It sounds incredible, but the first really major act to be taken under the Nixon Administration may be the extension of voting suffrage to people between 18 and 21. It is not known right now what President Nixon and Vice President (you should pardon the expression) Spiro Agnew personally feel about this question, but it's obvious that an extremely persuasive groundswell exists in this country, and in Congress, toward the passage of such legislation. The prosperity and popularity of LUV (Let Us Vote), the all-student suffrage lobby with headquarters at the University of the Pacific in California, certainly signifies that support of such measures exists in impressive magnitude. Here is the way LUV got afloat.

In mid-December Senator Birch Bayh paid a visit to the University of the Pacific in Stockton, California, as part of a lecture tour. Presumably moved by the healthy intellectual atmosphere at UOP, Sen Bayh appealed for students to organize for two purposes: to lower the voting age to 18 and to abolish, or at least drastically restructure, the electoral college. Of the two proposals, he conjectured that the suffrage extension would be more difficult: "Some of my colleagues in the Senate just don't trust young people to do anything but go overseas and fight for them," he complained.

Perhaps it was something in his presentation, but a number of UOP students took this as a challenge, and LUV was born overnight.

Dennis Warren, a 20-year-old junior, accompanied Sen. Bayh to an appearance on the Joey Bishop Show, out of Los Angeles, on 20 December. Bishop himself received them warmly, agreed to plug the campaign regularly as long as it kept going, and was quickly named Honorary Chairman of LUV.

The University of the Pacific happily agreed to provide LUV with space and accommodations for the campaign. Warren's staff began contacting other schools and colleges, and within a week had received replies from 90 educational institutions in 31 states. From places like New York City College and Texas A&M, LUV received replies from Young Democrats, Young Republicans, Student Body Presidents and other campus political organizations. As the campaign continued, the amount of favourable mail received grew by geometrical progression, and the negative mail was minimal—about one anti-suffrage letter per week.

Public appearances by Warren—who is kind of handsome and articulate, in an extremely Ivy League sort of way—also proliferated. Besides the Joey Bishop show, he has spoken over numerous West Coast radio talk shows, and has been booked on the Joe Pyne Television Shop and—it was inevitable—the "Dating Game". On 6 January, he brought Joey Bishop to Stockton for a special television show to open the national LUV campaign. Three days later the Stockton Civic Auditorium was opened for a monster LUV rally, emceed by Bishop

and Warren: attending this rally in support of LUV were Mrs Elizabeth Koontz, president of the National Education Association; Eddie LeBaron, the retired quarterback, now director of the Vice President's Summer Youth Sports and Recreation Program; and former Senator William F. Knowland, publisher of the Oakland Tribune.

All this publicity is by way of promoting the campaign, according to Warren, who so far has received two offers of dates and an offer of marriage by way of the publicity. "We are not ourselves going to establish offices or chapters at colleges and universities throughout the country," he insists, "but we've gotten support from students at those colleges and we are helping them to carry on this campaign." To date, LUV chapters have been inaugurated at some 300 high schools and over a thousand institutions of higher learning, and LUV headquarters at Stockton has been swamped with favourable mail. Warren will use the mail to demonstrate support for LUV's proposals when hearings open in Congress on 18-year-old suffrage later this year.

LUV seems to have just about everything going for it. Joey Bishop is personally enlisting support from the show biz racket, and reports astonishedly that he has received absolutely no adverse mail at all concerning his ballyhoo for LUV. Also, a 45-rpm record will be produced next month by Boyce and Hart, the guys who synthesized the Monkees, called LUV.

HUAC ANNOUNCES ATTACK ON SDS

The youngest HUAC chairman ever, Rep. Richard H. Ichord (D. Mo.), 42, announced recently that SDS will be the first order of business this year. ". . . in view of the information that has been made public of the increasingly militant nature of the SDS — its conducting classes in sabotage, how to make molotov cocktails, and its teaching violent guerrilla tactics."

The investigation of SDS will follow the abortive hearings on Chicago held during October and December. During those hearings, Tom Hayden was generally taken as representing SDS. The new announcement suggests that Ichord has staked out his own key role for the new Law and Order administration, relying largely on the end of the year FBI reports on SDS. In addition HUAC has been compiling dossiers and "evidence" against the organization during the past year.

Although his announcement did not specify open hearings, Ichord did state his intention to call fewer "disruptive" witnesses (Rubin, Hoffman).

Timed with this announcement was the nationally syndicated Drew Pearson and Jack Anderson story of a nation-wide communist conspiracy behind the black student revolts at Brandeis, Swarthmore, Pembroke, etc.

OAKLAND SEVEN TRIAL: COLOR THE JURY GREY

OAKLAND, Calif. (LNS) — Contrary to what Perry Mason and Hamilton Burger would have us believe, the inside of a courtroom is usually a pretty dull place, even when there are seven defendants to share the punch lines.

The trial of the Oakland Seven — the activists who helped organize Stop the Draft Week demonstrations at the Oakland Induction Center last year — is now in the second week and so far no one has landed a punch except for the policemen who split open Stu Albert's head in the courthouse lobby.

The opening rounds have been spent in jury selection. And if eternal vigilance is the price of liberty, liberty is in jeopardy indeed—for the prospective jurors, almost to a man, have been passionless creatures who report themselves unaffected by the issues that are tearing the country apart.

There is a certain logic to the court proceedings which makes this appear perhaps even more true than it is. Jurors, like academics, have somehow inhibited the American notion that it is important to be "objective" and "value-free," no one will confess himself a partisan on any issue, let alone a bigot or even a very active patriot.

It is important for the defense to uncover the jurors' latent attitudes toward issues that will be crucial in the case: the war, race, "people with bears," individual responsibility to attempt to end a brutalizing war. But what the lawyers get in response to their questions is a grey neutrality. The jurors say that they have no opinions, no biases, not even any information.

There are occasional exceptions. One man attempted to confess he might be prejudiced in favor of the war. Another proudly identified himself as opposed. "I couldn't condemn these men," he said, and was promptly struck from the jury list.

The jurors interrogated so far have been a slice of the life of Alameda County, and a depressing slice it is. About 2/3 of them work in the defense-related enterprises that keep the county going.

There have been a sprinkling of blacks whose government connections are limited to Social Security and the Post Office, but these are all in the process of getting thrown off the jury by prosecutor Lowell Jensen who fears Defense attorney Charles Garry's local reputation as chief defender of the Black Panthers.

The Seven themselves have had some troubles this week deciding on what basis to place their defense. Garry's line is "We shouldn't prosecute them, we should pin a medal on them." But some of the defendants are uncomfortable with the "We were only trying to save democracy" theme and would like to see a more radical affirmation of their views and motives. How successful their attempt to give the public a radical education might be is open to question.

AFTER 42 YEARS: WORLD WAR ONE RESISTERS FREED

PHOENIX, Ariz. (LNS)—The Arizona Board of Pardons and Paroles recently voted unanimously to recommend pardons for John and Tom Power. The pair were draft resisters during World War One and shot three members of a posse which came to get them in 1918.

They shot a sheriff and two deputies in a gun battle in Rattlesnake Canyon, but later surrendered to U. S. Cavalry troops.

Each served 42 years; they were paroled in 1960. Their ages are 77 and 79 respectively.

CIA FEARS CUBA

NEW YORK (LNS) — CIA agents have been told recently to shun flights to Florida. The CIA fears what would happen if any agents were inadvertently hijacked to Cuba, according to a report published in the Jan. 18 issue of Business Week.

GRADUATE STUDENT BEATS THE DRAFT

AUSTIN, Texas. — A University of Texas law student has won a federal injunction against Selective Service Director Lewis B. Hershey and the El Paso draft board stopping them from drafting him in the middle of his academic year.

The decision, which can have far-reaching effects on graduate students throughout the nation, said that Albert Armendariz had the statutory right to complete school year.

Armendariz brought the suit before Judge Jack Roberts of the District Court, and said it was presented on his behalf as well as for other graduate students. But the judge said the ruling applied only to the plaintiff and not to all such students "except in so far as it may be a necessity."

DEPT. OF PEACE SOUGHT FOR U.S.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — The creation of a Department of Peace, combining five existing federal agencies, has been proposed in a bill sponsored by Senate Majority Leader Mike Mansfield.

A similar bill was proposed last year by Sen. Vance Hartke, Dem. of Indiana, who solicited and won the co-sponsorship of Mansfield.

The bill would give the new department full cabinet status and would establish an international institute of peace under the new department.

SAIPAN BANS TYPHOON PHYLLIS

SAIPAN, Trust Territories. — The Micronesian Congress, fearful of the impending threat of typhoon Phyllis, passed a resolution banning the storm from Saipan.

The Congress warned that if the storm hit, US Commissioner William Norwood would bear the "full responsibility."

Shortly afterwards, typhoon Phyllis stopped moving toward Saipan and died out about 240 miles southeast of the Pacific island.

Isn't that marvelous?

SOVIET WARNS US ON LAOS BOMBING

MOSCOW — American bombing along the Ho Chi Minh trail in Laos "by no means creates a favorable atmosphere for the Paris talks," the Soviet Union told the United States this week.

The Russians, who with the British co-chaired the 1962 Geneva conference on Laos, said that the Americans have increased their bomb runs along the road net work which meanders through the jungles from North Vietnam to Laos and into South Vietnam.

Bombing along the trail has been continuous for many years, despite the bombing halts, and the tri-party and weak government of Laos has not raised any serious objections.

Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei A. Gromyko earlier this week issued a statement through Tass, the official news agency, which asserted the US shelled "peaceful settlements" in Laos and dropping canisters of "toxic substances."

Gromyko's remarks were interpreted here as a possible move to force the US to halt the Laos action in exchange for bargains which would be struck at the Paris talks. But another interpretation was that the Russians were merely fulfilling their obligations as the Geneva Conference co-chairmen.

SECRET GOVT. REPORT ON PROTEST POLITICS

WASHINGTON, D.C. (LNS) — The Kerner Report was nearly suppressed and then ignored by the President.

The Walker Report on the "police riot" in Chicago was denounced.

The latest installment of the Great Serial Report is "The Politics of Protest," due for official release in April or May. Like the Walker Report, "The Politics of Protest" has been prepared for the National Commission on the Causes and Prevention of Violence.

Charged by President Johnson after the back-to-back assassinations of Bobby Kennedy and Martin Luther King to investigate "the causes, the occurrence, and the control of physical violence across the Nation, from assassinations to violence in our cities' streets and even in our homes," the National Commission consists of such figures as Congressman Hale Boggs of Louisiana and William McCulloch of Ohio, long-shoreman radical-baiter Eric Offer, Albert Jenner (a Chicago lawyer who served as a member of the U. S. Loyalty Review Board and the Warren Commission) and is chaired by Milton Eisenhower.

In all probability, the Commission had no idea of what it was letting itself in for when it commissioned Univ. of California Prof. Jerome Skolnik to head a task force on "Violent Aspects of Protest and Confrontation" (one of seven Commission task force).

Skolnik's task force, after collecting evidence from radical academics like Herman Blake, Harold Cruse, Tom Hayden and Richard Flacks, as well as conducting extensive interviews with police, student radicals and ghetto residents, has presented the National Commission with a report which goes beyond documentation and specific criticism to a fundamental indictment of the American political system in its present operations.

"The Politics of Protest" differs from the previous reports of innumerable commissions and committees on violence because its authors insist on considering group violence not as abnormal psychology or social malfunction, but as a political phenomenon, and a legitimate one.

"Violence," maintains the task force, "is an ambiguous term whose meaning is established through political processes. Violence . . . is legitimized or illegitimized through political processes and decisions."

The Task Force thus recognizes the existence not only of political violence in protest against the authorities, but of what it terms "official violence" which it deems as important and perhaps even more pervasive than the violence of protest which lies hidden beneath a "myth of peaceful progress."

"Like most ideologies the myth of peaceful progress is intended at bottom to legitimize existing political arrangements and to authorize the suppression of protest. It also serves to conceal the role of official violence in the maintenance of these arrangements."

Starting from this bilateral definition of violence, the Task Force Report attempts to analyze the political roots of both official and anti-official violence. The first chapter, "Protest and Politics," is an extensive investigation of the history of political violence in America.

Violent protests are surveyed from Shay's rebellion to the "native American," anti-immigrant movements to the CIO. The conclusion of the authors is that violence, while not a neces-

sary component of political change in this country, has been a frequent concomitant: "Historical study . . . reveals that under certain circumstances America has regularly experienced episodes of mass violence directly related to the achievement of social, political, and economic goals."

From this conclusion the report moves on to an examination of contemporary political violence, starting with a chapter on "Anti-War Protest." The primary cause of anti-war protest, maintains the Task Force, is "the course of the war itself."

The anti-war protesters have been reacting to events rather than inciting them: "The movement has been and remains in a posture of responding to events outside its control, the chief milestones in its growth have been its days of mass outrage at escalations, bombing resurreptions, draft policies, and prosecutions."

Therefore, concludes the report, the most logical way to deal with anti-war protest is to change the course of the war, "It is safe to say that by now the only effective counter-measure against the bitterness that leads to violence would be a termination of the war in Vietnam."

This conclusion, that the way to handle violence is to deal with political substance rather than individual outbreaks—is reached again in the third chapter on "Student Protest." Student protest is becoming violent, the Report reasons, because students have been consistently frustrated in their basic political aims. If "student violence" is to end, "students must plan a genuine role in decision-making and . . . their interests must receive recognition and at least some power."

Despite the decline in the scope of black rioting in 1968 as compared with the two years previous, the Task Force pulls no punches in stating the seriousness of black rebellion in America. "There is some evidence to suggest that the decline in the scale of riots coincides with an increase in more strategic acts of violence and a shift from mass riots to sporadic warfare."

Unless governmental agencies are willing to consider both the means and the ends of black militants as legitimate and justified, America, predicts the Report, is in for a long siege.

From this radical analysis of the forms of dissent, the Report plunges into a biting survey of "White Racism" and "Official Response."

"The most violent single force in American history has been the militant white, defending his home, his family or his country from forces considered alien or threatening." The report presents a detailed history of white supremacy and vigilante groups right up to the present with armed preparations of the Minutemen, the KKK, the North Ward Citizens Committee of Anthony Imperiale and other white para-military organizations.

In contrast with almost all liberal thinking on the subject, however, the Task Force does not consider right-wing extremism as "hooky" or pathological any more than black militancy. White militancy, like black, is a political and economic source of white marginality and insecurity." Unless the political problems and demands of militant whites are recognized and dealt with, the Task Force concludes, the country is "not improbably headed for a race war between black and white militants."

The Task Force views the police as trapped in the American social sys-

tem by forces beyond their control. "The police are set against the hatred and violence of the ghetto and are delegated to suppress it and keep it from seeping into white areas . . . Similarly, the police can do little to ameliorate the reasons for student and political protest. In short, we have forced the police into the uninhabitable role of acting as substitutes for necessary political and social reform . . . Yet, in the process, the police themselves become a serious social problem."

This is the point at which the Task Force quite abruptly stops. The authors make it clear that they do not regard more firepower and a more efficient repressive apparatus as the answer to violence.

And the solutions of the radical Left are extensively criticized in the same terms as the solutions of the Right. The solution, implies the Task Force, lies in the direction of "massive social reform." "Only if the roots of disorder are attacked can the spiral be reversed and the problem of social control rendered manageable within a democratic framework."

In the mean time, "Little by little," in the words of the authors, "we move toward an armed society which, while not clearly totalitarian, could no longer be said to rest upon the consent of the governed."



WOMEN CONFER ON THEIR STATUS

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. — The United Nations Commission on the Status of Women is now holding its 22nd annual session here with its principle aim being the establishment of an international program advancing the status of the fair sex.

The 32-member commission has the regular function of dealing with problems of discrimination against women, advancement of women and women's rights, including political and economic rights and opportunities, access to education and the status of married women in private law.

The commission is to consider two reports of Secretary General U Thant which are based on surveys he undertook at the request of the Economic and Social Council.

Several proposals are on the meeting's agenda on the question of women's political rights. Today 120 nations have granted women the right to vote in all elections and to hold elective office on an equal footing with men. In three nations, women have these rights on a restricted basis, and seven nations (Jordan, Kuwait, Lichtenstein, the northern region of Nigeria, Saudi Arabia, Switzerland (except six cantons) and Yemen) forbid women voting or holding office.

Other proposals involve guarantees for equal treatment before the law on matters of civil law, the right to a free choice of a spouse, equal rights with men during marriage and at its dissolution; and the right to paid maternity leave. Others call for the prohibition of child marriage and the betrothal of girls before puberty.

STUDENT ACTIONS ROUND THE GLOBE

NEW YORK — Student and anti-student actions reported during the past week have included:

Athens: The junta-backed Greek government has promulgated behavior which forbids disrespect, disloyalty, strikes and demonstrations. All student meetings are now subject to strict controls and propagating ideas which are aimed at overthrowing the prevailing social system is proscribed. Severe penalties await violators.

Nairobi: President Jomo Kenyatta, the former leader of the Mau Mau, ordered Kenya police to shut down Nairobi University after bloody confrontations. Paramilitary units together with police armed with automatic rifles, tear gas grenades, clubs and shields routed the 1,200 students from the campus in a matter of two hours after Kenyatta gave the approval. Foreign students, many without a place to stay, were thrown out of their dorms along with the other students. The protest was sparked by the government's decision to ban opposition leader Oginda Odigas' scheduled speech on the campus. The students have demanded full academic freedom and have pledged that there will be no compromises with the authorities. The university was to have completed the school year in eleven weeks.

LONDON: Students at the London School of Economics went to the University of London's Student Union Building last Monday night and created "a school in exile." The economics school was shut by authorities after a demonstration in which the school's gates were wrecked. The gates had been locked in an effort to block a sit-in. No violence attended the University of London seizure which resulted in some 300 students sleeping in the building. The economics school is scheduled to be reopened late this week.

POLLUTIONS CRISIS AIRED IN PEKING

PEKING — Anna Louise Strong, an American communist who has lived in China for many years, reports in her current issue of "Letter From China," that pollution is now a major crisis in the United States.

"The United States, the richest capitalist nation, is proving incapable of meeting such elemental needs of the people as potable water and fresh air," Miss Strong writes.

Quoting from a report made to the U.S. National Academy of Sciences, she said that 125 million tons of pollutants are being dumped each year into America's atmosphere. (Cars produce about half of this. ed.)

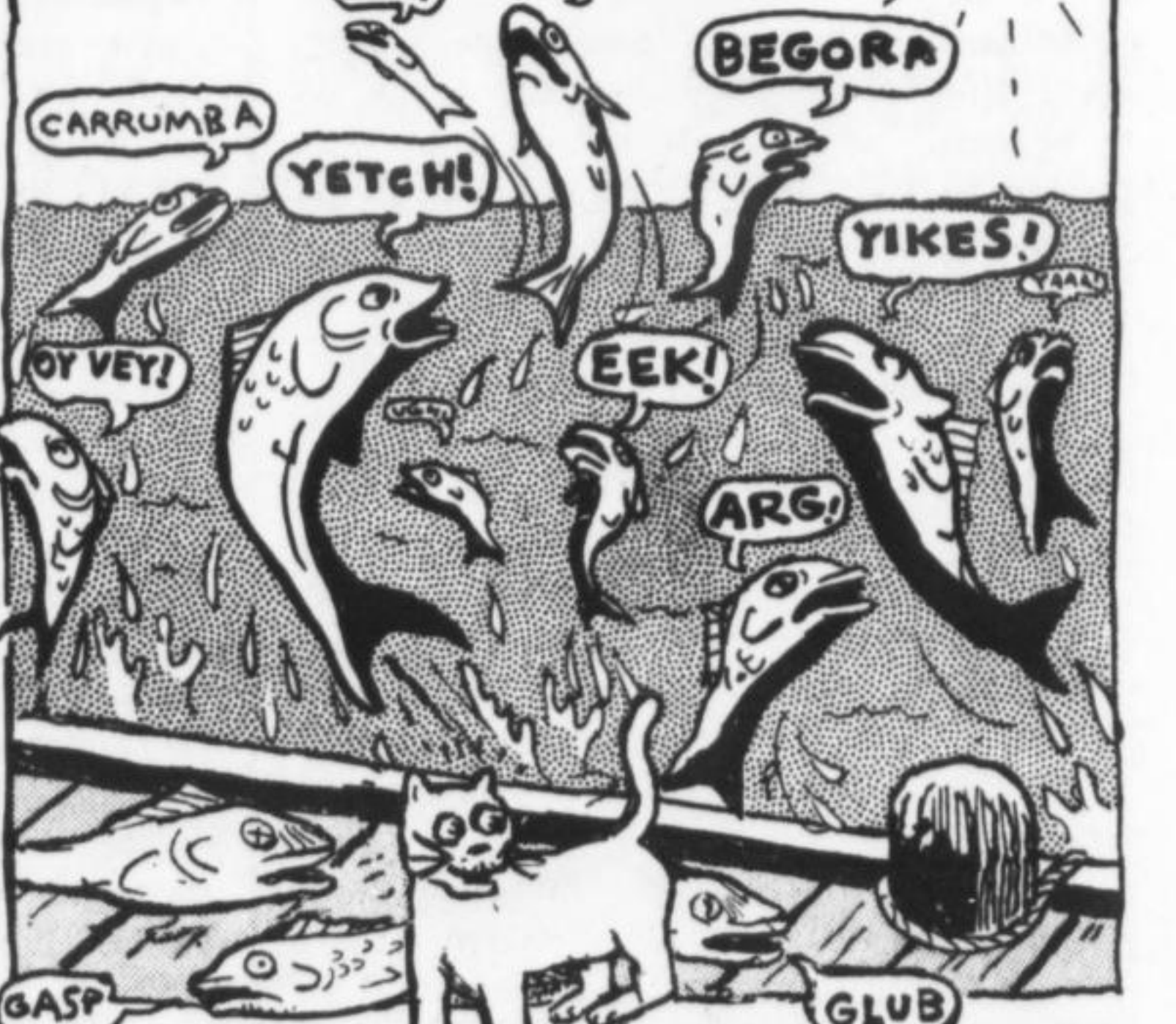
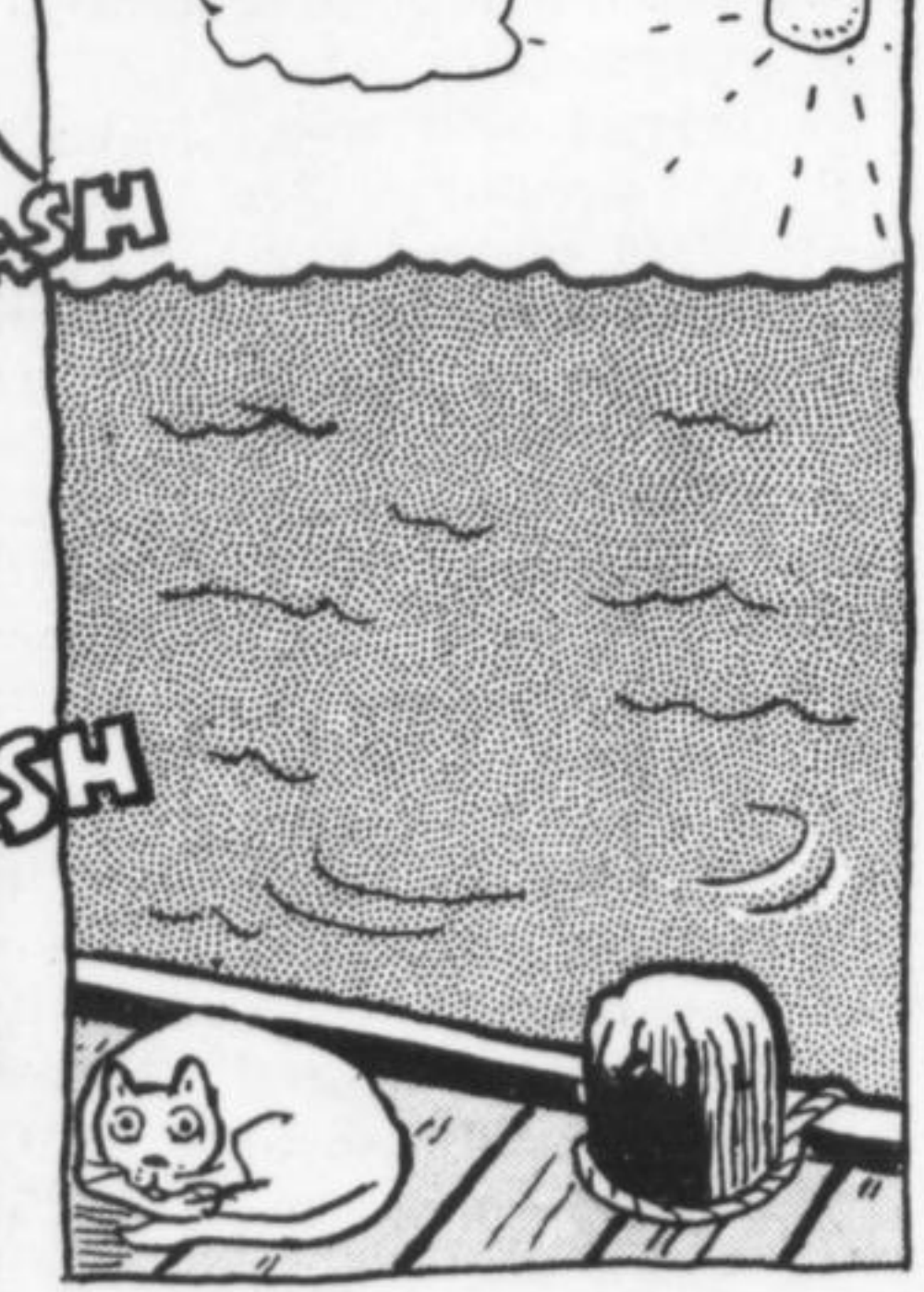
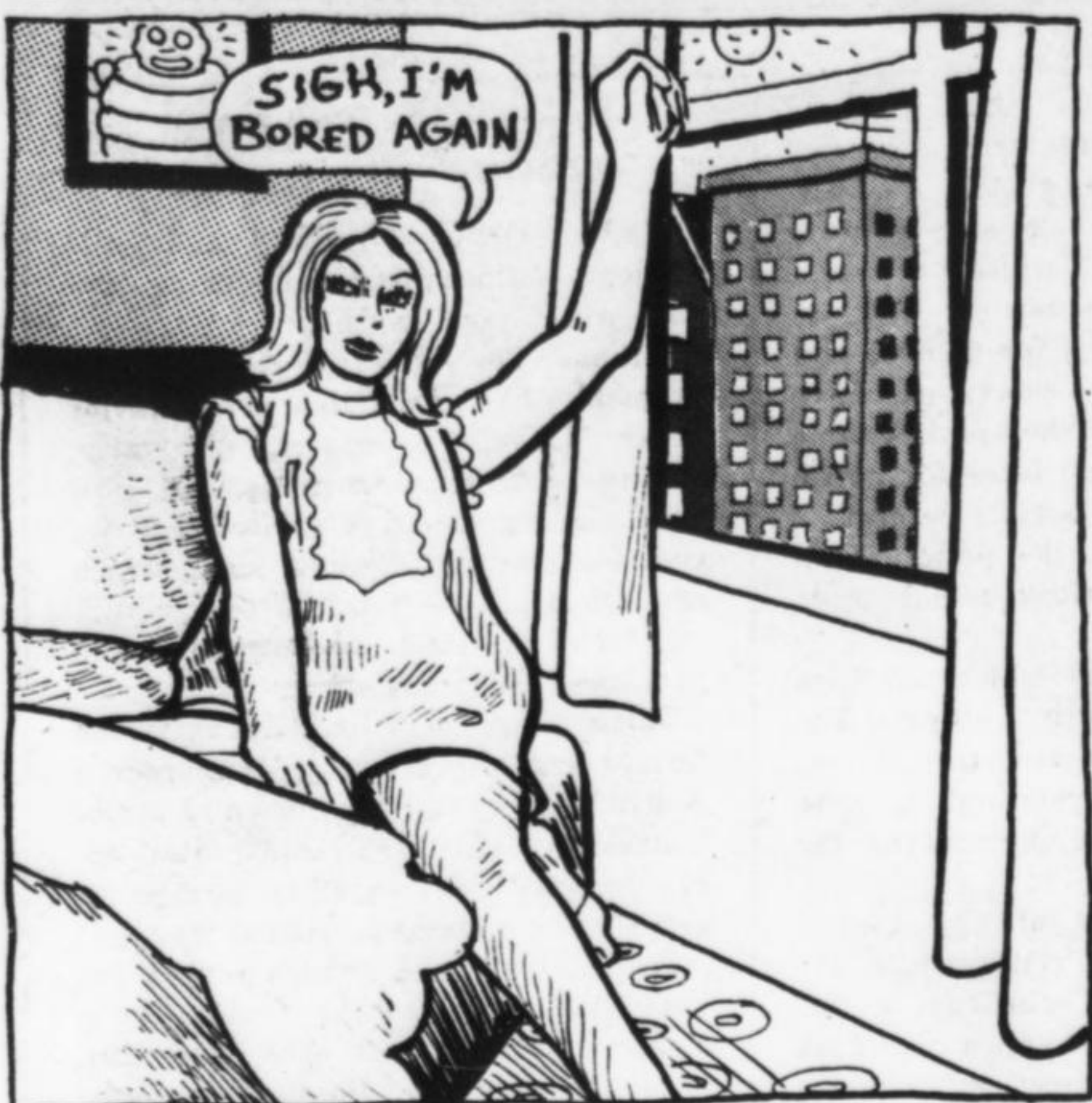
Moreover, at the present rate of increase, it is expected that by 1980 the tonnage will have doubled, and double again in 2000 if people are still around to breathe.

Water pollution, she says, is just as foul as the air. The National Academy warns that if water pollutions continue at their present rate, there will be enough waterborne waste to consume all the oxygen in all the 22 major river systems in the United States. This, if true, would virtually wipe out fish and other marine life.

Meanwhile, it has been found that the American per capita production of indestructible trash (beer cans, bottles, plastic containers) now amounts to 4.5 pounds per person each day. And the rate is increasing.

Maybe Trashman will come to the rescue.

Bunchy Carter and John Huggins —Black Panther Deputy Ministers of Defense and Information, respectively, for Los Angeles—were gunned down last Friday, 17 Jan., in the Campbell Hall lunchroom on the UCLA campus. The murderers were tentatively identified by witnesses as four members of a rival black militant organization called US, headed by Ron Karenga: those identified were two brothers, George and Larry Steiner, and two other members known only by the "African" names they assumed as operatives, for US. Huggins, 23, was shot in the back; Carter, 26, managed to get a shot at his assailant before he died of a .357 magnum bullet wound in the chest. The four accused US assassins fled from the scene before they could be apprehended.

The shooting incident apparently grew out of a political struggle between the Los Angeles Panthers and US over control of the new African-American Studies Center at UCLA. Created by the UCLA administration as a direct response to the student strike at San Francisco State College, the African-American Studies Center provides a \$20,000-salary administrative position for its director, who will preside over Black Studies Programs in every state college in California. Karenga, a graduate of UCLA with an MA in political science, was exerting influence to place himself or someone in his organization in that office; the Panthers were pressuring UCLA Chancellor Young to delegate the office to someone outside of US.

On the Wednesday before the shooting, Karenga had met privately with Young in the Regents' room at UCLA, and it is reported that they reached a tentative agreement between themselves as to the appointment of a US operative as Black Studies Programs administrator. The following afternoon, however, at a meeting of the UCLA Black Student Union, the Panthers prevailed over Young's decision: a new coordinating committee was elected, and the Community Advisory Council was dissolved. The BSU objected that the US candidate for administrator was unqualified — they demanded a Ph.D., and Karenga has only an MA — and chancellor Young yielded.

The next day, Friday, about 150 students met in the Campbell Hall lunchroom to discuss the Black Studies Program, which was now solidly under the control of the Panthers. At the conclusion of this meeting, Huggins and Carter, both students at UCLA, were murdered.

It is charged by the Black Panthers that Karenga's organization works in complicity with the repressive Los Angeles political establishment, particularly the Los Angeles Pig Department. Maulana Ron Karenga himself advocates certain quasi-"African" cultures and disciplines of a mystical nature, and US under his direction proposes that these anachronistic cultures be embraced and practiced by modern black people in their search for a black nationalistic identity. The Black Panthers, who feel they offer an alternative to black movements of this sort of pseudo-Muslim nature, claim that the US program is a waste of black peoples' time and energy — a diversion of black talents, they suggest, into futile activities more acceptable in the sight of the LAPD than black revolution as propounded by the Panthers.

In any case, the first action by the LAPD in this case was to raid the home of Brother Huggins within four hours of the killings, arresting seventeen Panthers, who were attending a meeting there, for illegal possession of firearms and — now get this, fellow Pig watchers — suspicion of conspiracy to commit assault with a deadly weapon. As justification for this precipitate search and seizure, the Pigs claimed that they had probable cause to expect retaliatory actions by the Panthers in response to the murders.

Among those arrested at Brother Huggins' home was his widow, Erika, who had with her ten-day-old baby

girl. It was raining at the time, and a Pig officer refused to allow Sister Erika to wrap the infant in a blanket, forcing her to use her raincoat. Later, at the 77th street precinct station, the baby was searched for marijuana before being taken from her mother: "If we find any dope in this raincoat we'll book the kid for possession," one Pig declared. The infant was released after seven hours into the custody of a US member, who had applied for her with the LAPD.

The next day, while the Panthers were in jail and the murderers were still at large, the Panthers issued a statement charging that the murders were "A political assassination by the US organization. Big white pigs killed Bobby Hutton, little black pork chops killed Bunchy and John. Pork chop nationalism is part and parcel of the Pig power structure." That afternoon Erika Huggins and two other Panthers were released from jail; the other Panthers are still being held in lieu of \$6500 bail per person, as EVO goes contributions should be made out to the Black Panther Party, P.O. Box to press. A bail has been set up, and 3065, Compton, Calif. 90223.

The following Monday, George Steiner, 22, surrendered himself to the LAPD on the advice of his lawyer. His brother Larry, 21, surrendered to California authorities at the San Diego airport the following evening; he was taken to the USC medical center for treatment of a gunshot wound in his shoulder. Both were students at UCLA, and both were booked for murder; the two were out on bail for allegedly shooting an Orange County man last year. The other two US members involved in the shooting were apprehended shortly afterward.

Karenga, who is said to be in San Diego, has not been heard from since the murders.

The Bertrand Russell Peace Foundation, that tortured bag of hot air, will sponsor an international conference on Czechoslovakia next week, the first and second days of February. The foundation makes it clear that those who suppose the Czechs were "advancing towards not some form of socialist democracy but towards Capitalist freedom" are mistaken and need not apply. Susan Sontag will be there.

Movers 'N Things is a conspiracy to raise the income of the average Lower East Side hippie beyond the minimal level. The idea, as put forth by coordinator Peter Cawley, is to establish a moving enterprise that can hire ablebodied kids on an extremely short-term basis — like one afternoon a week, more or less — and still expand into something which could conceivably help the community. Cawley and his friends now have one truck to move things with, but the demand is high and with sufficient manpower

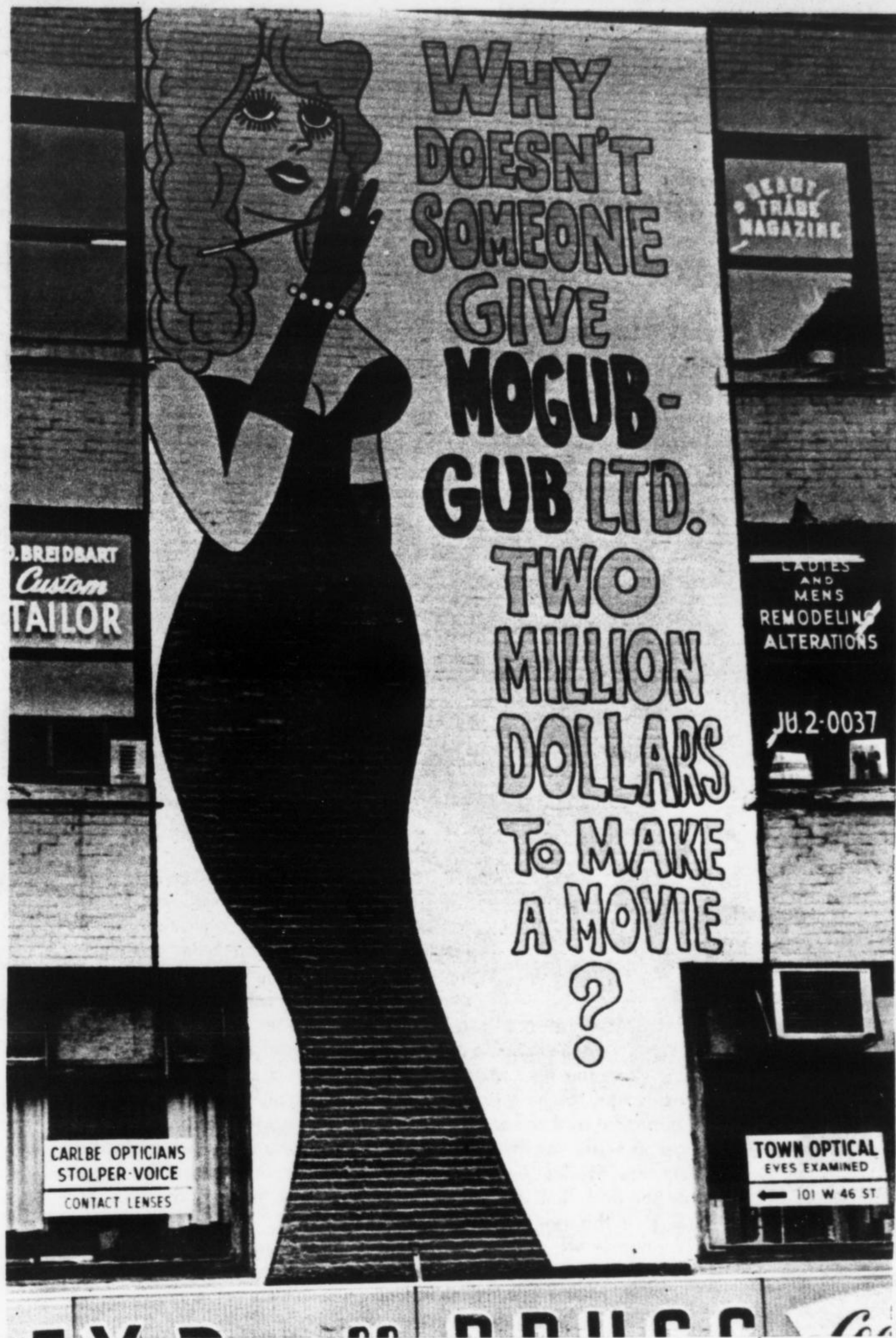

interview with a film maker

Fred Mogubgub produced "ZET" and is now producing "DAWN COMES."

Fred Mogubgub is a man in a state of ecstatic amazement at the full scope of human possibilities.

After years of successful commercial film work, Mogubgub has found his soul and as yet hasn't ceased being amazed by his discovery.

It has given him a quality of childish wonderment that so perfectly shields the sharp, observing, directing and controlling eyes of its beholder.

To talk with Fred Mogubgub is a multimedia experience. Engulfed by a beehive of activity and noisy agitation, one becomes increasingly aware of the fact that not even for a moment does a detail of his surroundings escape Fred's keen head.

Despite the steady bombardment of super-rock and Sixth Avenue traffic, not being the most conducive backdrop to a conversation, the man's innate tranquility made up for it all.

EVO — Fred, could you describe to me your current project?

M — I am working on a TV set.

EVO — I have seen your last film, which I consider to be the best animated collage that I have ever seen.

M — I agree, it's the best that I have seen.

EVO — You started to shoot a new film last week. Do you have any concept or notions

as to what you want to do? What is it all about and what do you have in mind?

M — Just to do another film. As far as the film itself is concerned — it will take care of itself.

EVO — Do you usually work without a plot or sequence?

M — I work from minute to minute.

EVO — Even Fellini, who works without a script, usually knows what he wants to do. What is it that you want to do?

M — Whatever happens from minute to minute — that's what I want to do.

EVO — Are you experimenting? Is there a point that you wish to prove? Is it a concept or a dream that you desire to put celluloid?

M — No. I just feel like I am working on a film. I am working on a film from day to day and that's where the film is at. Everything is part of the film. This (conversation) is part of the film. Whatever I have done is part of the film. It is all going to make the film happen.

EVO — What are your thoughts about the film? What is your overall concept?

M — I just want to make a film. I am working my film all the time. How I am making it is however I am. Sitting here talking to you — it is still a film that I am making and therefore everything that happens will be in it. I am ALWAYS working on my film. THIS IS A FILM.

EVO — When I walked into your studio I noticed three walls full of prizes that were given to you. What were they for? What does your past work consist on? Features, Commercials, What?

What were the prizes on those walls for?

M — Short films and commercials. All my work relates to what I want to do now. I want to make a good film and I need money to make it with.

EVO — Are you still involved with commercials?

M — I am getting into it again.

EVO — Are any of your commercial currently shown on TV?

M — One, for the Beneficial Finance Co. It really doesn't matter. What matters is what I am doing today.

EVO — Understood. YOU are making a FILM. The reason I asked you about your past work is because I want to find out what you are doing NOW.

M — I am concerned ONLY with what I am doing NOW. The film is what I am doing. Now what is it all going to be about? O.K. Let me see if I can figure it out. If I'd start making a film with you right now, it would give you an idea. I am starting with myself and move ahead. But somehow or other I would have to control it.

EVO — Are you usually in control of your creative energies and efforts? Do you try to retain control over your material?

M — Like I am now — Yes. I come close to that. I like to feel I am in control because then I can make sense of it. It's just like everything else, one does their closest thing. Just do what you do. That's what counts.

Now the FILM is about a GIRL. I don't know why it is about a girl. It just happens to be about a girl. A study of today's human being. When she comes in we'll know her.

EVO — I have seen a large number of girls parading in here trying to land the part. It seems that none has hit you as yet. Is that correct?

M — That isn't true. They all have something.

EVO — Are you trying to establish a composite image of today's girl?

M — I don't know. As long as it is a nice girl.

EVO — Do you limit yourself in Age?

M — No.

EVO — Have you used many women in your commercials?

M — Not too many.

EVO — Do you feel that your past work was the thing you had to do in order to be at the point that you are at now?

M — Only when you succeed as an artist you know. Let me tell you. Right now I know that I am experimenting with that box (TV console). That's the thing I am concerned with now. I can't really describe it, but what's going to be in the movie is coming out of that box. It's all layers of paint added every day. I think the whole thing out every day. It just keeps changing. The set itself does not work but just changes every day. By me. It's one constant change I want something to do and it is getting to be interesting. It's starting to work out somehow. I feel it's going to come to a point where it will probably just glow. There are so many layers and it will look like it's on all the time. I am trying to say what I can within that glow. So I create my own little glow. A living thing made out of art. I concern myself with creating real matter out of art. It lives, somehow.

EVO — Do you paint?

M — That's what I am doing — painting.

EVO — Do you have any art school training?

M — Yes, I have had some training. I went to art school in New Bedford and in New York. I dug what was happening here and got turned on by the city. This town was full of excitement. The city really turns me on.

Why did the chicken cross the road? . . . Was she running towards or away from that itchy-fingered man in the bushes . . . ?

Of such imponderables are underground films and other relatively sado-masochistic activities made, or is everything straight from the dream factory anyway . . . In my step-father's house, or, you can't keep everyone down all the time: **FILM-MAKERS' CINEMATHEQUE LIVES ON**, now at the Elgin with an 11:15 AM (ycch) series, plus the continued Jewish Museum series presented on meat-and-greet Tuesday evenings, and now! at the Gotham Art Theater! On Fridays and Saturdays: another series.

Another increasingly popular S&M activity, totally contemporaneous with underground film-making, is underground film-making criticism, or, "reviewing" as it is known in semi-polite circles (with a sneer). The first program at the Elgin this past Sunday was films by Warren Sonbert, who collected a rather good-size audience at least a little bit by having publicly threatened to leave N.Y. after this showing . . . He needn't have, the films were worth seeing: all color, most with minimal or no soundtrack (except for stray snores from the loyal but overtired audience), done in that warm, intimate, facetious camera style which marks personal cinema wherever it goes. All the films (3 of them) were marked by a sense of humor, and small details which proved more necessary and sensitive as the films wore chronologically on; indeed, the *good parts* fortunately took up more and more footage as the filmmaker obviously became more cognizant of his camera. The first flick (and underground filmmakers make flicks, too), *Where Did Our Love Go?* was a small-time study of various couples, some more camera-shy — and uglier — than the others, with a Ken (Scorpio Rising) Anger sort of soundtrack, consisting entirely of those 1950's R&R songs we cried to, petted along with, maybe even practicing a little self-adoration in private, with the radio going along for the ride.

The only annoying moment in the film came when one of the couples, having re-inforced their relationship at the door, amid swirling arms and tight kisses and dizzy feet covering the distance towards the mattress, having accomplished all this, once there, on top of that bed-on-the-floor—"Japanese style, ma!" nothing happens. He takes out some fans made of bird feathers; she plays conquette—the camera misses catching any of the iridescent wonder of either feathers or faces . . . and then, there He is, lying alone, reading a paper — nude? — when jump-cut: there they both are — and He has on red underpants and a sheepish smile, She has on non-discriminate body part-covering . . . and they roll over and around each other, coiling like silvergleam snakes, a little like James Broughton's "The Bed." Only it's spoiled by their shamed, near-nudity, that quasi-ness ruining the purity and the moment. The flick's title is misleading, because there is nobody around the frame, or inside it, wondering where their love went . . . only people "acting," without the self-conscious, beautiful, sum-up security of the Andy Warhol circle of friends.

One of the films, *The Bad and the Beautiful*, really only need apply to already-friendly audiences, because if one doesn't know Rene Ricard (?!?) and his wife Patty, the film loses a lot in substance and enjoyment. Lack-

ing here is the stamp of one mature, conscious sensibility; the work is not informed by a presence, as are Brakhage films. Instead, this is a high-class home movie, almost unrelieved by those little flashes and perfect frames which set off the filmmaker from the kid who had the camera that time . . .

The Tuxedo Theater, the last work (I know there was a short after this—I know) is the most sophisticated and complex of all, and if you can't have Bresson in his exquisite purity, then Godardian tactics (2 steps to the left, a pirouette 180° around . . .) aren't too bad, either. All of which means, there are several themes running thru the tapestry. Yessir, always a story line, no matter how peripheral in style. This story is mainly about one explorer's head travels, and everybody goes on a little voyage, too; sometimes through the color TV set, and sometimes, via the camera, to non-honky fairs and Morocco . . . It is a sign, an omen, that some of the most interesting effects were accomplished by the crazy TV monster, tuned in to psychedelic range, much like the Lucy in the Sky sequence of *Yellow Submarine*, providing once again that technology must be mastered by equally complex and sensitive human minds to find new paths for art. (How else to reflect the private dream world impinged by the common surface called daily, in-the-street realism — meaning the belief that something out there exists because who can ever know if it is truly there).

Many of the serial shots work well in here: parallels drawn subtly between a race for wheelchair paraplegics and later, fairground bumping-cars, filled with screaming children of all ages; between a psychedelic TV Mickey Mouse flying off to Everywhere, and the eternal, burnoose-clad natives of Marrakeck, with a non-psychedelic but heatwave sun high above. Or the Tunnel of Love, an interesting theme of American mythology . . .

Warren Sonbert is exploring, in part, hoy to make films which produce their own sound, subtle interacting waves flowing between the viewer's head and the colors on the film for an even more personal cinema than I have been talking about. The last film has many moments which actually manage to create some kind of suspension of disbelief, a voluntary agreement that the frame of the film is itself a world organization. If he can somehow establish a basic contract between himself and all the footage, then the next films might really be something.

Note . . . I just remembered that I didn't mention one particular sequence in the first film — one couple consisting of Bruce Pecheur, a well-known male model who also stars in *The Moke-Eater* along with Rene Ricard and others.

Bruce was ok, but the girl with him was fantastic, perhaps the only non-professional in the film who was truly a joy to watch, absolutely down on it all, all the time, and just a glory for a filmmaker. Like a sweet, femininely crazy Taylor Mead — although nobody touches him for enhancing a camera lens.

Next week is Jack Smith's *No President*. Anyone needing an introduction to Jack Smith as a filmmaker, don't come. Even though the film will be at 11:15 AM again (oh, oh, how many mornings can I get up in time at such a ridiculous hour, and on a Sunday no less . . .) anyone needing an introduction, don't come; the theater will probably be full enough.

WHY CALL THEM BACK FROM HEAVEN? — Clifford Simak; Ace Special, 1968.

A few months back, a book called *We Froze the First Man* appeared on the racks of sensational nonfiction. In brief, the theory sounds plausible, if unpalatable to many reasonable non-materialists, and thoroughly calculated to appeal to the modern man to whom his present life is either so satisfying he can't imagine losing it permanently, or so unsatisfying he wants to fix his hopes on the next; that immediately after death the body should be frozen to preserve the individual cells, and that some day the corpse should be received and the disease of which the man died, cured.

A fairly interesting idea, and judging by modern advances in medicine, it may not be as crackpot as it sounds—or at least no more crackpot than everything else in a materialist society. As was probably inevitable, it struck science fiction writers as a concept better suited to their field than to reality; and Clifford Simak has taken this idea and made a standing broad-jump to a world a scant 200 years in the future, where this insurance of a continued physical life some day is the basic human right; where the "Forever Center" owns most of the tangible property of the world, and where billions of corpses lie piled up awaiting resuscitation—some day. And where the standard of living which has been man's dream through the centuries has vanished, and everyone lives in grim self-imposed frugality through this, their "first life" in order to salt away wealth for investment in their second.

Simak, a careful and competent writer, has gone far afield to search out the least ramification of this basic promise. At a recent Tolkien conference at Bolknep College, Ivor Rogers made the comment that much of science fiction was not science fiction at all, but technology-fiction; and certainly the extrapolation of technology has been the basis for this novel. In fact, like many books from old-line writers of Simak's kind, it is not a novel at all, but a painstaking piece of imaginative extrapolation of the sociology of technology—with a few characters thrown in as pegs on which the necessities of the plot are hung. One feels that Simak would have been more comfortable writing a nonfiction treatise about the world he has postulated here.

Granted the promise, it is a carefully built up and logical world—but Simak, I think, has overestimated the hold that this new advance would have on mankind. For even when faced with what he literally believed to be an eternity of physical torment, medieval man did not immediately and logically forsake his sins to avoid it. Man just isn't that much of a rational animal. Therefore, it hardly seems likely that such a vast majority of mankind, promised physical immortality—but on the other side of death, and having to die at least once to get it—would give up, for their second life, everything which makes this first one worth living.

Apart from that, the poet is so strung out into random episodes that it's hard to follow, and no single character seems worth remembering. The plot turns on a spurious chase which turns out to be a trivial bit of villainy by a Big Big in the revival program, and this somehow seems to make the desperate search for human dignity in such a world seem equally trivial. Science fiction is, by definition, escape fiction, but escape fiction for those who like to think a bit about the wherefores of existence. However; even

those who like to think, deserve a good story along with it, and they don't get it here. All the characters were so similar that every time Franklin Chapman, for instance, reappeared, I had to remind myself of the particular plot-point he illustrated; and no character was more than that, a persona to illustrate some viewpoint in this un-brave new world. The standards of the novel change all the time, granted; but even in an avant-garde masterpiece, let alone a four-bit paperback, one expects to be able to keep track of the characters.

This one defect granted, the book has huge hunks of merit. It gives many an acerbic glimpse of an unusually horrifying world of what-if. If all one asks of science fiction is that it give a careful working-out of a current trend, carried to logical ultimates of pity and terror, it meets that standard perfectly. And when you have that kind of extrapolation, it would, maybe, be trivial or carping to ask for believ-grip the reader, too.

THE SINGING STONES: Juanita Coulson. Ace Double, 1968.—Derai: E. C. TUBB. Ace Double.

Juanita Coulson's first book, last year—*CRISIS ON CHIRON*—was a charming, competent, but unremarkable talented first-effort. With her second book, however, she has taken a giant step into a small and select giant step into a small and select company—Andre Norton, Leigh Brackett, C. L. Moore—whose novel of bathic; interplanetary adventure are so real that the reader almost feels he is getting the latest news bulletins from an actual world. The charm lies in the loving and full-dimensioned construction of a world colorful and brilliant, yet realistic and intense. In her caves, you feel you are really underground; real winds by over these worlds, and real plants and animals, no matter how strange, move over solid ground. If such a writer invents a strange beast, you can see it and almost smell it; it isn't just a weird name on paper. Furthermore, the aliens in such a planet are not just Martians-by-any-other-name, or stereotype Little Green Men, but people with their own level of anthropological development, shaped by rational and logical awareness of the brute necessities of an alien climate and ecology.

The plot doesn't approach the merit of the background. Would you believe psychedelic jewels? Neither does the reader—not quite. The hero, Geoff Latimer, is a member of a sort of interstellar peace Corps called the Ethnic Protection League, sent to a primitive planet where the Bad Guys—Terran slave-traders—and the Good Guys, mainly an enormous Goddess, who isn't *exactly* a goddess at all, are battling it out to reclaim, or wreck, this world. And there is the usual beautiful Earth-woman—

Enough. You've read it many times, and so have I. It's no surprise when the Good Guys win; the point is, in this kind of book, the reader *cares* if they do. What makes him care is the living competence with which Juanita Coulson has invented a real planet with real sounds and smells, real geography and ecology, and people who are *there*, who, in the words of Theodore Sturgeon, displace water when they bathe; people with real pasts and real problems, with whom the reader can suffer and die and triumph. It's a good readable book; more than that, it's a book of promise, for if so young a writer can do this much with these near-threadbare materials, what will she do when some day she gets hold of a plot worthy of her tremendous talents?

DERAI, by Tubb—the flip side of the above—is much the same sort of thing, romantic otherworldly adventure in strange and lovely worlds. It is a gripping story, tremendously entertaining, and without any pretensions to be either "mainstream literature"

Two weeks ago it looked as if Bill Graham had sewn up San Francisco's rock scene. The Carousel had come into his hands months before. The Family Log had lost the Avalon, and a Dog dance scheduled for December 27 still hadn't happened. Today, as the underground continues its titanic struggle to get itself together, there are no fewer than three operations getting ready to challenge Graham's monopoly.

The first is the Family Dog — chastened, more serious Dog, which has hired a new General Manager with financial experience. Under ex-stockbroker Buck Sumski the Dog finally put on its first dance since December 8 to a healthy crowd (despite the rain) at Winterland last weekend.

The Dog still has no dance permit and its dances at Winterland will make use of the landlord's. This sounds like a touchy arrangement, but the real sticker is that Winterland is so much bigger than the Avalon, and the intimacy of the old Dog is hard to put together there. Add to this the bigger nut of operating expenses and it's easy to see why Winterland is bound to be a temporary arrangement: to draw a bigger crowd than the hardcore Family Dog people, Chet Helms is going to have to book more expensive talent and bid against Graham and the big-leaguers.

Helms is convinced the Dog is going to have to settle down to some hard scuffling. "For three years," he says, "the mountain has come to Mohammed. For at least the next three, it's going

to be the other way around." A year ago, for instance, the Family Dog's dance poster operation was making more money than the dances, and Helms could afford (though not very well) to lose \$100,000 on the now-dead Denver Dog.

Helms is trying to arrange for another hall while the Dog is using Winterland. A top-secret super-bizarre freaky and unheard-of location just a matter of feet from the great eternal Pacific Ocean is his best hope.

Another ultra-weird number is his proposed (are you listening, Frank Bardacke?) Family Log semipro baseball team, the Fleas. Perhaps this would be the team to bring back pageantry and spectacle to baseball — as well as reintroducing strong loyalties for and against. (It wouldn't be a league team, of course, but it still ought to be a wild show — an exhibition game and show with following rock dance).

Meanwhile a former Denver Dog employee and a former owner of the Vulcan Gas Company hall in Austin will start a series of dances at the Avalon next weekend. Called Soundproof Productions, an allusion of their using the hall, this outfit also has no permit of its own and is relying on a partnership with the hall owner.

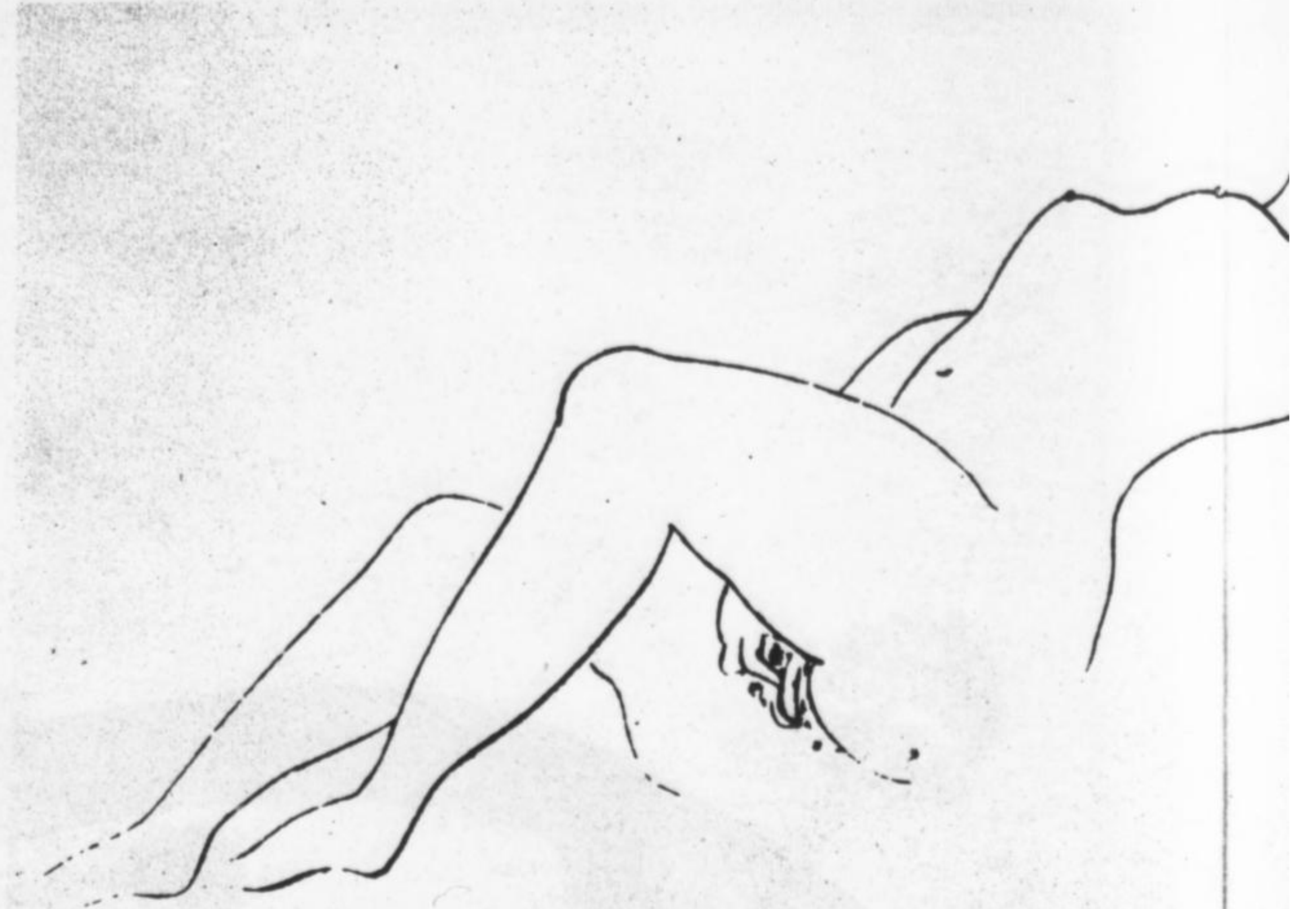
In addition to doing a certain amount of painting, cleaning, plastering and soundproofing, Soundproof is trying to avoid the Dog's tradition of "bad community relations" with the natives of that one particular block of Sutter St. Ticket lines will be controlled to head off charges of blocking sidewalks, the street will be swept after dances, and

in particular the rent-a-cops will be answerable to Mr. Hooley, the landlord, rather than to the dance promoters. It's pretty touchy down there, so if you go to the Avalon to hear the Grateful Dead next weekend and you dig the dance, don't piss on anything. Anything!

The third rock and roll hall is the old Straight Theater, of "dance academy" fame. Group manager-promoter Matthew Katz, who has mostly broken into the news when hassling with his musicians, is planning to turn the old Straight into a membership club for musicians, equivalent to the Press Club for journalists, open to them and their guests 24 hours a day. Most of the music under his plan will be in the nature of jams and "creative interchange," of primary interest to musicians, though benefits and other shows open to the public will be scheduled — some at usual dance hours, others after hours from 2 to 6 in the morning.

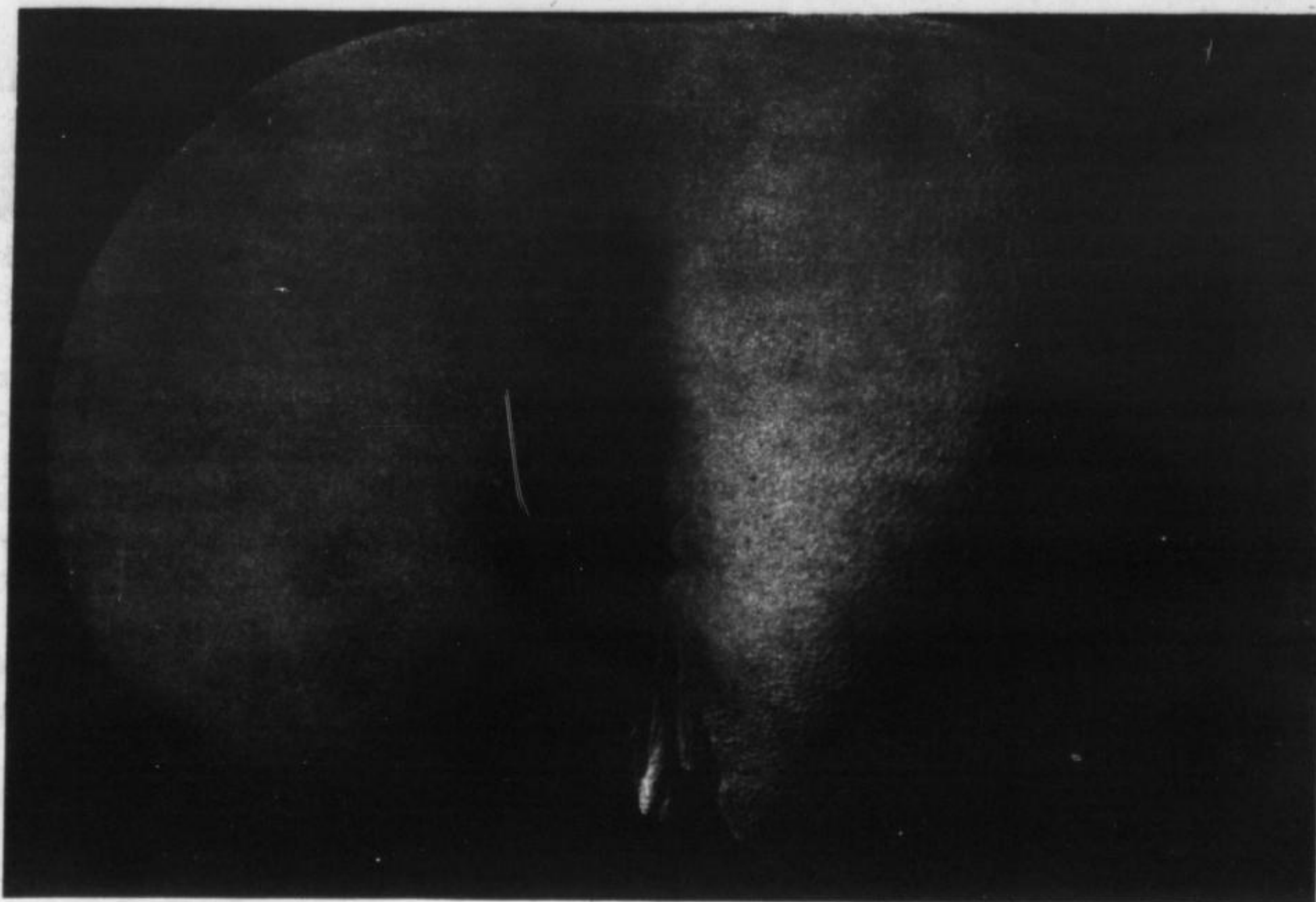
A year ago San Francisco was supporting three dance halls — the Fillmore, the Carousel and the Avalon. At that time dance posters provided a solid financial base that has mostly melted away in the washing and winding of time, but if (as a Bank of California executive concluded in a recent study) rock and roll is going to be San Francisco's fourth largest industry in the next decade, there's a good chance it could happen again. That's good news for anybody who digs good rock dances — and anybody who appreciates their symbolic importance for this generation.

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fucking thru the ages

Presidents may come and presidents may go, but genuine historical events cut more deeply and leave more lasting effects. One of these took place last summer in the Swedish town of Lund. Later in the year it spread to Denmark and Germany. Soon it will engulf all of us.

The event in question was the First International Exhibition of Erotic Art, in which everyone's fantasies, daydreams, and ordinary practices became a solid everyday environment on all sides of the viewer, an inescapable world consisting of paintings, drawings, sculptures, constructions and kinetic works depicting sex in most of its forms, on land, in the water, on boats, with various pulleys or other machines, including heterosexual, male and female homosexual, and mixed copulations in couples and small or large groups, sometimes with existent or no-existent animals as well, with an occasional onanist thrown in for good measure. The show was immense, the major part of it forming the private collection of the most persistent sexual pioneers of our time, the American psychologists who first introduced the world to Walter's *My Secret Life*, Doctors Eberhard and Phyllis Kronhausen.

It is to be hoped that readers who missed this show in Europe will have a chance to see it here at home in the near future, but for those who can't wait and have a lot of money Grove Press has just brought out a giant book called *Erotic Art* containing many of the exhibitions—the price is twenty-five dollars, not just because of the subject matter, as there are a number of art books around costing that much, most of them not the least bit erotic.

Where the text of most art books is usually little more than pretentious filler, the articles in *Erotic Art* are a piece of history in themselves. They record the impressions of visitors to the show, along with many pictures of these visitors contemplating scenes of cunnilingus and fellatio in states ranging from bemused to ecstatic, and they also provide a number of interviews with the artists themselves, including Larry Rivers, Andy Warhol, and Jean Jacques Lebel, in which they record how they feel about erotic art. Practically everyone who attended agreed that the show was and is an

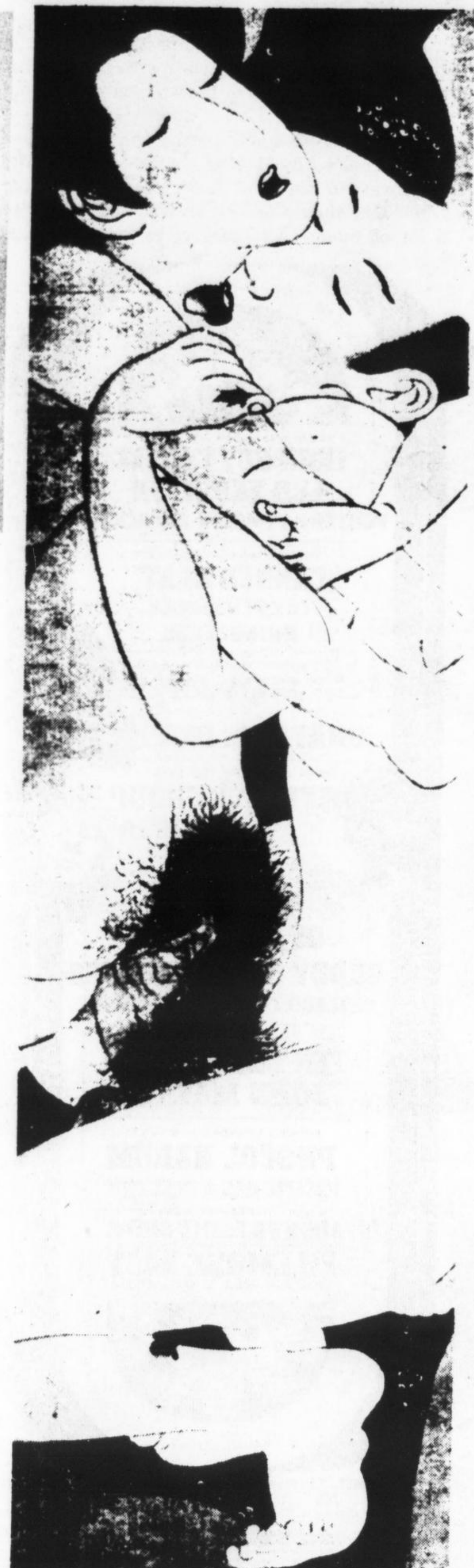
important turning point in how people today feel about sexual matters and a sign of further progress to come.

One Swedish businessman relates that he found himself coming more and more upset by the exhibit during the first half hour but then calmed down and began to study the pictures as he realized he was only seeing "what happens every day between man and woman. And that is nothing to be ashamed of." Far from being boring or repetitious, the juxtaposition of erotic works from many schools and cultures appears to have made the subject even more alive and meaningful. Children as young as four attended the show with their parents—they too are interviewed and appear to have taken the exhibit completely in their stride.

In the past it has been customary to present erotic art in a pseudo-scholarly manner, relating it to historical or anthropological themes or the supposed drives of "primitive" man. The Kronhausens also present their material historically and divide it into Western, Primitive, and various eastern sections. But their method is nonetheless quite different, for in their introduction they reject in no uncertain terms the hypocrisy which has always made it necessary in the past to justify erotic art and literature by citing a "redeeming social purpose" to separate it from the allegedly obscene. Our obscenity laws still pay homage to this principle on the theory that sex in itself either in art or life somehow endangers society. But the Kronhausens insist on the view of "an ever growing liberal minority" who believe that "sexual stimulation—far from being disturbing to the individual and inimical to society—is in itself a positive social value." Even the poster for this show was precedent breaking—it showed a Japanese scene of a couple going at it with every public hair glisteningly clear. This poster appeared on walls all over Sweden while the show was on.

The big question of course is how long is it to be before this show, which returns to Sweden in the spring by popular demand, reaches America as well. The much beleaguered curators of our museums would do well to ponder this question. There is no point in claiming that only a depraved and degenerate people would enjoy such a show, especially when the Swedes, Danes, and Germans are probably even more sober-sided than we are and also demonstrably more

M — Maybe 18, maybe 20 years. I am not sure.

EVO — Do you live in the city?

M — No, I live in New Jersey.

EVO — Do you have a family?

M — Yes. Wife and two children.

EVO — How do you relate to your fellow human beings? Do you find it easier to communicate via film rather than on a personal basis?

M — Yeah, I guess so. That's my language. That's the way I talk.

EVO — What I saw of your communications struck me as being extremely eloquent. The sensible, straight forward way in which you massage your audience is remarkable. Technically I don't know much about films but I am aware of intercommunication. To me it was an I and Thou entity unto itself.

M — It's a feeling, a real thing. That's the thing about the sculpture, the box. It almost lives and I don't know if it can be done on film. Yet it all comes from the machine.

EVO — Remember that what you feed into the machine is what comes through. I think that you succeeded very well in the film I saw. That's why I called it animated collage rather than photomontage. Your thing is alive and moves.

M — The thing that's always there. Very spiritual.

EVO — And very visual too.

M — I was trying to evoke audience participation. A Ying and Yang kind of a thing but then who knows?

EVO — What do you think?

M — I don't know. Whatever it is, it's probably the secret of life.

EVO — Are you trying to find the secret

of life?

M — YYYEEEAHHH. I guess so, I don't know. Maybe it's better just to live. Just to do what you are doing. I mean something monotonous has to be next to something interesting to make it interesting.

EVO — How long have you been turning on?

M — 13 years.

EVO — Have you ever had hallucinogenics?

M — No. I want to do it without psychedelic drugs. I like to make interesting journeys. I don't like instant journeys. I am just an artist working on his thing.

EVO — Are you apprehensive about psychedelic drugs?

M — No. I believe in myself.

EVO — Do you believe in God?

M — Yeah. I believe in God. I believe God is YOURSELF. I do things from day to day. Who knows, one of these days I may even take a trip. I turn on to my work. I am constantly working. Right now I don't have the time for a trip.

EVO — Do you work well with people?

M — Yes, I think so, I let people do whatever the hell they want to do.

EVO — Do you maintain control over your thing?

M — I don't know if I maintain control over anything. I just talk to the people that work with me. They can all do what they want.

EVO — And all relating to a central idea.

M — Yes. I believe in what they believe in. We believe in the same things. We just express it in our different ways. The big problem today is finding a way to communicate a feeling and be understood.

EVO — Have you experienced the frustration of being misunderstood?

M — Yes but feelings change through participation.

EVO — When did you experience the big

change in your life. The change in your consciousness?

M — Two years ago.

EVO — How old are you?

M — 40— could be 41. I am at a point where I want to participate. I feel things are together now and what will come out of it will be just love and beauty.

EVO — Are you interested in what's happening on the outside, like the political scene?

M — Political scenes don't change that often. It's the same all the time. It is a difficult subject to talk about because every thing else is moving so fast. It is incredible how long it takes till one reaches some sort of an understanding. I don't really know what I am talking about. Trying to defend it all isn't easy.

EVO — What are you trying to defend?

M — Myself. What I do and peoples right to participate.

EVO — You are involved because your work expresses what's happening.

M — That was what was happening when I made the film. What was happening to me. What's happening to me today is an entirely different story. It's happening now from day to day. In my films I do exactly what I feel.

EVO — You certainly came through. After I saw your film I came away with the distinct impression that I have known you for a long time.

M — Because I did exactly what I wanted to do. That's why. I hope I succeed again. The only way to find out is to continue making films. One should be able to find someone with a lot of money who just gives it to you and

EVO — Has that happened to you?
M — It's getting closer and closer.
EVO — How do you support yourself while doing what you are doing?

M — We make T.V. commercials.
EVO — In your TV work — do you have control over your material?

M — Yes, we don't let anyone hold us back because we work together.

EVO — Do you feel that you succeeded in bridging the gap between your commercials and your films?

M — Yes, I have definitely done that. I think it is a good thing. In our case we have had complete freedom in the production of our commercials. What you do with that is a different story again. You can take it and put you have to create and put in it what you feel.

EVO — Do you have any interference from your clients?

M — Not interference. Just communication. People that come here want a great job. They know what they are coming for and what they come for we do. They come for what we do.

EVO — Do you believe that like in some Scandinavian countries nudity will finally be used in commercials? Do you think that the antimonious taboos will finally be broken on the TV screen?

M — Sure, without any doubt. If anything is moving ahead it will be television. The saying "Whoever controls TV controls the world" is correct. So is McLuhan.

EVO — I think Nixon's election proved that point.

M — Well, I don't know about that guy. Who knows where evil lies? TV can be used for good and for bad. For many it is their only

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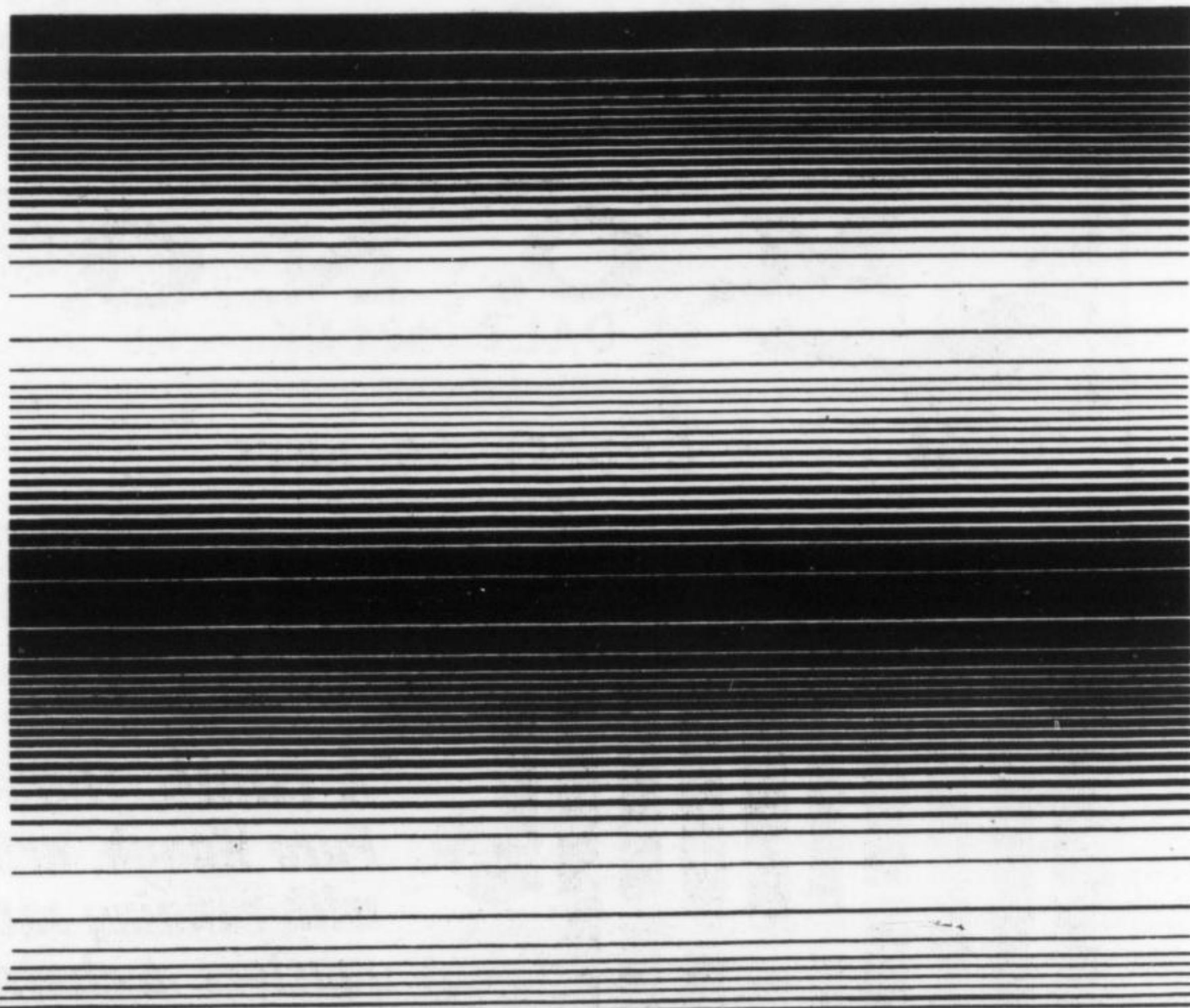

If you would like to involve YOUR high school, college, university or commune in the activities of LUV, the best thing to do would be to write Dennis Warren, LUV National Chairman, University of the Pacific, Box 3, Stockton, California 95204. Warren will happily send you information describing how to set up your own revolutionary cell and lobby for the reform of the electoral college and for the lowering of the voting age. His lobbying kit will contain all the salient arguments for lowering the voting age, and directions on how to persuade your family, friends, and teevee servicemen to write letters to their congressmen in support of LUV.

The thing is, there are 12 million people between the ages of 18 and 21, and this could be an impressive voting bloc, if they could vote, if they voted as a bloc. The potential effects of lowering the voting age are incalculable. It would be a rash step. And this is why it is so surprising that only one congressman, Emmanuel Celler of Brooklyn, has so far come out vocally against the proposal. Strom Thurmond, Mike Mansfield, Everett Dirksen and a landslide of other legislators have already endorsed it. Last week the Senate Constitutional Amendment Subcommittee on electoral reform met to consider alterations in the electoral college, and Drs Charles Ashman and John Bevan, sponsors of the LUV campaign at UOP, made a joint presentation before the subcommittee; with them was Dennis Warren, who planned to challenge Rep. Celler to a debate. The outcome of this appearance had not been announced when EVO went to press Tuesday.

It might get passed, this suffrage thing. In any case, it gives the college kids something to do, keeps them off the quad. The McCarthy campaign got them all involved, they cut their hair and stayed clean for Gene and all that, and if this thing keeps going it might maintain this level of cleanliness. Congress might actually do something in response to it, who knows? The thing is, it's clean—concerned citizens working through acceptable channels to achieve desired reforms. It really makes it.

And if it works? The question is whether the influx of young people into the workings of the government would refresh the government, or whether the exigencies of voting responsibilities and the privileges and power accruing therefrom would contaminate the kids, turn them into Young Democrats and Young Republicans in every regrettable sense of the words. For this writer, there are limits to the faith he puts in his generation. But it's a good thing, I think they should have the vote, everybody oughta have the damn vote!

industrious with a higher annual growth rate economically. There is no doubting the high artistic level of the exhibit nor the important artistic and humane perspectives to be gained from showing all these works together.

But the real problems in bringing this show to America have nothing to do with art. There is at this moment in the nation's history a wave of defeatism (more probably just a temporary failure of nerve) which can best be overcome precisely by such acts as bringing this exhibit to America as soon as possible. Because the last few years have been relatively free and permissive, a strange theory is going the rounds that we must now suffer a wave of hysterical repression for the next ten years. This is nothing but puritanical nonsense and should be treated as such—it seems from the sick puritan idea that we must pay for every moment of pleasure with hours of pain and penitence. There is no longer any reason to believe this sort of dangerous dribble. Nor is there any reason to suppose that a Republican

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president in the White House should signify a turn to sexual hibernation. Sexual habits and behavior transcend political parties just as they do entire nations and cultures, as the Kronhausens's exhibit clearly shows.

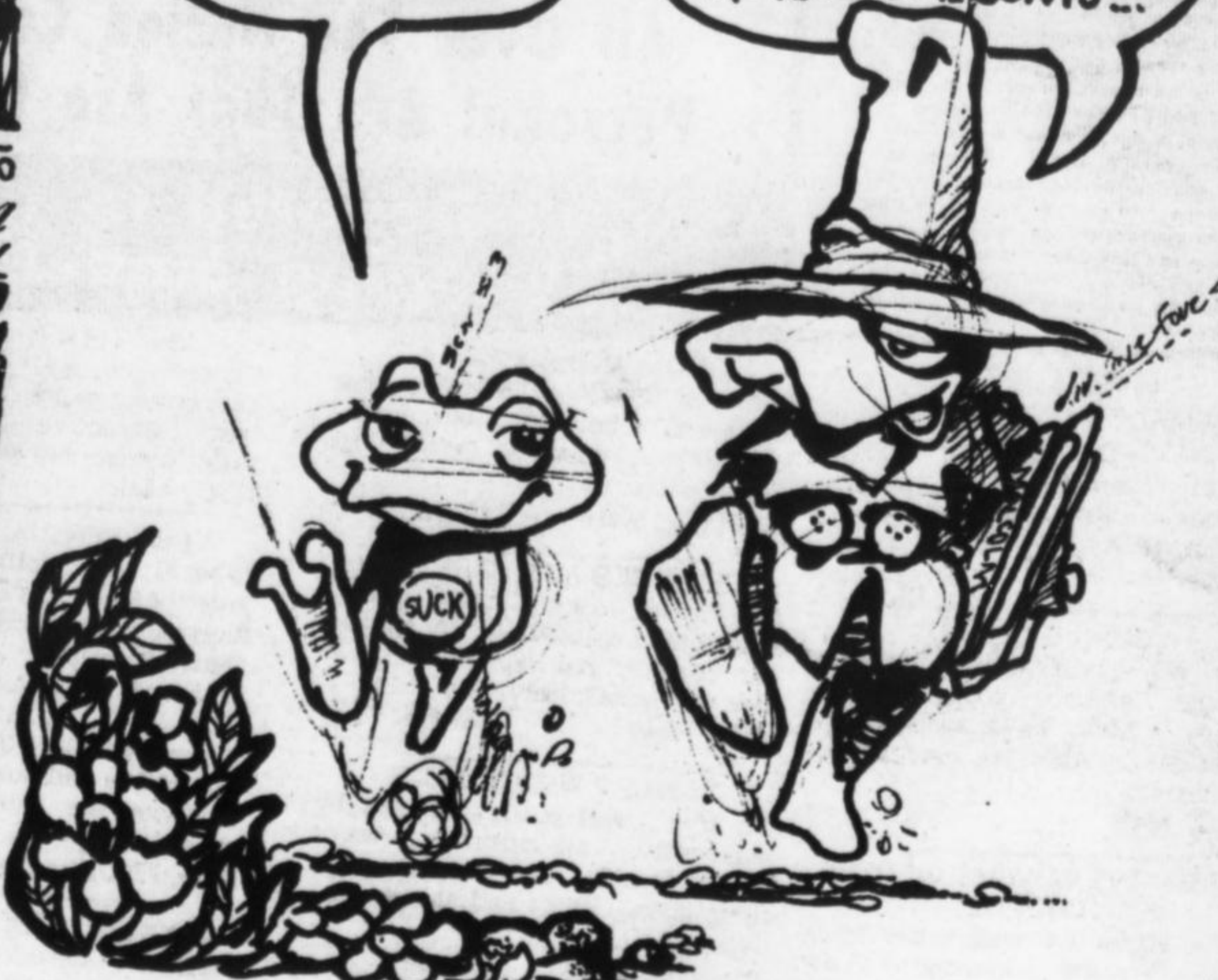
