on to it.

Ghetto: Trying my best.

Kent: Your name?

Ghetto: Ghetto.

Kent: Ghetto what?

Ghetto: Ghetto Ghet.

Kent: How do you spell that?

Ghetto: I can't spell. Use my X.

Kent: You're a Muslim, eh?

Ghetto: What?

Kent: Why didn't your husband call?

Ghetto: I have no husband.

Kent: Who sleeps with you then?

Ghetto: I have four little children. All of us Welfare.

Kent: I am not your caseworker.

Is this your first complaint?

Ghetto: My tenth.

Kent: My foot.

Ghetto: What?

Kent: Some rats are one foot long.

Ghetto: Yes.

Kent: What color is the one you have now?

Ghetto: Grey.

Kent: Grey.

Ghetto: Yes.

Kent: Let's see. We killed all the grey rats in 68. Are you sure?

Ghetto: Yes.

Kent: Examine it again.

Ghetto: Grey.

Kent: And what happened?

Ghetto: I put a slab of cheese between my toes, and now it's trapped between my big toe & small toe.

But I need help.

Kent: How much cheese did you use?

Ghetto: A leftover slab from the Welfare cheese.

Kent: And you do not know it's against the law to feed rodents?

Ghetto: Ro-what?

Kent: Your stupidity is exhausting.

Ghetto: Help.

Kent: Will someone be in the apartment tomorrow morning . . . say, at nine.

Ghetto: NOW.

So my uncle Murray shows off with his \$1.5 million "Kill A Rat Today" (no wonder so many muggings) program, and dumped more than 100 pounds of rat poison near Park Avenue. H-Bomb. And the Penn-Central chipped in with 35 pounds, of poison. The rats were screaming unhappy, they choked, ate death, didn't want to die, my uncle smiled, his profession thrived on their deaths. We can't control the Hong Kong Flu, but we can control our rats. And now we are supposed to believe that Park Avenue's rat problems are caused by one person. A woman who has fed pigeons for years. Rats, says the Health Department, ate too. That's right, C-O-N-R-A-D. This old lady was issued a summons for feeding pigeons to feed rats too. But I am not suprised. Arrest Isaac B. Singer ("in the light of the rising moon. She tried to run, but the monstrosity reared up on its hind legs, like a man, and pursued her until she fell into a ditch."). Singer feed pigeons. Scapegoat, scapegoat, outsider, outside agitator, this little woman the Jerry Rubin of the Rats and my uncle Murray says she's a criminal.

Last week Monday Washington cabled \$2.6 million to the city to help my uncle exterminate rats.

My uncle loves to kill.

artists attack moma



Demonstrations at the Modern Museum have tended to affect the art world the way revolutions in Paris have affected the world beyond it. The first demonstration of artists in the 'Thirties was against the conservatism of the administration at that time and opened the way to a fuller acceptance of abstract art in America. The second demonstration, on April 24, 1960, was against the domination of galleries and museums by a single style, that of abstract expressionism, and also against the supremacy of a single criticism favoring that style. Soon after this demonstration came a comparative revival of figurative work, followed by the developments of pop, op, and psychedelia which opened art out into many new styles and media. There is therefore good reason to watch and listen for all the signs and symptoms after the act of protest carried out by the Greek artist Takis and his friends on the third of January of this year, a year when anything can happen.

On this day Takis removed one of his kinetic sculptures from the Machine exhibition at the Modern and sat it in the museum garden for two hours amidst menacing museum guards (one of whom suggested he would have been shot for doing the same thing at the Metropolitan) before he and his friends were permitted a dialogue with the curator. Not presented to the curator at this time were the suggestions of the more militant members of this group, among them Takis and the Persian poet Farman. These suggestions, while rejecting conventional definitions of revolution and fashionable sloganeering, embody concrete proposals for renewal not only of the Modern but of the whole museum scene. The group feels they may also justify expanded and extended demonstrations in the future.

The proposals thus far put toward by Takis and Farman are meant to raise the level of the art world at every point and not merely to benefit a single school or group of artists. Ideas are still in the planning stage and highly flexible, but among those proposed so far:

1) The Museum of Modern Art should be open free of charge to the general public on at least one day of every week.

2) A Registry of Artists should be compiled at the Modern for the benefit of all museums listing all artists living in the New York area. For the purpose of this registry de facto, recognition as an artist should be given to any person able to present a body of work.

3) Using this Registry as a basis, a completely random show of all artists should be put together by lottery and shown at the Modern at least once a year. While it is possible that such a show will contain much mediocrity, it is felt that this method will not be any more dangerous to public taste than the one now in use. There is a precedent for this procedure in last year's Pavilions in the Parks program in London, where artists were awarded pavilions by lottery in which to create happenings.

4) A similar random show of photographs should be instituted.

5) A much more direct relationship between the museum and artist should be cultivated. At present almost all contact must go through gallery owners and other middle-men. This relationship should express itself particularly where conditions of exhibition are concerned.

6) A plan should be evolved to provide the artist with some percentage of the resale price of his work, whether this goes up or down. At present artists, unlike writers or composers, receive money only from the first sale of their work, and the effect of any later sale is felt only by the subsequent owners. This is particularly important for the majority of artists who only sell a few works and who can never hope to sell a work to a major museum, with the attendant publicity and price increase this could bring to all their work.

7) Both known and unknown artists should be admitted as members to the Board of Directors of the Museum of Modern Art.

8) Artists should be encouraged to create Tech Art pieces which can be manufactured for the masses, and the Museum should undertake to lessen the mystique surrounding the original work of art.

9) Rooms should be continually available at the Modern for the mounting of environments, and there should be at least one environment continually on view. At this writing the Modern has never sponsored an environment. Artists

should be invited and given funds to mount such environments for periods of two weeks or longer.

10) The artist should retain undisputed copyright in his own work, regardless of who owns it, and he should have reasonable access to see it when he so requires.

Most important of all, it is felt that an attempt should be made to alter the atmosphere now given off by museums, or challenge the sense that the visitor must enter the museum in a state of awe, behold the works in a state bordering on religious ecstasy, and leave with a feeling of having been automatically enriched in his culture and innermost soul. This effect may bear a remarkable resemblance to what church-going once gave, but there is no evidence that it is good or meaningful either for the visitor or the work of art. The artists in this group recognize that their task will not be easy and welcome suggestions from other artists or interested parties on how to make their ideas more practical and realizable. They also believe that further demonstrations at the Modern and elsewhere may be necessary to drive home their points and would welcome the participation of artists, students, actors. Suggestions may be forwarded to the group care of EVO. The members of the group so far are Takis, Farman, Hans Haacke, Nicholas Calas, Willoughby Sharp, Elizabeth Biar, and Dennis Oppenheim.

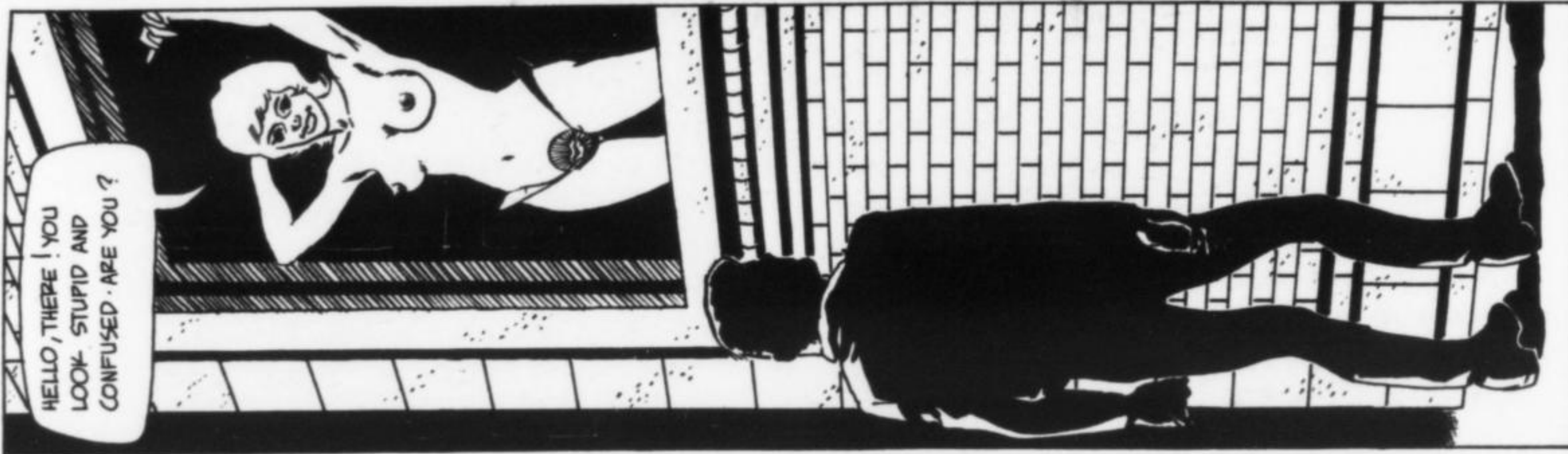
This means that last year's demonstrations in the universities may take place this year in the museums as well, though it has yet to be seen if artists living all over the city will prove as devoted demonstrators as students living or working on their campuses. No one should be surprised if the museums do become such targets, though it is to be hoped that the works of art will not be damaged. The present mood of our society is to ask deep-cutting questions about the very meaning and purpose of culture, questions which may have no definitive answers but which will nonetheless be asked. If the result may be partly to demystify the artist, it may also be to make his work more accessible and socially meaningful.

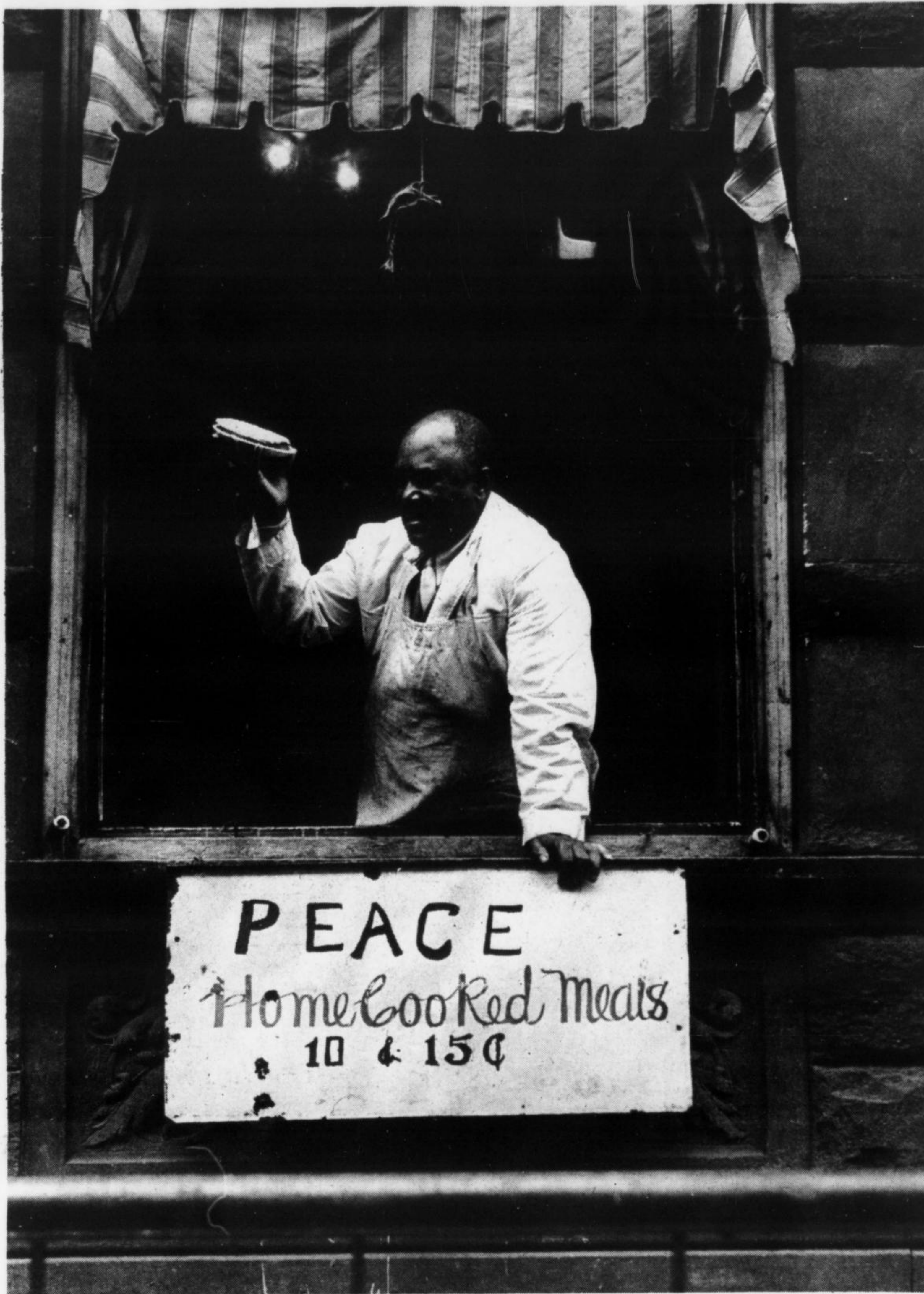
Thomas Hoving says in the preface of the Photo-book published by Random House, titled: "Harlem on my mind": "To me Harlem on my Mind is a discussion. It is a confrontation. It is education. It is a dialogue. Allon Schoener, editor of the book and organizer of the Media Mix Show in the Metropolitan Museum (Opening January 18th) writes in the Editorial foreword: "This book is an extension of the exhibition. It is not necessary to see the exhibition to appreciate the book, but if one has, the structure and technique of the book are recognizably parallel. In both there is a selective barrage of information. In the book, it is text and pictures. In the exhibition it is images and sounds."

Interviewed at the Pre-Preview, one day before the official Press-Preview, Allon Schoener said: "Interpretation of history based on an attitude of today, which is that we live in a world of communication. What is lacking in this world today is a fact of communication between Blacks and Whites. I hope this exhibition may be a beginning."

The title of the show "Harlem on my Mind" is taken from a song by Irving Berlin (1933) "I've a longing to be low—down,— And my parlez-vous will not ring true,—with "Harlem on my Mind". Those lines describe the nostalgic longings of a black chick being in Paris and thinking about Harlem,—it is a sentimental, typical thirtyish kind of lyric.

I went up to the Metropolitan Museum with "Harlem" on my mind to see what goes on, before the talks, the lectures, the speeches, the opening-scenes. Multi-Media-Mix didn't function yet . . . but maybe it is better to see such a show in the "becoming" the stage of incompleteness. I saw a lot of oversized photo-murals, mounted on the walls, wall to wall, corner to corner, attached from floor to ceiling constructions in the shape of cubes and columns, and the story of this show of murals gave the History of "The cultural Capital of Black America." 1900 - 1968 . . . Emphasis on Harlem. It is not an Art Show, no paintings or sculptures by Black Artists are exhibited, it is a sociological reportage, a visual translation of the Photo-book, which serves as catalogue for the occasion. Price \$1.95. Softcover. The Hardcover edition is \$12.95. 255 Pages, Newspaper-clippings from 1900 to 1968, from old time publications like the Harper's Weekly 1900, Harlem Home News 1911, New York Times from 1900 until 1968, Negro World, Harlem Home News and many other papers, which also cared about Harlem. There are exhibited photos, enlarged to "symbolic" proportions of Jazz-life, factories, breadlines, riots,

homes, slums, portraits of famous Blacks, the Jazz musicians, the writers, the poets, photos of poor peoples, living quarters, photos of naked hungry children, photos of old Harlem citizens, Grandmothers and I especially recall a photo by Aaron Siskind "Portrait of a young boy", made 1938,—he sits all dressed up in an oldfashioned armchair under a "psychedelic lampshade . . . so modern today. We went a long way since 1938 . . ."

The best gallery in my opinion is the one of the extended threedimensional "Breadline", a photo of black men being roped in, standing in line. This enlarged photo is repeated on 4x8 feet panels 16 times, filling the whole space of Gallery 8 like a modern construction—sculpture in the Ronald-Bladen-style, also the vision of Les Levine's show of white rectangular plastic rectangles in repetition seems to be recreated here again with a social content.

There will be as I was told a completely black room in which sound and projections surround the visitors. It didn't work yet, but the room itself as seen in its darkness, lined by oversize white screens, to reflect the projected images, impressed me . . . It will be, so I imagine, a highlight of the show.

One can nevertheless feel, that this historical event-show depicting the Harlem situation since 1900 until today may arouse some controversial discussions. It's a rather slick and cool show for a hot issue. There had been some picketing by some Har-

lem citizens on this Sunday before the Museum. Mr. Schoener told us, that this issue will be discussed in a special Press conference.

The show looked at from an aesthetic point of view is a big, spacial super-installation of gigantic, smaller and medium sized Photo-enlargements, slogans, TV and Video inserts in ceiling—high columns, everything in black and white, no color is used, with an addition of sound pouring out from black super-structures hanging from the ceilings, sound-domes in conical shapes, there are multi-track stereo speakers and the life in Harlem unrolls in multi-media photo form: From white to black Harlem 1900 to 1919. Urban Black Culture 1920 to 1929. Depres-

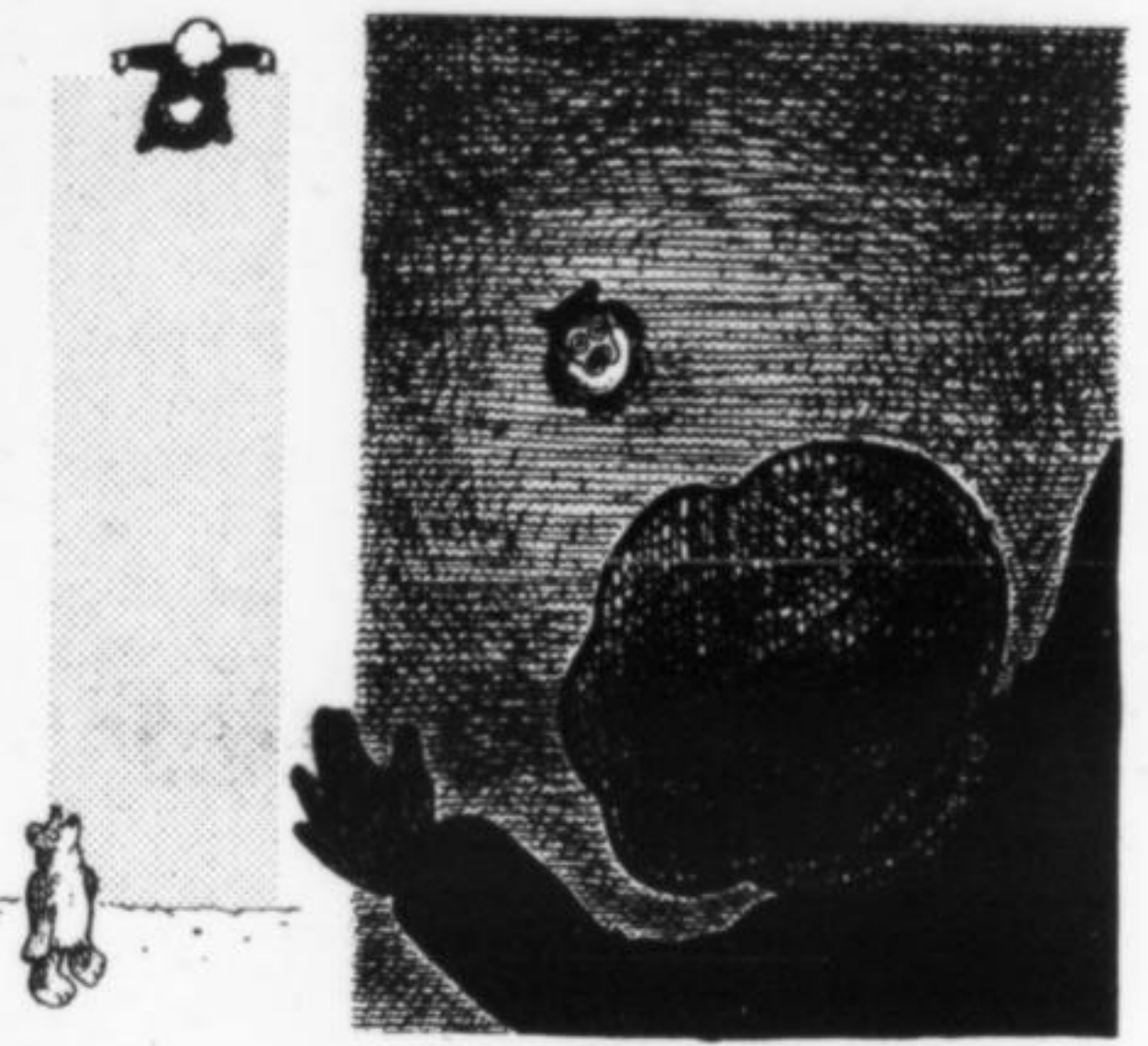
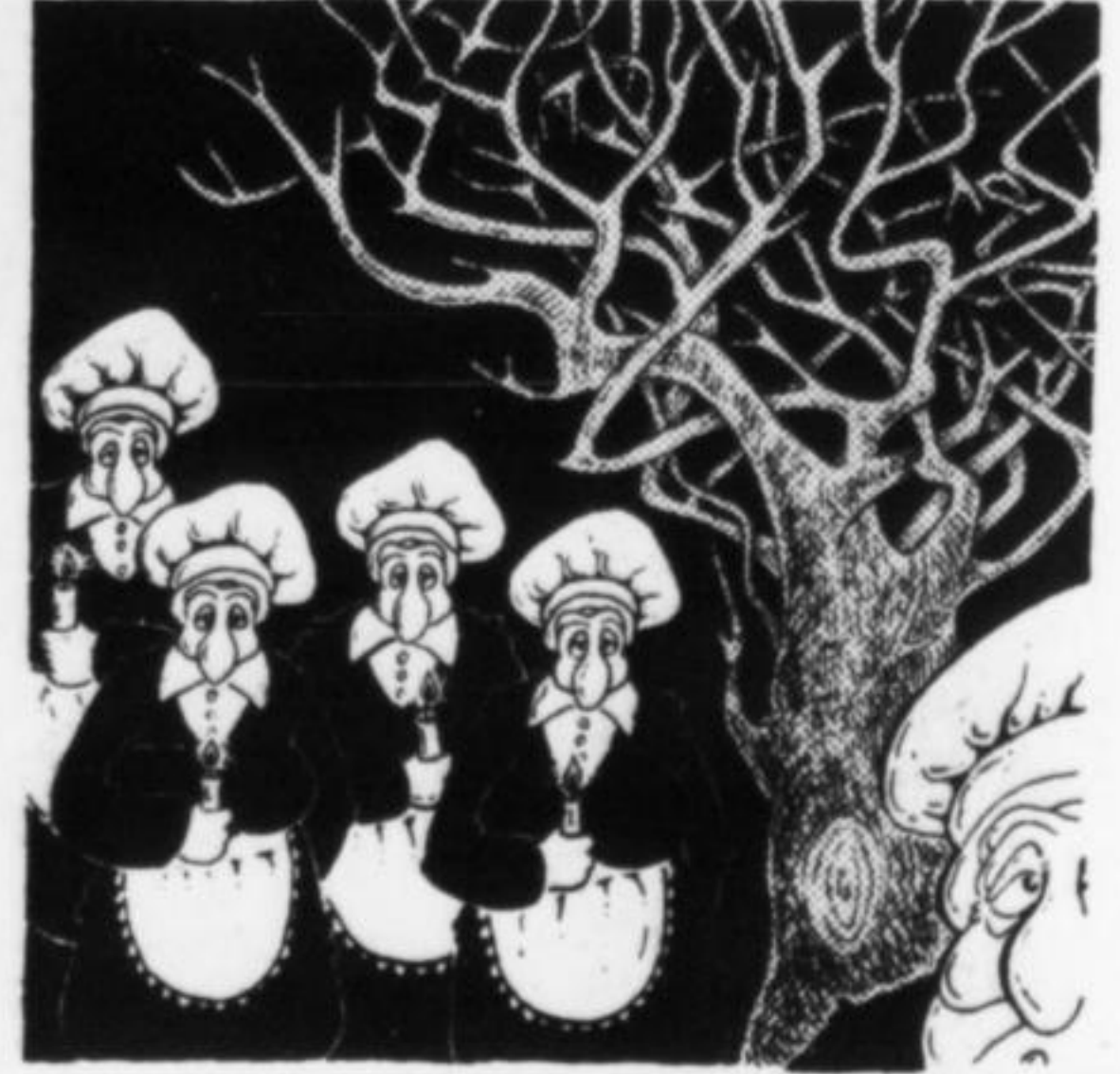
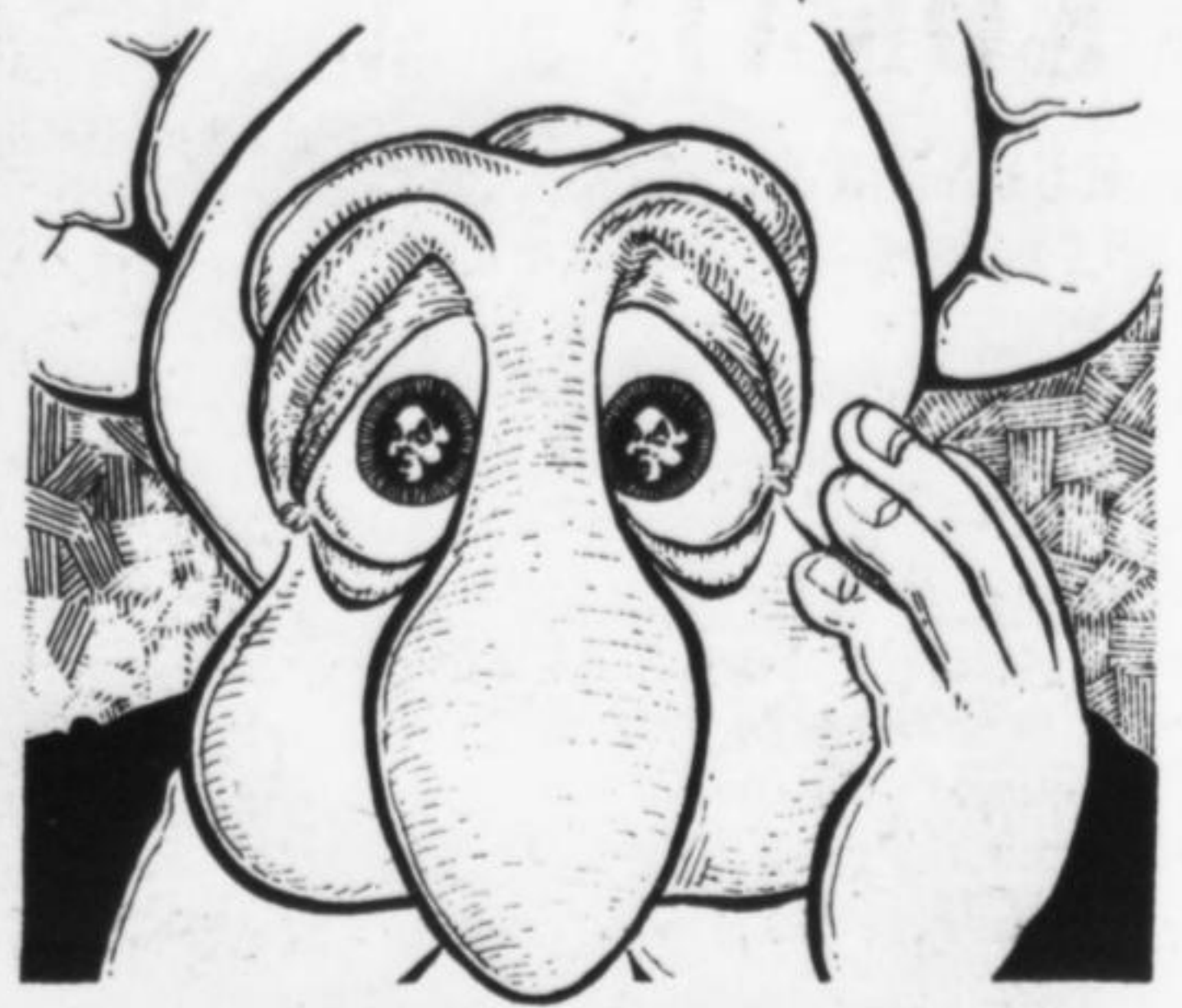
sion and Hard Times 1930 to 1939, War Hope and Opportunities 1940 to 1949, Frustration and Ambivalence 1950 to 1959, and Militancy and Identity 1960 to 1968.

Entering the show next to the Iran Museum Exhibition, one sees to the right the silver Portrait of King Shapur II, and one leaves the Exhibition, walking through the arrays of Grecian Vases, one also can see the introductory part for Negro life in the years 1626-1900 . . . presented in a poster, a very old kind of historical fact . . . titled the "Negro Complaint" reading: "Am I not a Man and a Brother". This poster was sold at the Slavery Office 144 Nassau Street . . .

GALLERY OF MODERN ART (Huntington Hartford Museum): Burton Greene — 1:00 P.M. Sat.

Progressive Rock has evolved into nothing more than Rock Muzak. It is smooth, clean and tightly done by hard working tradesmen. It pretentiously draws from an impersonal, objective musical spectrum in an eclectic melange of modern classical, baroque, big band jazz, central European folk music, Indian sources, blues and Frank Sinatra. But in its quest for professionalism it lost the raunchy, subjective excitement and expression of rock n' roll.

With the exception of The Rolling Stones and the Beatles, there seems to be a division between music that's really happening and music that is commercially exploitable. The high energy music that reflects our explosive times is smugly put down in the pages of Variety and is rarely booked at the Fillmore. The sound of today is active and involving. It is represented by The Group Image, Archie Shepp, The Fugs, Pharoah Sanders, MC-5, Albert Ayler, Cecil Taylor and a host of creative musicians who get few paying gigs, very little press, and almost no radio play (AM or FM).

Those being heralded and hawked may be fine technical musicians (mechanics) but they are certainly not great innovator who reach beyond the known dimensions to reach new levels of personal expression. Pleasant but mediocre talents are elevated to positions of royalty in a battle of superlatives that conjure up labels like "Super Sessions." And the irony becomes clearer when Al Kooper announces on stage that "we're just a bunch of friends getting together." How absurd musical judgements get when a New York Times critic says "I called Blood, Sweat, and Tears the best band in the country, but I really believe them to be the best in the world."

Underground Press writers are often more outrageous in their statements. While they offer a positive alternative to the distorted establishment press, most underground papers are colossal dupes of the major record companies (who often keep UPS papers financially afloat with advertising) as they continually talk about the heavily promoted groups while ignoring and refusing to recognize the talent in their own communities. The majority of music columns review only popular records and shows at the Fillmore.

Certainly the Fillmore's bookings

can't be accepted as the standard for musical excellence. Bill Graham has admitted that he is too busy to keep up with the music and relies on the advice of friends like Kooper and Mike Bloomfield. The quality of acts at the Fillmore East is definitely not up to the early days of the San Francisco ballroom. Bill Graham refurbished the Village Theatre which was the site of community benefits, poetry readings, avant garde jazz concerts featuring John Coltrane, Pharoah Sanders, Ornette Coleman, the Ayler Brothers and other new wave musicians in addition to hesting rock and roll shows. Today the only jazz to be heard at Bill Graham's efficiently run theatre (haunted by the ghosts of Rudy Valee and Tom Mix) is that of Buddy Rich — the aging Neru jacketed drummer who plays a music that borrows from the jazz big band sounds of the past and synthesises it with watered down pop of the present. It is the second booking for Rich who becomes the featured attraction this weekend.

Obviously Buddy attempts to cleverly exploit several audiences with his eclectic milk toast music — the youth simply by their familiarity with recent pop hits and adults who like the big band sound of yesteryear. Certainly not the dynamic music of today's youth, it belongs more on Miami Beach — where contemporary shucking of music and entertainment is more appreciated. Graham's only jazz bookings have been the fine mellow avant-garde vibist Gary Burton and second line saxophonist Charles Lloyd many months ago. None of New York's most vital musicians of the new music such as Pharoah, Ornette or Cecil Taylor, who were booked at the Fillmore West are heard here—their home.

While Rich's jazz efforts are being sold at \$3, \$4, and \$5 a head, the brilliant young avant-garde pianist, Burton Greene is playing for no fee this Saturday just so he can be heard. Greene, who often donates his talents free to community benefit concerts will be appearing at 1:00 on Sat. in a solo performance in the auditorium of the Gallery of Modern Art (Huntington Hartford Museum). The only bread he ever got from playing in New York was \$38 from Jazz Interactions for a Sunday afternoon performance at The Scene.

He is a dynamic sound stylist, who will use any part of the piano to achieve the emotional tone that expresses his inner feelings. Columbia Records will be releasing a new Burton Greene album at the end of this month. Other examples of his distinctive style can be heard on ESP Disc for whom he has recorded two albums as well as being featured on recordings by Patty Waters.

The spectacular Jewel Box Revue, one of the most beautiful and exciting shows on the circuit has returned to the Apollo Theatre. Don't miss it.

Atco will release a Cream album in mid-January, aptly called *Goodbye*. It will contain their last three studio recordings and three "live" tracks, plus a large, exclusive, colorful poster of the disbanded group.

Roger Dangerfield, infamous Beatles freak, hosts the weekday morning (7 to noon) show on WFMU-FM (91.1). The Electric Karma featuring rock and roll, dope, and fucking in the street, is aired Saturday and Sunday nights from 8 to midnight.

THE END

Somewhere, lost in the delicate web of obscurities conversation is, is 2001: A SPACE ODYSSEY, trying to simply emerge. For some it was a trip already taken too many times for their pleasure; for others, a trip always to be taken blindfolded because seeing requires too much effort expended. 'Strue, nobody told you the plot in the first five minutes.

Instead, there was a series of puns, all contained within the structured intergalactic framework of just that — the universe — surely the biggest pun of them all. Puns here being defined as one verbalized/visualized difference between reality and appearance and involving a sense of humor, or perspective. 2001 stands as one of the more profound puns for the age, maybe even as an epitomization. It looks for the boundary between life and art, theatre and cinema . . . something just seeing. Life is the continuous process, a somehow interrelated, continual series of information-filled experiences; art is the culmination, the knowledge gained from the information, turned into a summary of the cause/efect. Cinema, or film, or flicks, or moovees — or theatre: they all have scripts, directors, producers, money, sets, actors. Movies have a movie camera, however a third eye which may not see as much as a pineal gland but certainly alters the kind of suspension of disbelief necessary. There is no stage to create the metaphorical framework, and a screen is somehow not the same. The screen's existential framework is and has always been that world out there — it was born as godchild to all the other accepted art forms, a child of this age, into a world nearly capable of sending men to the moon and yet still blithely allowing thousands to starve. What do you use to convey the mystery? People wink as easily from a screen as they ever did from the street, thanks to Godard, Tony Richardson, et al.

In a year which starred LBJ, Hong Kong flu, and Community Night at the Fillmore it isn't really a surprise that *The Lion in Winter* was voted best picture by the NY Film Critics. Bless their acumen, they all righteously mentioned 2001 quite honorably; what else to do with a film so obviously — ah, different? — from the rest. Big studio, big name, big money, big slick write-ups.*** Obviously (not to be confused with the Warhol flick — or is it?) 'Lion in Winter' was about a normal 20th century family set in merrie oldengland, of course — for that historical touch. One fag, one schmuck, one faceless, greasy throwback — My Three Sons; one daddy who would put it to anything including sheep, and etc: one big family. Identifiable, sort of a pre-neorealist Faces. Primitivo and the Titsqueezers revitalized.

What do you do when the first title is THE DAWN OF MAN, and apes suddenly realize that the source of life — a waterhole — is not big enough for everyone; that a bone held at right-angles in the hand becomes a weapon; that a bone thrown up, up in the air can metamorphose into yet another 'primitive' weapon (or tool); a spaceship; and that almost before the camera eye blinks again to the inside of the ship, one realizes there have been no jump-cuts, we're still there, in the dawn of man's history.

(Everybody tells a story, even if the details are left for each person to fill in, in good old advante-garde, do-it-yourself fashion).

ELFRIEDA RIVERS

Q. You have mentioned in this column that I am permitted to take money for the practice of psychic powers. Is there any magical way to make money? Is it ethical to use one's powers to become rich? J.M.

Dear J.M. — Like most questions on such controversial matters, the answer is both yes and no. In medieval times, many so-called occultists supposedly devoted a lot of their time to pursuing the "Philosopher's Stone" which turns anything one touches to gold. Nobody ever found it, in reality. (And yet the symbolic Philosopher's Stone, which turns all one touches to gold... yes, that is a fact, even though allegorical.)

Most practicing occultists (including Christian Mystics who would be shocked if you told them they were practicing occultism) live by what I was taught to call the Law of Abundance. This means, in effect, that you renounce the desire for needless wealth or riches—but that you are never without those things which you really need. Everybody knows the common story of the minister who lives by faith and when he can't pay the furnace bill for \$27.40 he will discover a check in the mail for exactly \$277.43. Co-incidence? Of course, until it starts happening every time you're in genuine financial trouble. Then you start realizing that you are living by the old law:

"Ask, and it shall be given to you; knock and it shall be opened; seek and ye shall find..."

But it has specific limitations. It works only for things you really need, not just things you want; and especially in our present society, people are too prone to think they need things when they only want them, and when the thing wanted isn't forthcoming, they lose their faith in the Law of Abundance.

It's also true that if it's going to work for you, you have to be willing to be a channel through which it can work for other people. If someone comes to you and says he's hungry, you have to feed him as best you can, even if it means dividing your last cup of rice or your last crust of bread. If you have a car, you have to be willing to use it to give rides to anyone with a real need to move their furniture, get to work, or take their crippled daughter for an airing—or even just thumbing a ride on the highway. If you have two coats, you have to give the extra one to him who has none, or it won't work. In short, you must literally carry out all the corporal works of mercy—feed the hungry, clothe the naked, comfort the afflicted, and all the rest of them. You do exactly as you expect to be done by, and the wheels of the universe make it work. I don't know how, and neither does anyone else, for all their philosophical explanations, but work it does.

I even know of one woman who says that she can use her ESP ability to meet any real financial need by making exactly what she needs at the gambling table. Exactly what she needs, and not one penny more; if she tries to use it to make one penny extra, the gift vanishes and she can't use it again, for a long time.

Ethical considerations aside, it's quite possible to use your mental (or magical, or psychic) powers to be-

come rich, just as it's possible to use them to learn history or mathematics. However, you must pay the price. You've probably seen such books as THE MAGIC OF BELIEVING, THINK AND GROW RICH, or such things, on the bookracks. They work—but very few of them spell out, in no uncertain terms, the price you have to pay for this power. It is not magical; it exploits a little-known, little-understood point of psychology (which is occultism anyhow; what is occultism except the submerged nine-tenths of our mental power?) and many people fail when they try it because they simply cannot pay the price.

The price is simple and can be stated in a few words:

YOU MUST WANT IT LITERALLY MORE THAN ANYTHING ELSE IN THIS WORLD OR THE NEXT.

Which means that you must make it an obsession. Everything you do must be prefaced with the conscious, deliberated thought; "I want money; is this particular act going to contribute positively to my making money?"

This means EVERYTHING.

No exceptions.

If you drink a cup of coffee you must ask yourself; is drinking this particular cup of coffee here and now going to help me get rich? If not, you must not drink it here and now, but find some other place which might, or at least think out how you can do something else which will. For instance, the dedicated young executive who never eats lunch unless he is making a business contact which might be valuable, and gives up the tennis he loves for the golf he detests, because it is easier to make business contacts on the golf courses.

If you keep a pet bird you must ask yourself; will this help me accomplish my goal? and if not, you must get rid of the canary or parakeet and spend the time you would spend in feeding it and listening to its sing, in some pursuit which will help you. If you want to sleep with a girl you must ask the same questions, and if not, drop her until you find one who can help you toward your goal—or go without women until you find such a one, and spend the time and money in your obsession.

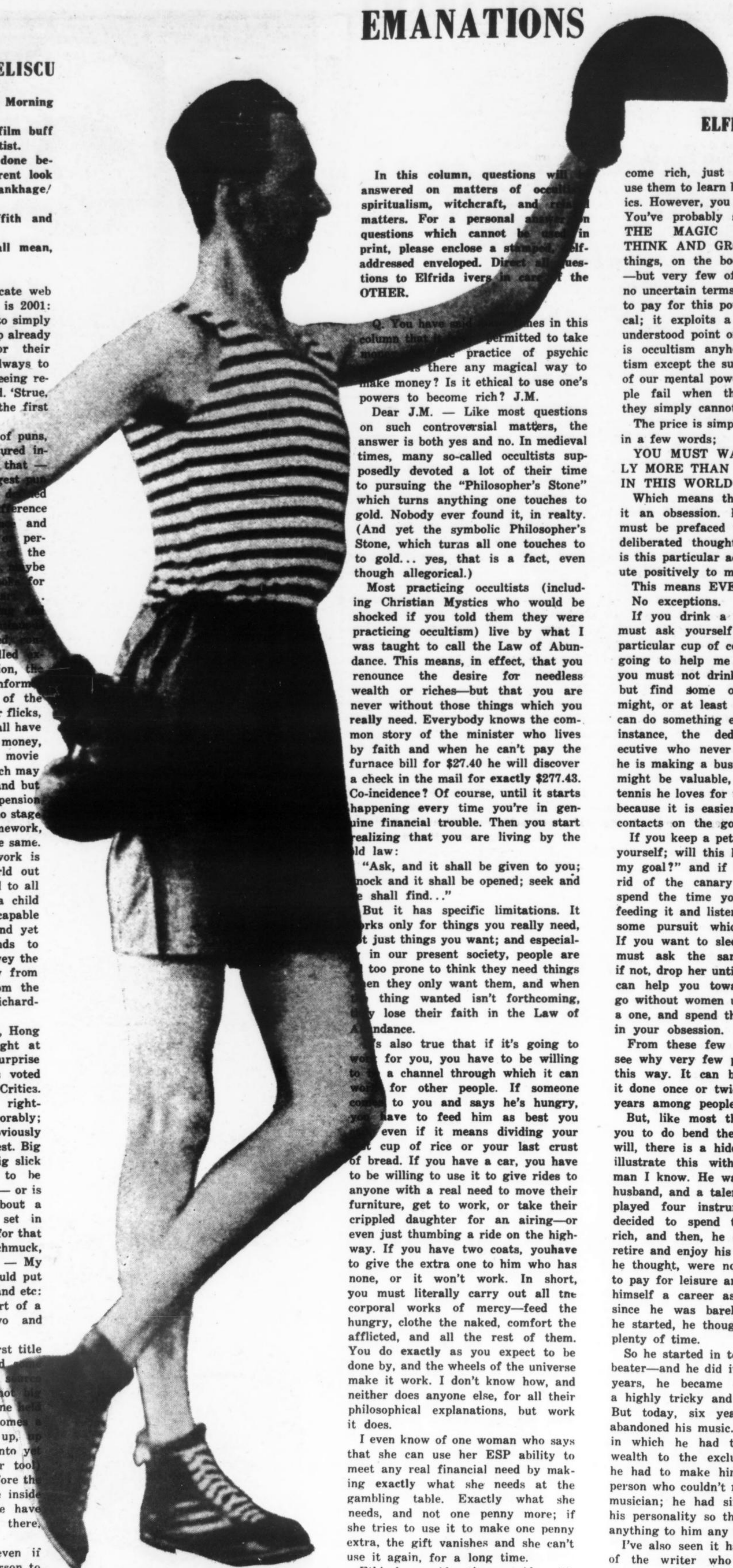
From these few examples you can see why very few people become rich this way. It can be done; I've seen it done once or twice in the last few years among people I know well.

But, like most things which allow you to do bend the universe to your will, there is a hidden joker. Let me illustrate this with the story of a man I know. He was a friend of my husband, and a talented musician who played four instruments. He coldly decided to spend ten years getting rich, and then, he decided, he would retire and enjoy his music. Ten years, he thought, were not too big a price to pay for leisure and wealth to make himself a career as a musician, and since he was barely eighteen when he started, he thought he would have plenty of time.

So he started in to become a world-beater—and he did it. In a scant nine years, he became quite wealthy in a highly tricky and speculative field. But today, six years later—he has abandoned his music. During the years in which he had to concentrate on wealth to the exclusion of all else, he had to make himself the kind of person who couldn't retire to become a musician; he had simply transformed his personality so that nothing meant anything to him any more—but money.

I've also seen it happen in the case of the writer who thinks he'll do movie or TV scripts "To get money to be able to settle down and write what I want to..."

BOOKS

THE RING: Piers Anthony and Robert E. Margroff/Ace Books, 1968.

With the current emphasis on law, order and crime control, this book was probably inevitable—a story of a world several years in the future, where crime control has been turned over to the scientific authorities. Offenses are tried, not by battles between possible unreliable or deluded eyewitnesses and smart lawyers indifferent to the accused's guilt or innocence, but by truth drugs which get dispassionately at the objective facts of what the accused actually did; and those found guilty are condemned to wear the Ring—an unremovable device on finger or toe which ties into something called Ultra Conscience, and administers a painful shock whenever the criminal does, or attempts to do, something antisocial.

Naturally, this brings up huge batches of unanswered and probably unanswerable questions. What about the constitutional right not to incriminate ones-self? What if the Ring-wearing criminal contemplates an action which is technically illegal, but not harmful to anyone, and entirely constructive in current context? For instance; Ring-wearers, in this society, are objects of scorn, abuse and even attack. In one scene in the story, the criminal-hero attempts to protect a friend being attacked by young hoodlums, by using Judo. Ultra Conscience, embodied in the Ring, will not allow him to strike a dangerous or murderous blow—even in self-defense. His friend is therefore murdered by the hoodlums while he lies there incapacitated by repeated doses of agony from the Ring. On another occasion, the hero nearly wrecks his car—because after an accident the Ring prevents him from driving on an illegal ramp of the highway.

It's a well-written and well-pounded treatise on the knotty problems of the rights of the offender versus the possibly conflicting rights of society. However, it seems to reach no answer, mostly because the authors don't seem, in their own mind, quite convinced about which side they're on—in some places they become passionately worked up over the rape of personality involved in this type of objective justice—and in other chapters, they seem to be fumbling toward the conclusion that maybe the Ring is not a bad thing though perhaps the rigidity of Ultra Conscience should be modified to allow for the worst abuses involved. They seem to be content when their hero reaches a satisfactory end to his personal hassle with the Ring.

By doing so, of course, they have evaded the necessity of thinking their premises to their fully logical conclusions and committing themselves to a stand about them. This also reflects the modern, and quite valid, moral position that there are no definite answers to such questions, and that the best any man—or any writer—can do is to arrive at tentative ones to guide his conduct. But it gives an odd, shifting, and inconclusive feel to the book, as if the writers didn't quite know what they were trying to do in writing it—and when that happens, the cynical reader may suspect that all they were trying to do was to make a buck. Which is too bad, because the book is enjoyable and readable, and the authors deserve an E for effort in tackling a probably insoluble problem.

THE TWO TIMERS Bob Shaw. Ace Books.

A novel about time travel starts out under a major handicap these days; for many years, travel in time was such a favorite gimmick of the

pulp magazines that almost every conceivable angle, gimmick and paradox was explored to the outer limits of absurdity. The thoughtful editor—not to mention the harried reader—finally got so fed up that time-travel became something not quite respectable; a hook on which to hang all sorts of I'm-my-own-grandpa jokes, or at best a sort of super matter-transmitter to get the Hero out of his own time and place so that he could have some interesting adventures.

One would have thought it was quite impossible to write a novel in which time-travel was a major concern, not merely a trimming, and say anything new and interesting. And yet Bob Shaw seems to have done it.

The theme is not entirely original. A man—John Breton allows his wife to go to her death following a quarrel. In guilt and remorse, he dedicates his life to inventing time-travel to go back and wipe out his mistake—and when he manages it, he finds himself in another probability world where the murder never happened, and his double is living, and has been living for the past eight years, with his wife. Problem: which of them is the real John Breton, and which of them gets the wife?

Stated like that, it sounds like a not-too-compelling plot for a thriller. What Bob Shaw does is to plunge the reader into an intense, gripping story, not of the technical problems of time-travel, but what it would feel like to be one of those John Bretons—confronted with a double who literally is himself, and engaged in a tense, personal and very realistic battle with a doppelganger.

And after all, the purpose of science fiction is less to explore technical gimmicks than to have the experience of living strange lives in strange worlds. This one achieves it about as well as any book of its type. Entertainment—but of a very high order.

THE WITCHFINDERS. Ralph Comer. Award Books (New York) Tandem Books (London).

Time travel, in science fiction, is a chancy and overdone gimmick relying far too often on tired paradoxes; but it has always been a valid tool of fantasy, where after all nothing is barred and no "scientific" explanations need be given or rationalized. A fantasy, by definition, is a construct of a world where the ordinary laws of cause and effect don't need to work.

This one is billed as a novel of "Gothic Horror" but the title seems misleading. The term "Gothic" usually refers to a dark, gloomy, sinister world full of strange and unknown dangers. A book whose first four chapters deal with a London reporter on holiday, flying gliders and trying to find out why an inexplicable down-draft over an otherwise innocuous spot continually crashes them, hardly seems promising material for a Gothic novel. The plot thickens when he finds that the strange house nearby, where he is interviewing the owner, has a haunted room filled with mysteriously obscene pictures which do not register on his camera, and when he tries to photograph them, project him pell-mell into a world full of horrors and rotten smells.

So far, it reads like a valid ghost-hunter novel. The author, however, eager to cram everything possible into the narrow compass of his novel, adds a local witch-coven, a beautiful girl who is either Innocent and Trapped, or else Evil and Malicious—and time-travel back to an era where they had both been the prey of the local witch-hunters. In skillful hands this could have been a good evening's entertainment, but the pathetic situation, the flat characters, and above all, the mish-mosh of fantasy, witchcraft, detective work, and especially the phony attempts to fake a pseudo-scientific ex-

This isn't meant to be a total recount of My Explanation of 2001 — there's no excuse for ruining the film for anyone else by overriding in the saddle and trying to legally define the movie in this column. Everyone has favorite moments, and mine was the opening sequence. Kubrick goes on, however, to play with more and more devastating puns, and maybe it is fair to wonder if the real stars of the movie aren't the stars themselves (yeah, yeah, stars of stage and screen, playing Themselves). As far as the too-much-expounded light trip: it stands there, and nobody else has done it, not **Relativity**, nor **LSD** (by Belson) nor your best friend who is an avant-garde filmmaker. The trip isn't meant to be taken twice; if you ever remember trying to recapture certain early memories in your head, you know that the initial freshness is never there again (vid. Intimations of Immortality) because you've been there before.

And this isn't the column to go into any depth of the whys, of why a particular scene's film technique seemed impressive, or fantastic or just worked, visually; there are just flashes: the specepod hanging off the nose of the large spaceship: A silver minnow flashing in front of Moby Dick. The opening sequence where slide after slide of that first Great Desert come clicking by, and you just know Who is holding the camera . . .

Other movies try to tell the story of a family, or of a people, or of a sensation; this movie tried to understand a whole mechanical age, the final pun being that it took so many machines to create the film.

Stepping over my toes again. I went to see BB King (you think I go to movies for pleasure?) and Winters and Reid this weekend, shake rattle and roll, and the show was almost as much fun as the NY Free Press Benefit which starred Mailer, Mingus and others (the Fugs did a beautiful follow-act to Peter Yarrow. The contrast was almost too high-color).

Next week being another week, a comparison in greater depth, relating all this music and shit to theatre (and even I don't know how, yet) will be presented. As it is, I got some **Mink and Pearls Bath Oil** capsules the other day (which seems closely enough related to BB King to be included in the same paragraph) and they're lots of fun; you just throw a handful of these little pearls into your bath oil and jump in that tub, and when you came out, you're silky and sheeny just like a mink should be. The smell is greatly improved however, if you have ever been near a live mink and happen to be wondering about this version. The best story, apocryphal in nature, to relate right now is about a friend of mine who told me his chickie sent him presents while he was in the army, including a box or white, marshmallow-sized candy drops which he ate. He wrote her, asking the name of the candy: it was bubble bath capsules.

The moral is: bath capsules have more uses than one way to skin a cat.

Truffaut's newest movie, **Stolen Kisses**, is a brilliant film, personal & sensitive, and yet with enough perspective to carry off the most absurd and pathetic scenes with inimitable grace. Jean-Pierre Léaud plays a young man, fresh out of the army with a mental discharge, back home and trying to pick up pieces of his life in snatches, moments stolen out of the whole framework and made visible on the screen: his true love, his older-woman infatuation, his various jobs. All is portrayed as part of the same 2-dimensional tapestry, full of idiotic, Truffaut moments in which Our Hero once again fumbles and fails miserably. Left alone with his great infatuation, Mmme. Tabard, she

makes subtle advances . . . then less subtle ones . . . as he looks up and barely whispers, "Oui, monsieur."

Truffaut has remarkably discovered the never-there line between absurdity and possibility, a line dodged through with pockets of life's real, overwhelming sentimentality and ridiculous situations. Léaud and a friend discuss Fun with Tall Girls, and he asks if there is anything special to know how to do . . . No . . . Not even for a really tall girl? . . . No — look professional . . . Cut: Jean-Pierre walking, collar turned up, hands in pockets, head up, next to the biggest, blondest Amazon on highheels ever seen, as she teeters next to him, all seen from the back until they round a corner: Skeeze and the Watermelon Lady.

Et cetera . . . The movie is a compilation of just such diverse yet oddly related memory-moments . . . It isn't released yet, but will be soon.

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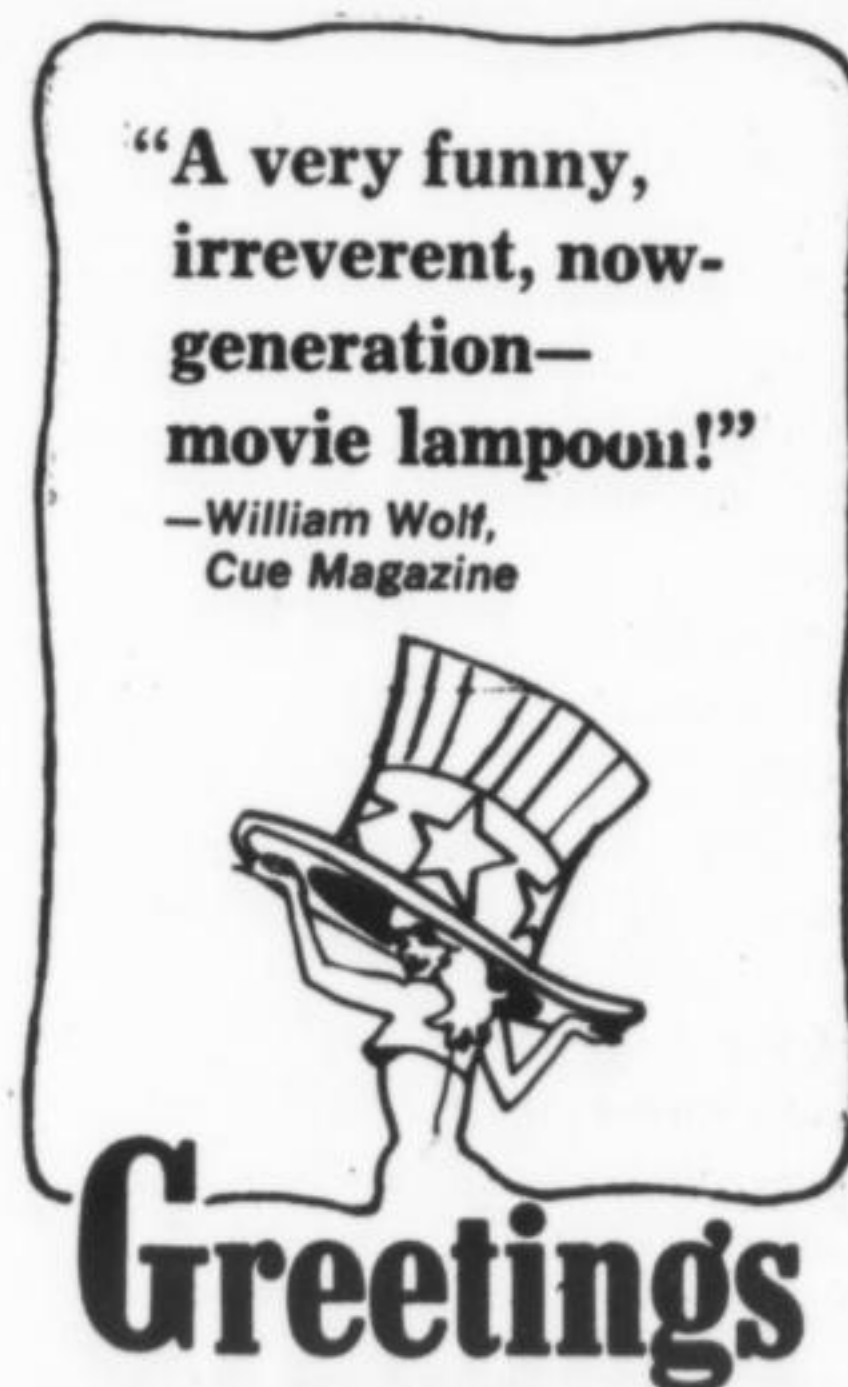

Dear EVO,

Eldridge Cleaver, Minister of Information of the Black Panther Party, former Presidential candidate, author of *Soul On Ice* and Senior Editor of *Ramparts* magazine, has been forced into becoming a fugitive from political persecution at the hands of the Adult Authority of the State of California—a group of political appointees, unqualified to control the lives of prison parolees and acting on behalf of the Reagan State Administration.

The process which resulted in Cleaver's flight from oppression began at 3 a.m., April 6, 1968, when the Adult Authority (in a series of telephone conversations) prejudged Cleaver guilty of charges for which he was not scheduled to face trial until December 21, 1968, and summarily returned him to prison without due process of law, without having conducted a hearing of any kind and with a bullet in his leg. The Adult Authority's action was "officially" prompted by Cleaver's alleged part in an alleged shootout between members of the Black Panther Party and the Oakland Police Department.

Thus Cleaver, who had previously been referred to as "a model parolee" by the Adult Authority's own staff, was deprived of his parole and held in Vacaville Prison until June, 1968. At that time, Judge Raymond Sherwin of the Solano (Calif.) Superior Court ordered that Cleaver's parole be re-instated and that he be released from prison. Judge Sherwin based this ruling on grounds that Cleaver had been imprisoned because of his political beliefs.

The State then demanded an outrageously high bail bond of \$50,000. The Black Panther Party paid \$5,000, but in addition to the cash fee, the bondsman required that six people sign a surety bond, guaranteeing the \$50,000. The signatories to this letter are five of the six who signed that bond, because we believed then that Eldridge Cleaver was a political prisoner, as we believe now that he is a political fugitive.

Cleaver was completely willing to stand trial for the alleged shoot-out, for he was certain, as we were, that his innocence would be demonstrated at the trial.

However, the Adult Authority, which was not to be thwarted, managed to make it impossible for Cleaver to stand trial—from the minute he walked out of Vacaville, the Authority launched a determined campaign to get Cleaver back into prison, still attempting to suspend his parole on the basis of charges for which he had not even been tried. In so doing, the Authority was demonstrating to every parolee in California that they have no rights of any kind and that they can be returned to prison at the whim of the Adult Authority.

Indeed, even if it had been possible for Cleaver to stand trial for the alleged shoot-out and he had been completely exonerated of all charges, the Adult Authority had the power to revoke Cleaver's parole and return him to prison for four more years. We are convinced that the Authority would have done this, and that they would have done so simply because Cleaver is one of the most articulate and militant spokesmen for the rights of black people in America.

Cleaver, then, was faced with the almost inevitable prospect of another four years in jail, regardless of the outcome of his trial and he was convinced from past experience that he faced the gravest risk of being killed in prison because of his politics. He therefore decided to forfeit bail on the pending trial, rather than obey the Adult Authority's dictum to return to prison last November.

We respect his judgment and his right to remain alive. We have no regrets about his action. We accept our responsibility for the ransom payment. To all who believe in freedom, including freedom for those with whom they disagree, Eldridge Cleaver's life is worth much more than \$50,000. We now ask those people to share the financial burden.

QUESTION: Can you tell me if a marijuana cigarette contains tar and nicotine and, if so, would smoking through a waterpipe decrease the amount inhaled?

ANSWER: There is no nicotine (that dangerous drug) contained in marijuana. When marijuana is smoked tars are produced but nothing is known about their potential harm. It is said that the effect of smoking through a waterpipe mainly cools the smoke produced. However, if water-soluble components are removed, the composition of inhaled smoke from a water pipe will be different than from a joint. Some dope fiends believe there is a definite difference between the effect produced by smoking marijuana in a water pipe and a joint.

QUESTION: When we go to an M. D. we are supposed to take their words as gospel, yet they differ greatly on such things as pot, fluoridation of water, giving birth in a semi-sleeping state, hormones during menopause, etc. Cannot a patient after studying the two sides of a controversy demand the treatment he chooses if he signs a waiver?

ANSWER: One reason physicians differ greatly in their opinion of certain subjects is because often definitive answers are not yet known. The practice of medicine is neither an art nor a science, but a blend of the two. A patient cannot demand a treatment from a physician because he need not treat anyone. Few lay people have the necessary medical background and information to decide which kind of treatment is required. Only yesterday a girl asked me to write a prescription for a drug to relieve the discomfort caused by a bladder infection. When I asked if she had a recent urinalysis and visit to her physician, she wanted to wait until the symptoms disappeared.

QUESTION: What is your opinion of macrobiotics? Can the body create all the necessary proteins and vitamins from whole grains?

ANSWER: Several reports have appeared in medical journals, however, which tell of mal-nourished individuals who have followed macrobiotic diets to the extreme. The body is capable of manufacturing certain vitamins but it cannot produce proteins and all vitamins from whole grains. For example, Vitamin C, or ascorbic acid, cannot be stored in the body and a diet deficient in this vitamin will result in scurvy.

QUESTION: I am enclosing an article from the *East Village Other* about a "memory drug" called magnesium pemoline (Cylert). Could you tell me more about the permanent effects of this drug and if it really works? P.S. If it's really ok, where can you get it?

ANSWER: Preliminary research indicates that magnesium pemoline does improve mem-

ory when taken over a period of weeks. This is still an experimental drug which is not yet available for prescription.

QUESTION: At what time during her monthly cycle can a girl get pregnant, and what times, if any are safe?

ANSWER: Because of individual variations in ovulation, pregnancy may occur at any time during the menstrual cycle, including menstruation. Chances for pregnancy are reduced if intercourse occurs a week prior to the menstrual period and for five days following, assuming a 28-day cycle. But unless you are prepared for pregnancy, don't play Vatican roulette.

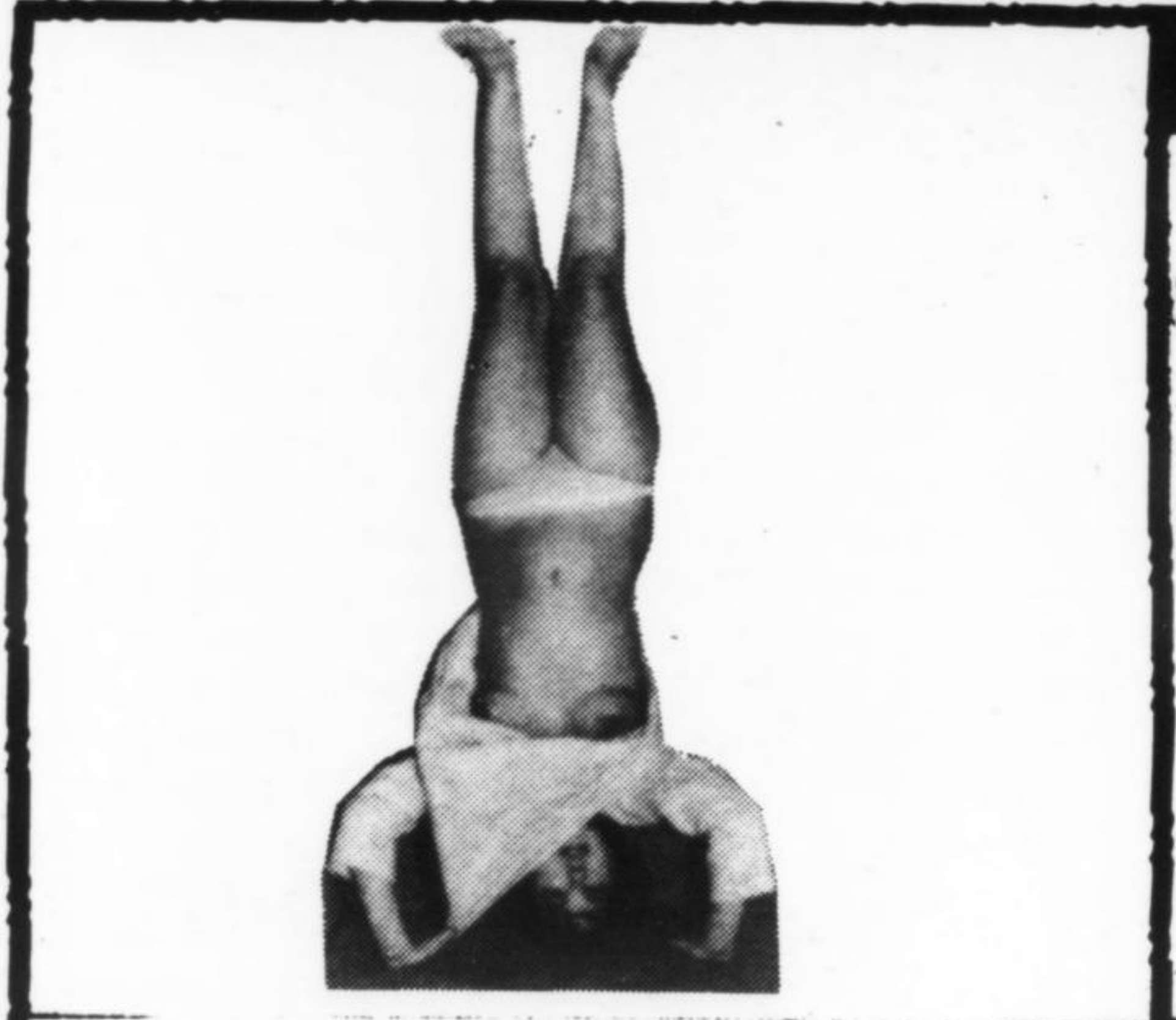

takes to be a real big-time pro football quarterback.

"People might think I've matured," Namath told a *Times* writer on the plane to Miami, "but that's because we're winning." Now, Namath has two ridiculously decrepit knees, constantly under surgery, perpetually on the verge of sudden necrosis — after he said that, a lot of sportswriters wanted to see Bubba Smith get at those knees and send them patellum by patellum back to Beaver Falls.

Bubba Smith is the 6'7" 300-pound Baltimore lineman who moves like Rudolph Nureyev. With Billy Ray Smith and Fred Miller, he is supposed to teleport into the very riches of loudmouth quarterbacks and eat them whole, bones and teeth. And they got John Mackey running for them on legs like wharf pilings — and Earl Morrall at quarterback — and these are all NFL pros, understand. Next to the Colts, Namath and Sample and Snell and even Boozar, they were supposed to look like grade school kids at a 4-H touch scrimmage.

Namath kept "popping off" the whole week before the game. It looked as if he was actually embellishing the myth: the crazy young hooligan who smears the name of the whole town with his carryings-on, and who is finally tromped by the noble quiet ole crewcut blacksmith who straps on his old guns especially for this occasion. Namath told Lou Michaels, Colt split end, that the Jets were going to win; this happened in a bar with women and liquor around, and it was just a horrible thing. Poor Earl Morrall, earlier Namath had said there were our AFL quarterbacks — including J. Namath — who were better than Morrall. While this last turned out to be an underestimation, probably put his life in jeopardy.

Morrall suffered this abuse in modest silence, but Billy Ray Smith was moved to declare, "Little Bubba and Mike gets his ribs, but I get his teeth. Gonna teach that boy some humil-

ity." Nobody mentioned Joe's knees, since there are laws against attacking a cripple with malice aforethought. As Sunday came up, people were hedging bets on how long Namath would stay in the hospital after the Colt front four got to him.

You could have set yourself up for life if you'd been crazy enough to bet on the Jets: the Colt four never got to Namath, he was touched exactly twice all the game long, and missed two brief plays with a jammed thumb. It seems that what the Jets got instead of Machinery is something closer to Love: the Jets offense is so good at protecting Namath that he just has all the time in the world to trot back & look for Sauer or Maynard or Snell. And since any one of these three can outspurt anybody in the NFL, well . . . The final score was 16-7, favour of the Jets. Snell touched down in the second and Turner (magic foot, magic) kicked three field goals.

"Seventeen-point favourites," Namath whistled after the game. "JEE-EE-ZUS KRIEST!" No, a Bart Starr he is not.

And Earl Morrall? He threw enough passes to qualify for any old Mickey Mouse team, seventeen of them. Six of these found their intended receivers, eight went astray, and three were intercepted in or near the end zone, where touchdowns are supposed to happen.

But no touchdowns at all happened for Earl Morrall, so he was yanked back to the bench late in the third and Johnny Unitas put his Slinky Toy to work. The arm is quite gone on Unitas, it appears — he threw 24 passes in 20 minutes, connected for eleven of them, and racked up seven points by dint of utter panic. Around the end of the third, the defending champs of the NFL pro-dynasty waxed belligerent: at one point, when Matt Snell ran the ball out across the sidelines near the Baltimore bench, a benched Colt player clipped him up side the haid with a spare helmet. Later on, after intercepting a pass to Jimmy Orr, Sample whopped Orr over the helmet with the ball. That last one hurt.

It was a painful game, and afterwards the

Colts sounded pretty bunged up. "We weren't flat," said Mackey, he of the wharf pilings. "We had a helluva lot of opportunities and we didn't make them," said he. "The Jets won the game," he said, "but I don't feel — aw, hell, I won't say it." Other Colts corroborated his sentiments. Johnny Unitas blamed it on God.

Over in the Jets dressing room, somebody asked Namath how he felt about the demolition of Earl Morrall and his myth. "Better him than me," said Joe. Put fifteen grand in their ears and the Jets'll follow you anywhere — right across the whole damn National Football League.

YEAR STARTS RIGHT

Now I think that was a wonderful way to start a year, especially in Miami. A sports analyst/mythmaker I am not, but here is my interpretation of the significance of this fractured fable: Earl Morrall is a competent quarterback, nothing more; the Colts had their Machine tuned to the point where practically anybody could fill the QB slot, so long as he was middling competent. The Jets, on the other hand, are superb, magic: Namath has skill that transcends even his chutzpah, and the other guys really dig him, and each other, and just football for the hell of it. Namath has the brains to pick apart a sophisticated but mechanical zone defense like Baltimore's, and the New York defense has perfected the art of razzle-dazzle to the point, for example, where they can always intercept merely competent passes any time they really have to. The entire spectacle, to my mind, was poetry beyond verse. Anyway, they won.

And after they won, significantly enough, Nelson Rockefeller sent a best-wishes telegram to Spiro Agnew, and it read succinctly: **BETTER LUCK NEXT TIME, TED.** Nellie's a Republican, understand. Myself, with **NEXT TIME** in mind, I have to ask is there a Joe Namath in the House? In the Senate? Out on the Streets, maybe? Somewhere in this myth-forsaken country there's got to be a Joe Namath, or Miami may claim all of us.
