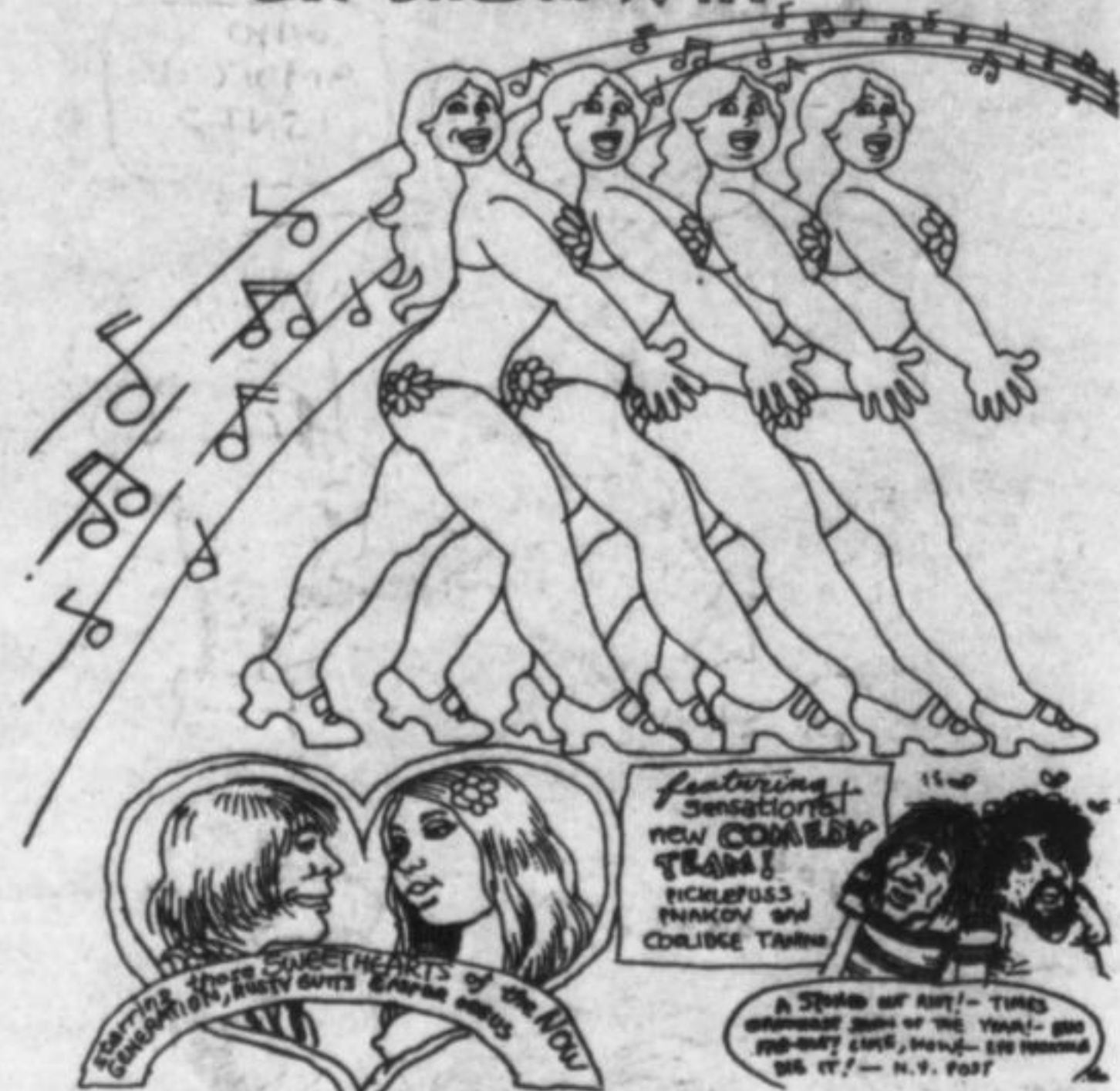

MUSEUM STALLS ON ULTIMATUM

(EVO) The artists' group protesting against the policies of the Modern Museum has rejected the Museum's reply to their ultimatum, in which their demands for public discussions and numerous reforms were waved aside in favor of work in private committees. The museum stated that the purpose of these committees would be to publish a document recording the conversations. The group of artists is now going ahead full steam with its plans to hold public discussions independently of the museum, and a date and place will be announced within the next week. The group intends to broaden its membership to include all artists and other interested parties who may wish to take part in its activities. A letter has been sent to the museum asking for clear-cut answers on a number of points, ranging from free admission to the museum to the role of black artists. If the museum has not sent a satisfactory reply by Friday, March 7, the artists intend to move from the public discussion stage to direct public demonstrations and sit-ins at the museum. 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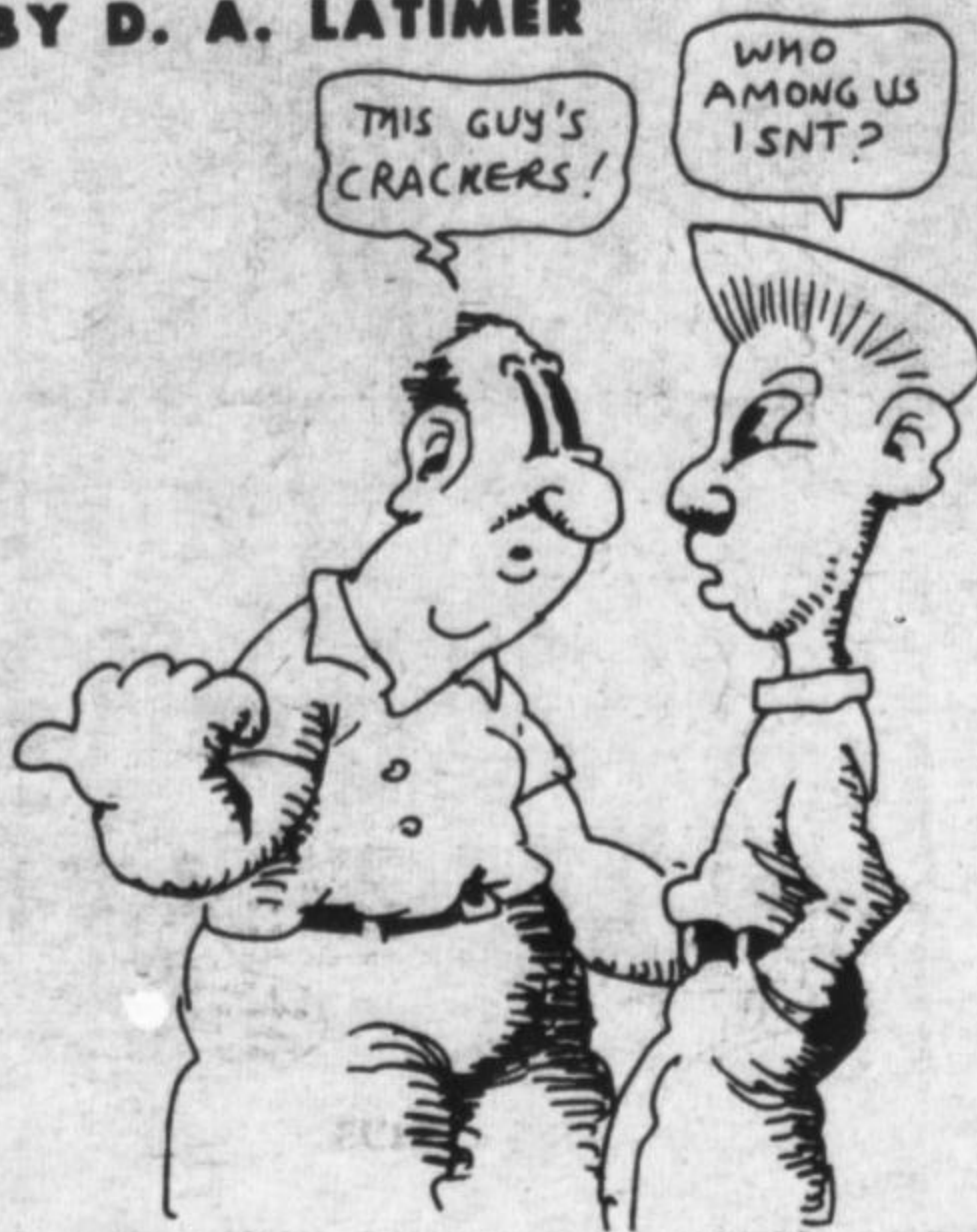
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DECOMPOSITION

Golly, comix fans, aren't you glad you squandered fifteen cents (25c outside the metropolitan limits) on EVO this week?! Sale to minors without written consent of their parents is prohibited, of course, so all you kids better get Ma or Paw to scribble it down: "I hearby consent my little Jimmy and Sussie to buy this newspaper." Get that written out and signed and send it to us with the logo of any East Village *Other* and we will send you free of charge a copy of the issue that was busted recently in New Jersey and returned by the thousands from Southern California newsvendors. That was the copy with Alex Gross' masterpiece, "Fucking Through The Ages," illustrated with photographs from the \$25 Grove Press book, *Erotica Through The Ages* by Drs. Phyllis and Eberhart Kronhausen, which is selling in the bookstores of Jersey and California, marked down to \$17.50 but still legal because you can't buy it with a quarter. Enclose thirty cents (30c) for postage and handling and dangerous narcotics and we will send it to you, wherever you are, yes, even in New Fucking Jersey!!

But this here is Comic Strip Week at EVO. The week before last it was Concrete Poetry Week, last week it was Meet The New Deadline Week, this week it's Comic Strip Week. "Write something on comic strips," Katzman told me. But he failed to specify what kind of comic strip, and since Cavailer is due shortly to publish a piece by someone else on underground comic strips, and *Esquire* too, from all reports . . . And since *Snatch Comix* is still being busted on the Coast — Crumb the Comics



King wandered regally off into the San Francisco Fog two week ago, incidentally, leaving Spain Rodriguez to tend his pad, and he has not been heard from since — and since the monster conglomerate *Gothic Blimp Worlds Ltd.* is still in production, this week we'll talk about the strips that appear in the daily papers. The quickest way to go about this, I guess, is to take the strips by the papers they appear in. Now, we have four daily newspapers* in New York City, and they are, in order of appearance on the newsstands, the *Knickerbocker/Daily Column*, the *Post*, the *Daily News*, and the *New York Times*. It is beneath the dignity of *The Times* to print comics, appropriately enough, and since the retirement of Bosley

Crowther this paper has had little to offer in the way of pleasant absurdity, aside from Arthur Daley. The comics in the *Post* are good white liberal comics, naturally, *Pogo* and *Peanuts* and like that there, with a splendid balance between fantasy and boredom provided by Big George and Mary Worth. As for the *Knickerbocker/Daily Column*, it's the only paper in New York that's worse by journalistic standards than EVO, and its comics — Miss Peach, Steve Canyon, Archie, etc. — complements its general editorial tone of pretentious wind-baggery. But the *Daily News* — ah, the *News* — every day it brings into Fun City just millions of comics strips scattered randomly through its editorial material, which itself is incomparably chuckleful. To avoid sounding provincial, I'll admit that we here in the City cannot get BC and *Odd Bodkins*, but aside from them and shit like *Robin Malone* we get just about everything.

So to start with, there's the *Daley Calumnix*. This is the Right's answer to morning papers, which as McLuhan inimitably puts it are not for reading, but for slipping into and out of, like a warm bath. The *Column* is the texture of dishwaters, the perfect blotter for coffee stains, phlegm blots, and cheese danish crumbs. Forget the editorial material, which is taken right off the teletype machines and pasted up without proofreading (Dr. Max Rafferty, Harry Golden, Norton Mockridge, and up till his retirement last month, Walter Winchell). As a matter of fact, fuck it, forget the *Daily Column* altogether, the *Sunday Column* is the only one worth buying. The *Sunday* colour section is glorious, it has thirty — count them, thirty — comic strips, all in colour!

Of this thirty, almost a handful are worth mentioning. First, there's *Prince Valiant*, by Harold Foster, the best-drawn comic strip ever done. Every panel of *Prince Valiant* is a museum piece, the composition as perfect as any Rembrandt, the draughting scrupulously realistic, and the inking subdued but dramatic. It suffers somewhat by the mode of narration, which has the dialogue at the bottom of the panel in prose form, and the episodes are generally pretty draggy and longwinded, but withal there is nothing to compare with *Prince Valiant*. Right now would be a pretty good time to latch on to *Prince Valiant*, in fact, since Foster has him between episodes and shows little appetite for sending him out a-questing again right away.

In the matter of realistic draughting, the *Column* also has Russ Manning's *Tarzan* and Dan Barry's *Flash Gordon*. Of the two, *Flash Gordon* is probably the more interesting strip: although Barry has removed the sexy aviator cap from *Flash's* blonde curls, ole *Flash* can still buckle a swash with alacrity, and the episodes are brief and action-packed. *Tarzan* I do not follow, myself, since after Burne Hogarth, hell, what can you do with *Tarzan*? Manning has a very sexy way of drawing bodies, though, all willowy and voluptuous, and his panels are nice to look at. Presently he has *Tarzan's* adolescent son bound and at the mercy of some evil ivory poachers, and the boy looks most appealing clad only in a furry loincloth.

In the manner of sexiness, however, the *Column* just does not have much to offer. *Freckles and His Friends* has been pretty leggy since the advent of the miniskirt, but it's such a lousy strip there's little to be said for it. *Archie* too displays an occasional thigh — not *Archie's*, fool, but *Betty's* or *Veronica's* — but

the fifth-string artist they have doing it is really from shit. Neither strip will split your sides with hilarity.

For chuckles, the best strips the *Column* has are *Hi and Lois* and *Snuffy Smith*. *Snuffy Smith* has been getting progressively less interesting in the last year or so, though, ever since *Loweezy* swole up and drapped him a little 'un named *Tater*. The strip used to be a really precious evocation of life in the back woods among the bootleggers and other shif'les skonks, but since *Tater* arrived it's taken to a really bourgeois ambience, a sort of domestic comedy that could just as easily be set in *Far Rockaway* as *Tennessee*. *Hi and Lois*, on the other hand, is just the essence of bourgeois domestic comedy, but it pulls this off with high art. *Hi and Lois* are a suburban couple with four kids — a teen-age boy, a pair of five-year-old twins, and a little girl baby at the pre-verbal all-fours-stage. They have neighbors, a shif'les mesomorphic loveable garbage man/drunk (thirsty) and his harried wife who does all the housework out of some all-transcending love. *Mort Walker* and *Dik Browne* do this one, and they managed with nearly every strip to capture something really-human and eternal and invaluable about life in *Deepest America*.

Steve Canyon cannot pass without comment, of course. Ole *Milt Caniff* is still doing a house organ for the *United States Military*, but now that the public image of War has fallen upon hard times his emphasis has changed from *Canyon* himself to the trials of his foster niece *Poteet*. The dialogue is still glamorous with a capital *Hollywood G*, and the girls still take most of their clothes off at least once a month — shades of *Male Call* — but frankly, it's just a rotten fascist strip and I got no interest in it.

The rest of the *Column* Sunday strips are uniformly uninteresting, except for the infrequent brilliance of *The Captain and The Kids*, which is still done by *J. Dirks* and his son, after half a century. There is generally an atmosphere of fantasy about the strip in the way it's drawn, which maintains even the weak humour devices it usually employs. A few months ago, though, the *Captain* smoked a wierdo cigarette which had been left lying about the island by a hippie, and he went off onto this incredible dope trip — he turned into a bee, and nearly perished at the hands of *Hans and Fritz*, who were wasps. Incidentally, talking about ancient comics, *Joe Palooka* is back with us, retired now and non-violent — in the most insipid strip of the decade. *Ham Fisher* spins in his grave.

The comparison between the *Column* comics and the *Post* comics is interesting. With the exception of *Steve Canyon*, none of the *Column* comics are timely or sensitive to social changes. With the exception of *Bushmiller's* incredibly comatose *Nancy*, though, the *Post* comics are almost shrill in their reflection of the Social Moment. It's like you read the *Column* to get your head working over breakfast and you read the *Post* to compose your views on the latest *World Happenings*: you read the *Column* comics to fritter away a Sunday morning, you read the *Post* comics to get a feel of America in the Technological Age.

Take *Batman*, f'rinstance. This strip grew out of the *Batman* pop phase a few years back and the *Post* keeps carrying it because it does, after all, radiate a sort of super-modern ambience. The artist's name is *Plastino*, which may be significant: working with a generally

ISRAEL SEARCHES BECAUSE SHE MUST

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (EVO)—Israel did not retaliate this past weekend to the terrorist attack at Zurich because she had no real alternative, reports here said.

But this was not only because of the world pressure on her, the reports said, but also because the Tel Aviv government has decided that the only choice she has at this time is to search for peace.

Other reports from Jerusalem reaching here stated that there was dissonance among ruling circles caused by the raid in Switzerland early last week. Some government figures wanted a full-scale reprisal similar to the Beirut attack.

But the argument against such a move came from those who pointed to the fact that the Lebanon raid did not alter the political situation while it certainly injured Israel's international case.

One alternative briefly discussed but reportedly discarded was to take vengeance directly against the terrorists by infiltrating the Arab organizations and assassinating the leaders.

But this procedure was deemed risky and too time-consuming, while at the same time giving the terrorists more stature than they now have.

So for the time, Israel appears to be set on waiting for the other nations of the world to take up the challenge of the Secretary General U Thant which calls for "constructive international action to prevent . . . acts of violence against civil aviation."

Already the Lebanese have stated publically that they believe it would have been better to leave civil aviation "outside the struggle."

The United States Ambassador to the UN Charles Yost informed this month's Security Council president Armand Berard of France that the United States finds the Zurich incident "intolerable interference with the safety of civilian passengers." (Four hurt along with two crew.)

Yost then called for "perfecting and strengthening" the safeguards to protect civil aviation. But he, like Thant, did not directly respond to the note from Israeli Foreign Minister Abba Eban which pointedly accepted their call for action and asked for what their plan would do.

The British had Lord Caradon informed the UN that it thinks the proposed meetings of the big four is the proper forum to work out such an agreement.

But no fresh moves for having that big four meeting have developed since France and the Soviet Union called for the sessions to be held at the UN. The Security Council, as of press time, had not even set up a meeting as a result of the Zurich incident in contrast to its swift response to Beirut.

Several sources here at the UN indicate that no action can be expected until after President Nixon return from his trip to Europe.

Meanwhile, it is hoped that the fuse on the Mideast is long enough for that.

US WINS FIGHT

ON GERMANY . . . BUT

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (EVO)—The Federal Republic of Germany (Bonn) has been placed on the preparatory committee for the UN's second development decade despite vigorous opposition from the East bloc. The United States had pressed for the seating of the Germans.

Yakov Malik, the Soviet ambassador, had warned General Assembly



President Emilio Arenales (of Guatemala) that it would "not participate" in the committee's work if the Germans were allowed to come into the UN through a "back door" method.

Arenales also named Poland, Byelorussian Soviet Socialist Republic and Romania to fill the other three seats on the committee, but the first two are expected to follow the Russian boycott.

There is an undercurrent of speculation that the Romanians might break the East bloc unity by participating, but evidence of this will have to wait until the committee's first session scheduled for Tuesday, Feb. 25.

The Soviet Union and its allies argued that West Germany is not a member of the United Nations (Bonn only has a permanent observer) and was not legally entitled to a voting seat in a major UN body.

The United States argued that the Bonn government contributed 10 times more to the current development decade than all the East bloc combined, with the obvious hint these funds would be cut off if the Germans were not given a seat.

Russia proposed the seating of both East and West Germany as a compromise: the US rejected the idea.

The developing nations, in a sense, had a choice of a bird in hand or maybe nothing in the bush. They could support Bonn's seat and be assured of US and German monies which they need, or they could please the East bloc in the hopes that the East would make up the difference.

But there is no precedent for the Russians doling out the required amounts of cash and assistance, and Moscow did not do much to sell its position to the Third World.

Some cynics have suggested the Russians simply wanted a way to get out of their obligations.

BIBLE STUDY

GROUP BUSTED

SAN FRANCISCO (EVO)—A Bible study club based in nearby Menlo Park has been busted by the Menlo Park Police on charges of bombing several leftist organizations.

The Society of Man Bible study group had nine of its members arrested on charges of conspiracy to sabotage and commit unlawful force, a World War II statute.

The arrests were carried out by a police task force of 40 policemen drawn from five towns who seized 75 pounds of black powder, 30 small arms weapons, and bomb-building preparations. A quantity of printed material was taken also, much of it described as rightwing by police.

The nine were released in \$12,500 bail each to await arraignment.

THAILAND QUIETLY

OFFERS VIET PLAN

BANGKOK, Thailand (EVO)—Foreign Minister Thanat Khoman has called for Asian nations "to form a force to keep peace in Vietnam instead of ineffective machinery like the International Control Commission." The force would come into being during the Paris talks.

Thanat told the Bangkok Post in an interview that the force should have a "United Nations mandate to keep the peace."

He said the force should be formed when the Paris peace talks "are about to conclude with an understanding or agreement to end the war." "As 'de-escalation follows', the new force would take over as American and North Vietnamese troops withdraw.

The foreign minister said that the ICC (composed of Poland, Canada and India) had proved ineffective not only in Vietnam but also in Laos and Cambodia. The ICC was created by the Geneva conference on Indochina in 1954.

"Asian nations have been talking about Asian solutions for Asian problems," he said. "They have deplored external interference in this part of the world. We now have a chance to show that we mean what we say."

Thanat went on to state that when the troop withdrawals start, the North Vietnamese must not be permitted to find sanctuary in Cambodia and Laos and must be sent "back to North Vietnam."

Observers here in Bangkok feel that Thailand would not have made the suggestion for the peace without express

approval of the United States which contributes the overwhelming share of Thailand's military junta's defense budget.

The key to such a peace force's success seems to lie in the role the Japanese, the financial giant now in Asia, would choose to take. And the Japanese are said to be prepared to assume greater responsibility for Asian peace if they can get the United States out of Okinawa.

But experienced observers think that the Thai plan is only one of several that the Americans and their allies are proposing in one form or another to end the Impasse in Vietnam.

ROAD CASUALTIES

SEEM AN EPIDEMIC

GENEVA (EVO) — Road deaths and injuries in the world are now running into hundreds of thousands every year making road accidents, comparable to a worldwide epidemic, a report has found.

The World Health Organization, based here, said that an epidemic has three major factors: the host, the agent and the environment. These correspond to the driver, the vehicle and the road, and these factors must be taken into account in stopping the plague, accidents.

Scientists working in Germany have found that driving is a health hazard. Dr. H. Hoffman, director of the Medical Center in Dortmund, said that automobile driving subjects the human body to stress in the circulatory system. Hoffman states for instance that even after a year, a myocardial infarction victim (a heart condition caused by blood circulation obstruction) "lacks the basic requirements for safe driving."

Traffic accidents also have been found associated with drivers who suffer from diabetes, allergic bronchial asthma, thyroid gland troubles and major digestive disorders.

A French psychiatrist, Dr. F. Chanoit, reports that personality and other emotional factors seriously affect driving especially "pathological fugues — dreamlike states," senile deterioration and in some cases "sheer lack of intelligence and incapacity to understand the simplest regulations."

ASU MEMBER CHARGED

WITH DESERTION

NEW YORK (LNS)—Pfc. c. Terry Klug, an AWOL GI who was arrested at Kennedy Airport on Jan. 16, has been charged with desertion by the Fort Dix authorities. Klug was returning from Paris, where he had been active for over a year as an organizer for the American Servicemen's Union (ASU) and Resisters Inside the Army (RITA).

Klug returned to the U. S. because he felt he would be most effective here. Under the Anderson decision of Military Court of Appeals, he faces a possible death sentence as a deserter.

SCIENTISTS CALL STRIKE

WASHINGTON (LNS)—Scientists for Social and Political Action (SSPA), an "anti-establishment" group of scientists striving to gain intellectual and political freedom within their profession, has called for a halt to research March 4 on American campuses.

The action is being called to "encourage scientists and engineers to scrutinize political and moral considerations before working on research financed by the military and to point out the shortage of non-military research opportunities." Teachings are also being planned at Yale and MIT.

INTERVIEW WITH A YOUNG INDIAN

ALBUQUERQUE, N. M. (LNS)—Dale Suazo is a 17-year-old Acoma-Taos Indian (which means one of his parents is from the Acoma Pueblo and the other from the Taos Pueblo in Mexico.)

He is in his last year at Valley High School here in Albuquerque. On Jan. 27, he was suspended from school because he refuses to cut his hair—anglo style.

As he was told by his principal, "If you want to be an Indian, go over to the Indian school. If you want to have long hair, you can carry a drum and wear a feather headdress and go over there (to the Indian school.)"

The following is a short interview with Dale in which he tells why he decided to draw the line.

LNS: Are you the only one in your school protesting the hair rule?

Dale: No, last year a group of us started a petition about leaving our hair long. The chicano and white kids signed it. In fact, the majority of the kids in the school signed it, too. We presented it to the principal. He read it and it was like there was no effect. He tore it up.

LNS: How many Indian students are at Valley High?

Dale: There are 63 in the whole school. Most of the Indian students are Navaho. (The majority of Navaho Indian students live in strict regimentation at Albuquerque's Indian school . . . a boarding school.) The rest of the student body is about half chicano and half white. The white students signed this petition because they were being hassled about their long hair too.

LNS: So what happened this year?

Dale: We started another petition like last year. But it hadn't had too much success. They kept bugging us all year to get our hair cut. But I just decided not to.

Then at lunch one day last week, we were just about starting eating when all of a sudden Mr. White, the principal, comes in one of the doors. He looks around and acts like he doesn't see us and goes around the room. Finally, he came down to us and says, "O. K., lets go." He took us over to his office and one of the kids that was with me tried to get away. They chased him literally all over the school and finally captured him in the Art Room. Then they brought us all down there to the office.

As soon as he got through talking to me he said, "Get the hell out of here and get a decent hair cut or else don't come back at all." He also said if he sees me on the school grounds he will call the cops and personally sign the papers. So I thought it best that I leave school.

LNS: What happened after you left school?

Dale: I don't know what happened to the other boys, but I went home and told my sister. She called her friend Doc D'Oisey (Doc is an Onondago Indian of Iroquois League who is studying at the University of New Mexico. He wears his hair Indian style in wrapped braids) and they made an appointment to see the principal later on that same afternoon.

When we went, he was really mad. He acted like we were nobody. He wouldn't even talk to us even though my sister had made an appointment. He said, "Since you don't have a hair cut, we have nothing to talk about." So Doc insisted that we had the right to talk to him since he had agreed to

the appointment. Then White says, "O.K., I'll only give you five minutes." And we talked and that is when he made the statement about my going back to the Indian school and carrying a drum if I want to wear long hair.

LNS: What did you tell him during your "five minutes?"

Dale: I talked about my Indian heritage. That among our Indian people it is an honor for our people to have long hair. I guess he couldn't grasp it. He talked about why the hair rules were made in the school system. He says that long hair attracts "undue attention." We said that girls have long hair. It doesn't cause undue attention. Its just that the male role always has to have short hair and most people have accepted this.

But it's just not accepted among our Indian people. People who have long hair are honored. I want to have long hair because so many of our people are being changed to the white man's system, thinking like the white man. But I don't believe that way. One thing we should hold on to at least is our Indian tradition of wearing long hair and other religious aspects. He just couldn't grasp that. We didn't have anything else to talk about, so we just decided to leave.

LNS: Besides the religious basis for long hair, is there a cultural tradition?

Dale: Yes, among our people to have long hair is a sign of manhood. It is a sign that a boy has grown to be an adult man. Men of the Acoma Pueblo "club" their long hair into a "chon-go" wrapped in yarn or woven material. Men of the Taos Pueblo wear long braids wrapped tight with yarn or hide or material like that. During most of our ceremonies, the men wear that. During most of our ceremonies, the men wear their hair loose down their backs.

LNS: What did you do after your appointment with the principal?

Dale: Well, Doc and minister and me came to see Shirley Witt to see if we could figure out where to go from her. (Shirley Witt was one of the founders of the National Indian Youth Congress and is of Iroquois descent.) Then we went to see Reis Tijerina at the Alianza and he gave us full support. He had two of his people come back with all the rest of us, my mother included now, to see Mr. White again. When he saw us this time, he seemed all reasonable and nice, but he denied he had said anything to me about going back to Indian school. He still insisted that I couldn't come back to school until my hair was cut.

LNS: I understand you went to the school board. What happened there?

Dale: Well, we went there and I was going to make a speech something like, "Mr. Chisolm (Superintendent of Schools), I need your help. I have been expelled from school because my hair is too long, according to my principal. I would like to know if he has the right to do this thing. My father had long hair, my grandfather and my great-grandfather. Among our Indian people, long hair is a sign of honor."

Well, all I could get out, after I raised my hand was, "Mr. Chisolm, I need your help, I have been expelled . . ." Then he cut me off. While I had been talking he didn't even have the decency to turn around and face me. He just said, "Well, this is an administrative matter that Mr. Dixon is supposed to take care of. We don't have anything to do about these things." They just sort of dismissed us.

LNS: What do you plan to do from here?

Dale: An ACLU lawyer, John Walker, got in touch with me and he would really be interested in taking it to court. He thinks we have a good case since it has to do with Indian tradition.

LNS: Just a final question—what is the reaction of Indian students when the textbooks and teachers distort Indian tradition and history in the classroom?

Dale: Well, we talk about it among ourselves a lot, but we never get a chance to do anything about it. I mean the teachers are always too busy and I guess they wouldn't listen anyway.

*Weddings have increased from 1,302,000 in 1934 to an estimated 2,000,000 in 1968 with U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare projections estimating 2,170,000 in 1970.

*Each year brides outspend the other "big spenders" (girls 19-25) by more than 14 to one.

*Wedding dresses alone are estimated to have a \$50 million market potential and the trousseau market is put at \$162 million.

And the sponsors know it. The Bridal Fair was the first for New York, though such lucrative activity has been staged in most smaller cities and towns on Valentine's Day weekend for years. It was felt that New Yorkers were too sophisticated for this crude display. An assumption proven wrong, to the thinly disguised glee of Modern Bride Photographers, Sachs Quality Stores, New York Blue Cross/Blue Shield, Northeast Airlines, Ramal-Vincent-Orchestras, Maxim Freeze-Dried Coffee, the Chase Manhattan Bank, Brides' Magazine, Aeronaves de Mexico, Bahamas Tourism, International Coffee, Inc. and Radio WMCA. Behind Pepsodent smiles, "bridal experts" cheerfully battered the fears,

self-doubts and emotional needs that modern media had created in the thousands of young women attending into tangible commodities, and sold them back at a profit.

Beribboned, miniskirted, golden-streaked damsels by the thousands pushed and poked to grab the hand-outs in the bridal booths, stuff raffle tickets into their respective slots, consider Florida honeymoons via Northeast Airlines, dial-a-decorator from Sachs to plan their decorating needs, negotiate low-cost personal loans from you-know-who, hire a band, and fill out Modern Bride's bridal books purchased at \$2.50 a copy. He then introduced WMCA's other Good Guys. Chuck Browning, "The Chucker," took the mike long enough to apologize for the WITCH demonstration and to speculate that the WITCHes were "teed off because nobody ever proposed to them."

The morning's panel discussion consisted of a male doctor, a male clergyman, a male banker, a male dial-a-decorator and a lady from Brides' Magazine. She (Barbara Donovan) explained that being a wife today is overwhelming. You have to be a "lover, mother, friend, helpmate, gourmet cook and contribute to community affairs as well," so that "planning is very important."

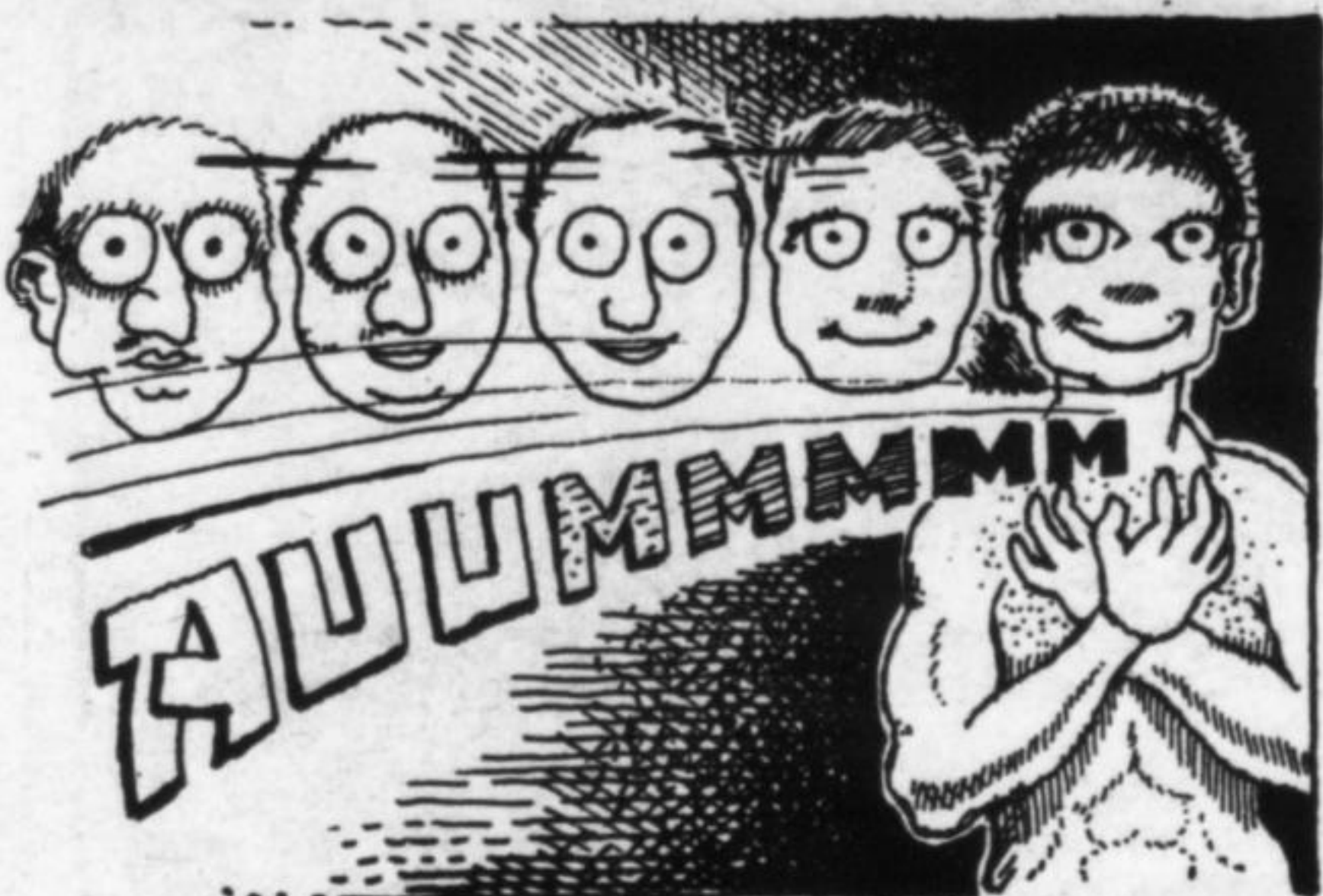
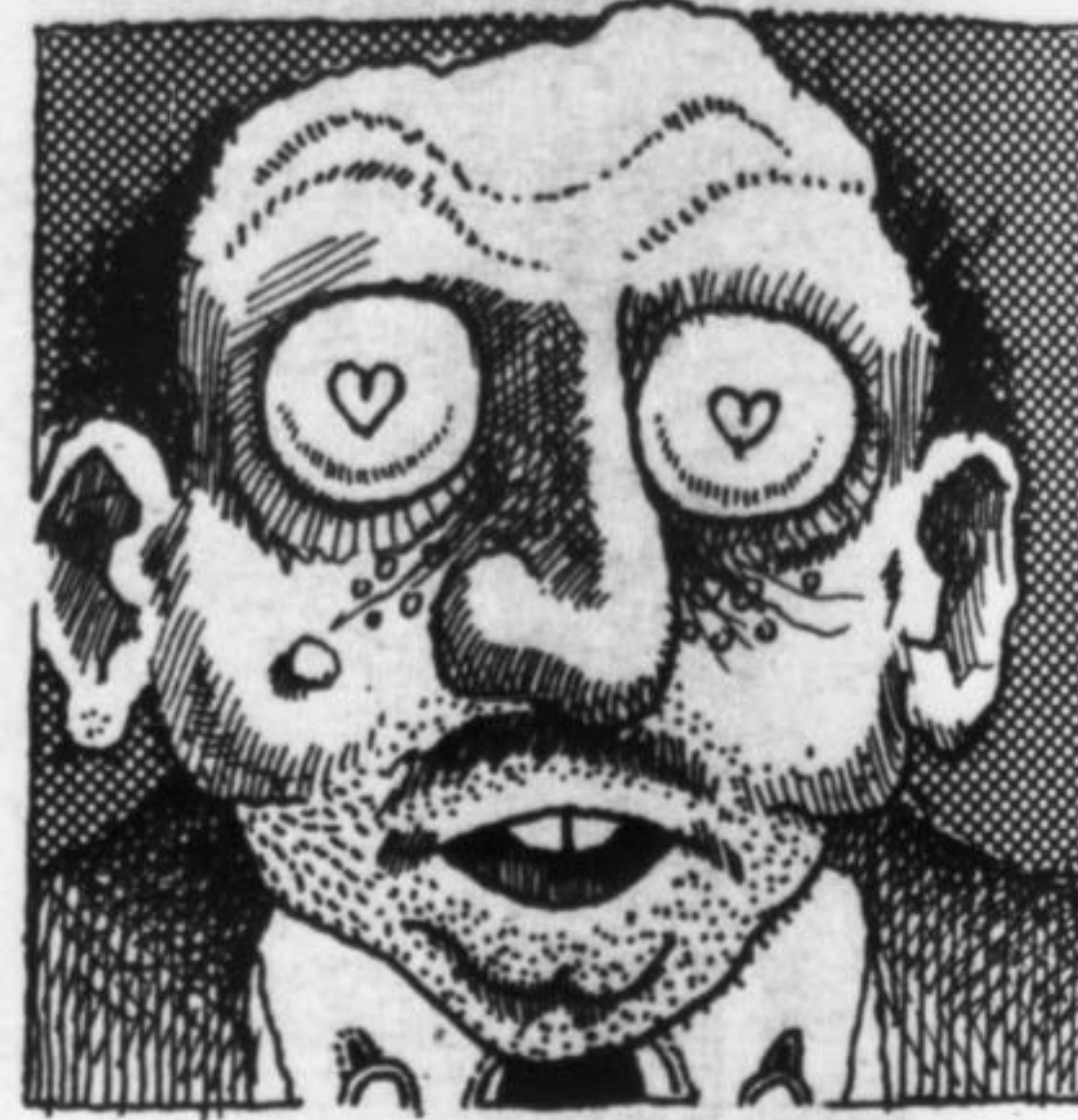
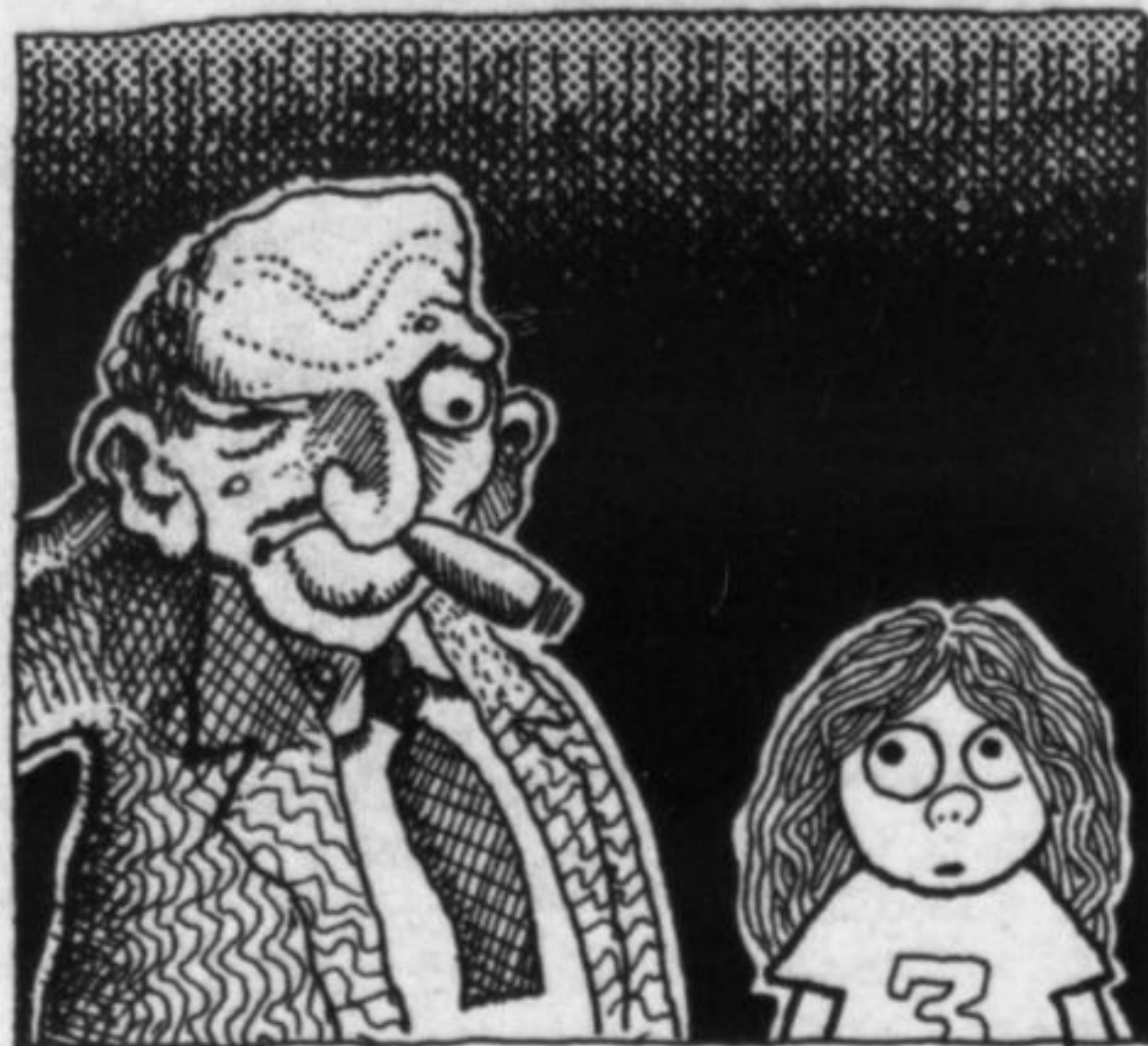
Man-doctor said, "Whether you use pills or some other birth control device, work out good lasting health habits through a frank and open talk with your family doctor."

WALL STREET IS QUAKING, fearful Nixon might mean what he said about favoring free enterprise on the stockmarket.

Although Wall Street is commonly regarded as "the capitol of capitalism, the fountainhead of the free enterprise system," one prominent broker explained, "The last thing we really want is free competition."

"If commission rates were competitive, we would make a lot less money."

In the confidential letter to big business that became a campaign issue last fall, Nixon advocated relaxing the regulatory function of the Securities Exchange Commission. Liberals were publically aghast at the idea, but privately, the brokers were the ones who spent the sleepless nights.

"The commission rates set by the SEC are comfortably high," the broker said — "much higher than they would be if there were competition." At present, theoretically, commission charges are uniform for all investors at all firms. This is true in practice for all small investors, but there are sometimes illegal rebates to big clients (this reporter was once asked to act as an intermediary to make such an offer, from petty broker to fat cat).

Most likely, the brokers are worrying needlessly, however, for my Washington sources say Nixon never really intended to loosen the SEC reins, after all.

Meanwhile, the "Paper Crisis" weighs more heavily, threatening to

drag brokerage operations to a halt.

In the madness of trading (averaging 22.9 million shares a day in December), "fails" multiply — "inability to deliver a stock within the required five business days." Indeed, the broker said, "many securities vanish somewhere along the line" — never to be found. Although the NY Stock Exchange hired the Rand Corporation to find a computer-cure — "prevent chaos," in the words of The Times, the broker laughed: "There's chaos already."

Prospects are for a complete Wall Street shutdown of considerable duration later this year.

Impressed by the broker's sardonic attitude toward his business, I wondered aloud about why he does what he does. He admitted to being impaled on the horns of his standard of living: "I've thought of leaving many times, but I don't know how I could make as much money anywhere else."

MORTICIAN MARTY Ackerman (the Gallagher-bruited nickname has stuck) is in hot water after sinking Satevepost which he captained in its last days. Amid the ugly wreckage, Ack is accused of fraud in selling off Curtis properties at bargain rates — notably clandestine transfer of SEP, Holiday, Status, Jack & Jill to Perfect film, also run by him.

Immersed in numerous lawsuits ranging from a union action charging him with robbing the Curtis pension fund to a move by Curtis trustees to depose him as president, recover "illegally alienated assets." According to the Gallagher report, he is also expected to be collared by a troika of government agencies — SEC (for manipulations), FTC (alleged violation of subscribers' rights) and FCC (his unapproved presidency of Lin Broadcasting).

After stripping Curtis of nearly all its valuable properties, Mortician Marty boasted, when asked to comment on his work: "We have done a spectacular job."

IBM IS DOING ITS MIGHTIEST TO PUT EXTRA-LEGAL MUSCLE BEHIND ITS DEFENSE AGAINST ANTI-TRUST SUITS.

The last Justice Department act of the outgoing Johnson Administration was to file suit against IBM, in the wake of private anti-trust suits started by other businesses. IBM immediately responded with a stupendous nationwide newspaper buy, two pages of mock-innocence: "Believe some of the things you hear about the computer industry today and you might conclude IBM has sapped the vitality of the industry and monopolized it."

This "double-truck," as it's known in ad argot, reportedly ran in all key markets plus the 160 IBM towns — a 500-newspaper onslaught in one day.

Neither IBM nor its admen, Ogilvy & Mather, would reveal the \$\$ input, nor would they comment on the anti-trust suits. They simply say they are conducting a program to educate the public.

Look for IBM's advance to multimedia brainrinsing on an unprecedented scale.

TEACHING A MASTERFUL LESSON ON THE ETHICS OF JOURNALISM, the NY Times Mag billed Martin Mayer's shankery report on the teacher strikes as "The FULL and Surprising Story of Ocean Hill." — thus undoing claims for the book on which the article is based. (Conversely, the editor's note reads: "A book based on this article.")

The Rev. C. Herbert Oliver is bitter because the press gave no coverage to an Ocean Hill news conference called the next day to correct the "full story's" inaccuracies, distortions & omissions.

Anyone needing an antidote to this brand of journalism should read Richard Karp's "The Siege of Ocean Hill" in the January Interplay, the only swinging mag on international affairs.

AD CENSORSHIP BY HIP-IMAGE PUBLICATIONS — a mounting prob-

lem to the Underground. The Village Voice, still promoting itself as an anti-establishment organ, simultaneously turns back ads mentioning sexual organs. According to VV's double standard, works & pix permissible as editorial matter are taboo in advertising. Because VV doesn't want big-time advertisers to become unhappy about the company they keep, "We have the same advertising standards as the NY Times," ad manager Alexandra Fendrick declared . . . Likewise, Evergreen has bumped ads for alleged pornography as well as non-sexy copy which Barney Rosset personally dislikes, without disputing its accuracy or appropriateness.

"That's a publisher's prerogative, isn't it?" AM Allen Schluger asked . . . A pacesetter, Schluger has become something of a legend in the publishing world: once an aspiring opera singer, he now dashes about town on a motorcycle and has planted a great stone fountain in his living room. But seeming genuinely puzzled by the widespread belief that he wears a rare scent — not a cologne but a fine perfume, he quipped: "It must be my natural body odor."

TWO DROPUTS FROM THE PROFESSIONS, Ph.D physicist Richard Morris and statistician Len Fulton are the brains of COSMEP, co-op small mag e's & p's. Organized to promote & to distribute small press writing, the group has adopted a system of central billing on bookstore & library orders and is coming out soon with a handsome catalog to be distributed widely — more than 150 little mag-underground publishers represented.

But after getting a few small grants totaling several thousands \$\$, the founders are worried by "success." As Doug Blazek put it, "this might be the time when everyone is gonna start getting fussy about formalities & procedures, thus making the organization more formal & stifling — drooling for success & \$\$." In other words, it might be heated for the

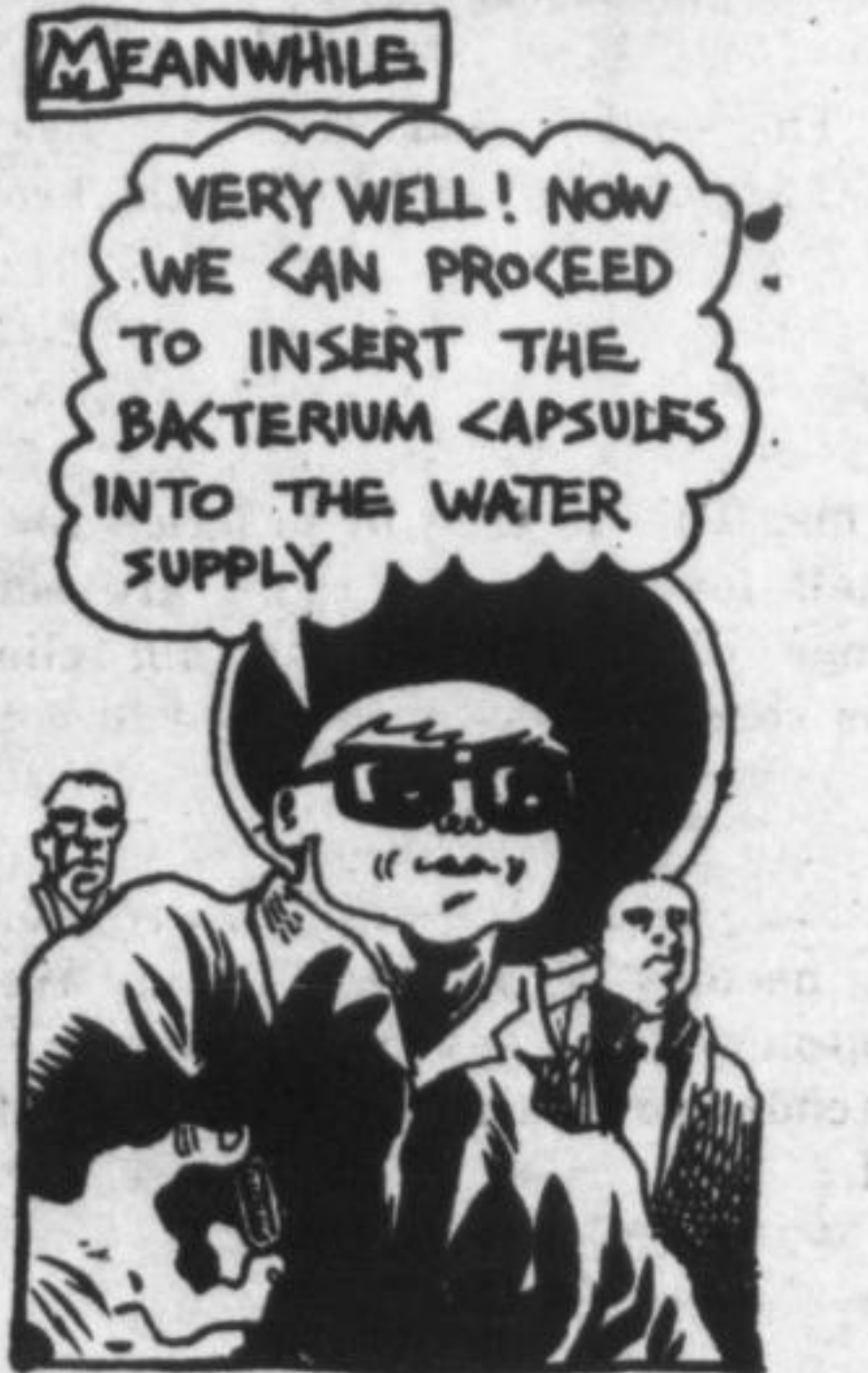
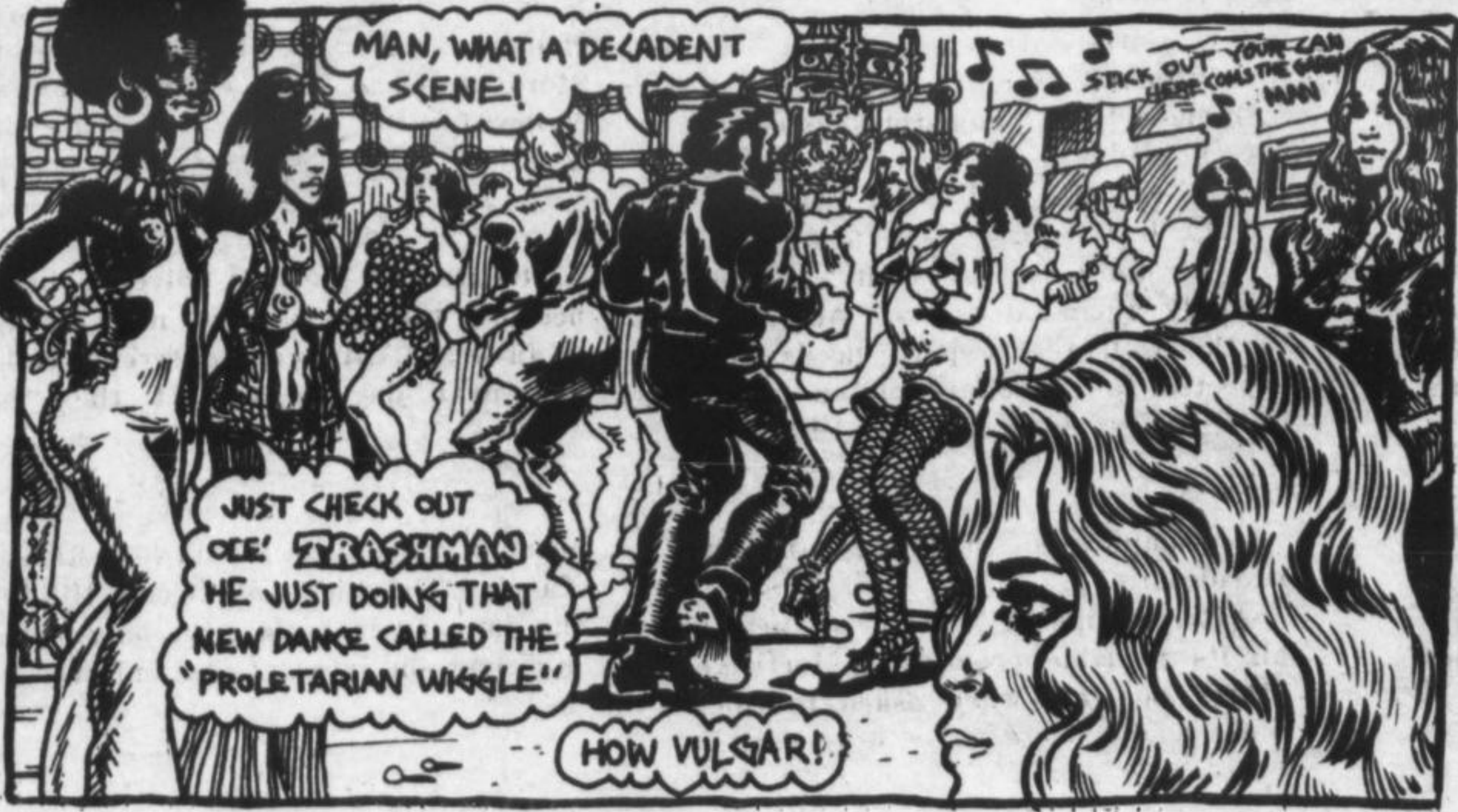
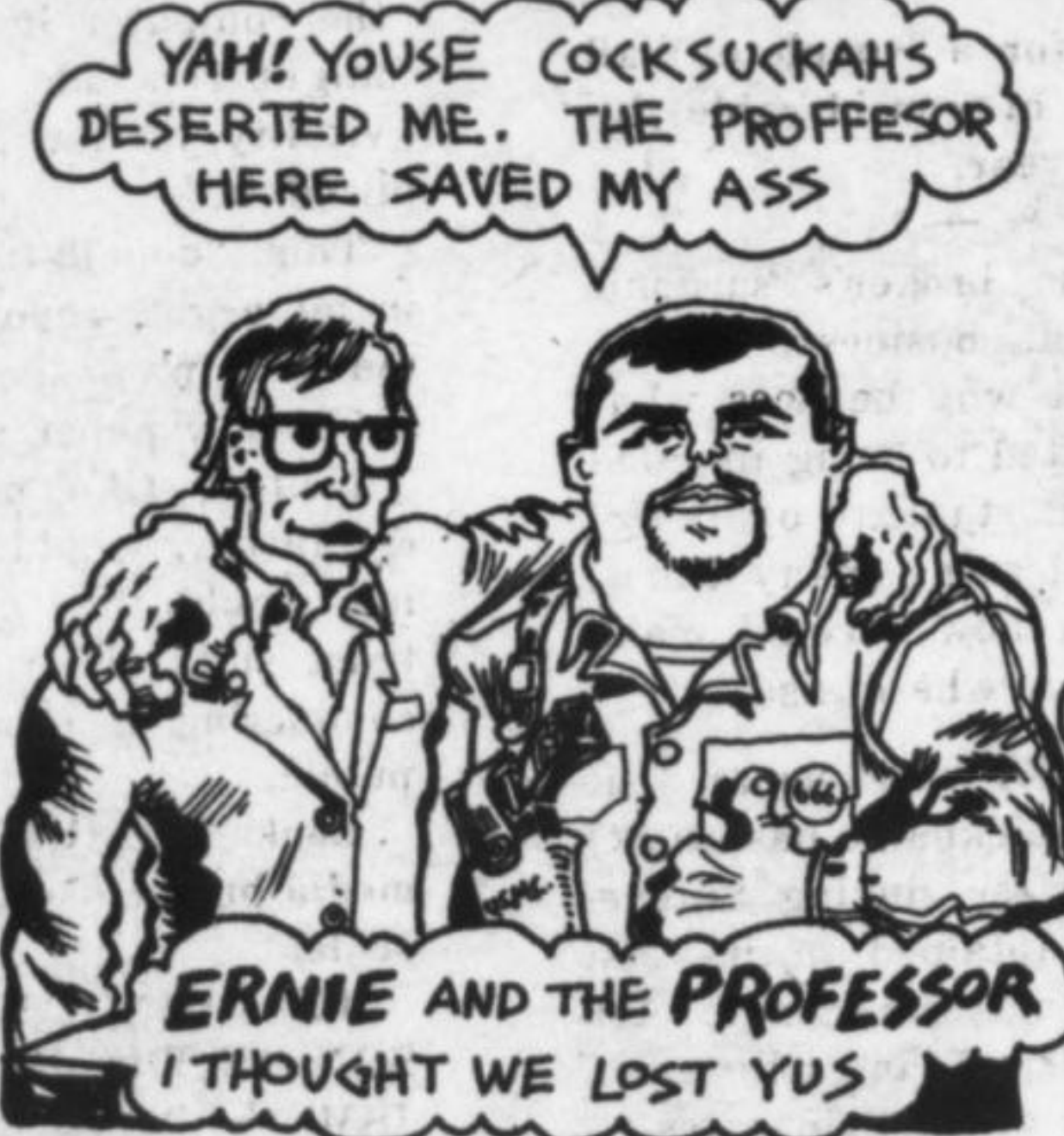

Armed with a half-ass recollection of all the Mothers albums and a slightly clearer memory of the covers, I went to find Frank Zappa to ask for an interview — which wasn't hard to do, there he was guest lecturing in Carman Moore's Pop Music Course at the New School . . . He spoke in low tones, high gear, giving absolutely straight-on answers to all those questions, and managing to soften the few retorts with a pause-for-identification smile so all would know it wasn't a put-down; a news conference with a favorite son who also happens to be The Leader. Questions about the music, about favorite anecdotes, True or False, about politics: How does he reconcile his position of being in big business (Warner-distributed Bizarre Records) with his advice to stay free; What does he think of the German radical students . . .? but why doesn't he think they're great? And doesn't he feel that Rubin and the Jets is not so revolutionary as Lumpy Gravy ("a little too smooth and creamy . . .?") And etcetera. I kept score smiling, clapping and giving points in my head through some of the sheer tedium of it all — which is not boredom — tedium also applies to good things which are held overlong until capacity is exhausted and you're tired, so you invent games to keep the spectator sport from going stale. Which is to say that the same questions asked and re-asked and hacked apart, no matter what aleatory factors may be involved, just have to reach an end of interesting answers. And how many times would you like to have to explain why you like to do musical parodies, like to play 50's rock, and happen to feel that burning up buildings is not a particularly intelligent action . . .

Rather than report the Q and A that went on, here are some random quotes, and you can figure out which ones are Zappa and which are the audience. A perfect score proves you can read.

"One boy wrote from Vietnam, 'I can kill and feel nothing; can you use me?'"

"I think you're really human."

"We don't want to legitimize the system."

"Individuals must act—all over the place . . . you need smart people for a revolution."

(. . . We still live in times when humanity is still worth commenting about, I guess, although no doubt someday it will be each according to his ability and need . . .)

So I went and asked him for an interview, which turned out to be in-between sets on Saturday — not very brightly accepted on my part: just for the experience, try to talk to anyone backstage at the Fillmore, sitting on the nearest thing to a chair — the floor — right off the stairs, and try to remember not that you are talking to a musician who is in between sets, doesn't know you and wants to go have a little time to himself. (If you remember, you start mumbling and stuttering; if you don't remember, you'll soon be reminded by long silences and a definite sense of time-being-wasted which permeates the already smoky, chock-full air.)

His daughter is named Moon Unit because: Those were his instructions.

In re Rolling Stone "Groupies" Issue: He didn't say almost any of that. I get A Quote: "Groupies are a very important indicator of the growing sexual revolution-and a gross convenience for musicians"; I read it back, get a correction; "Are you going to misquote too?" and still, now that it is in print have a sneaky suspicion that something is probably not right. Oh well . . . New York was the next topic. The less said the better . . . Something was definitely wrong; anytime you are accused of

being an expert on something, know it's time to stop. So we did, and I went to get us coffee, thinking to myself, sniff, that New York wasn't all that bad.

Outside; thousands of ticketholders, non-ticketholders, drunks and freaks and generally non-helpful types were packed into a line which stretched around the block . . . Clutching all the coffee and danish I went around to the stage door, knocking and cursing and managing to attract attention all on the wrong side of the door. Inside, through the keyhole, I could see absolutely calm bare stage, no one in sight. Of course. On my side, outside, however, I got help, I guess. Some kids came over and decided to help me get in, and go in with me. I decided to go around the front way instead, and suddenly discovered that I was in an either/or/or situation: Either I stayed or they ripped my pants zipper or they grabbed the coffee. Or they stayed, ripped my pants zipper and grabbed the coffee. Kierkegaard would have appreciate the nonambiguity of the situation. Anyway, minus a zipper and a coffee, but — New York girl that I am — retaining my pants and danish I got around to the front entrance and began to get on line (on mob? on crowd?) when a cop told me I had to get on the back of the line — which was right at the stage door, at that time. Naturally, neither of us expected me to pay any attention, so I delicately walked in back of him and got on line where he couldn't see me. By the time I got back inside and downstairs where it turned out, Zappa was listening to tapes, Audie Murphy and I were blood brothers.

On the tape was the last rap from the first set, a bit about the high-school Senior and Junior Prom and picking up your date and looking shaarrp, and getting Robitussin and Romilar and wine and name-it, and . . . you get the idea. It was a perfect creation, catching those moments in high school when just about everything was illegal and prohibited and shaarrp, yeah. And because we still live in times when people have to be amazed that someone is human, I was glad I had gotten the coffee and danish for him because it reassured me that I was capable of simple human actions too.

The MOMA has been running a show of animation films, and sometime ago I saw some excellent ones by Don Duga and his wife, Irene. Both were part of a night of animated flicks at The Cubiculo, West 51st Street. Don Duga's films use collage in a highly explosive manner; a film like *Jungle Madness* which uses a Beate soundtrack and incredible fantasy-images, mainly animals, but all related to the human-dimensioned consciousness which made them visible. Don works in a most psychological manner, using color sound and split-second multiple images to establish a strong stream-of-consciousness thread to his work. Another film is called *What In The World* and it's whatever in the world one woman might fantasize about, complete with men, horses, and images fading into others. Mr. Duga draws, paints and collages, rephotographing quite often, using strobes fades-in and out, etc., all for the freshest effect. I wish feature-length movies made as much use of reality's chance and simultaneity as Mr. Duga does in his shorts . . . Irene Duga's film's are at the same time more mysterious and less complicated than her husband's. One film consists of a woman in childbirth position, legs spread, and images throbbing, pulsating out and in and around to a strange, beautiful soundtrack which manges to moan and sing in its own voice as well as echoing the movie's thought patterns. Children, people, mothers and the

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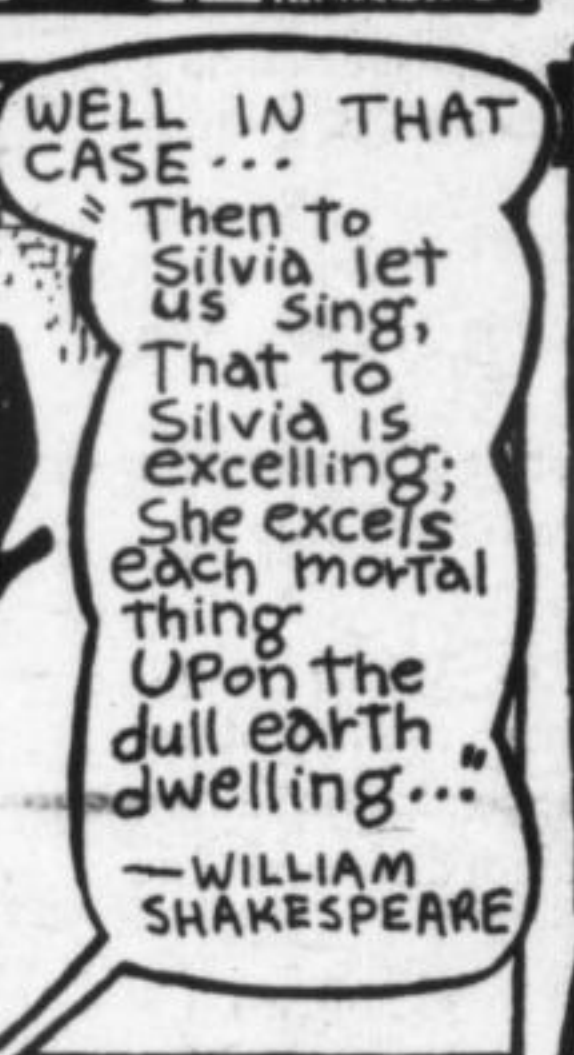
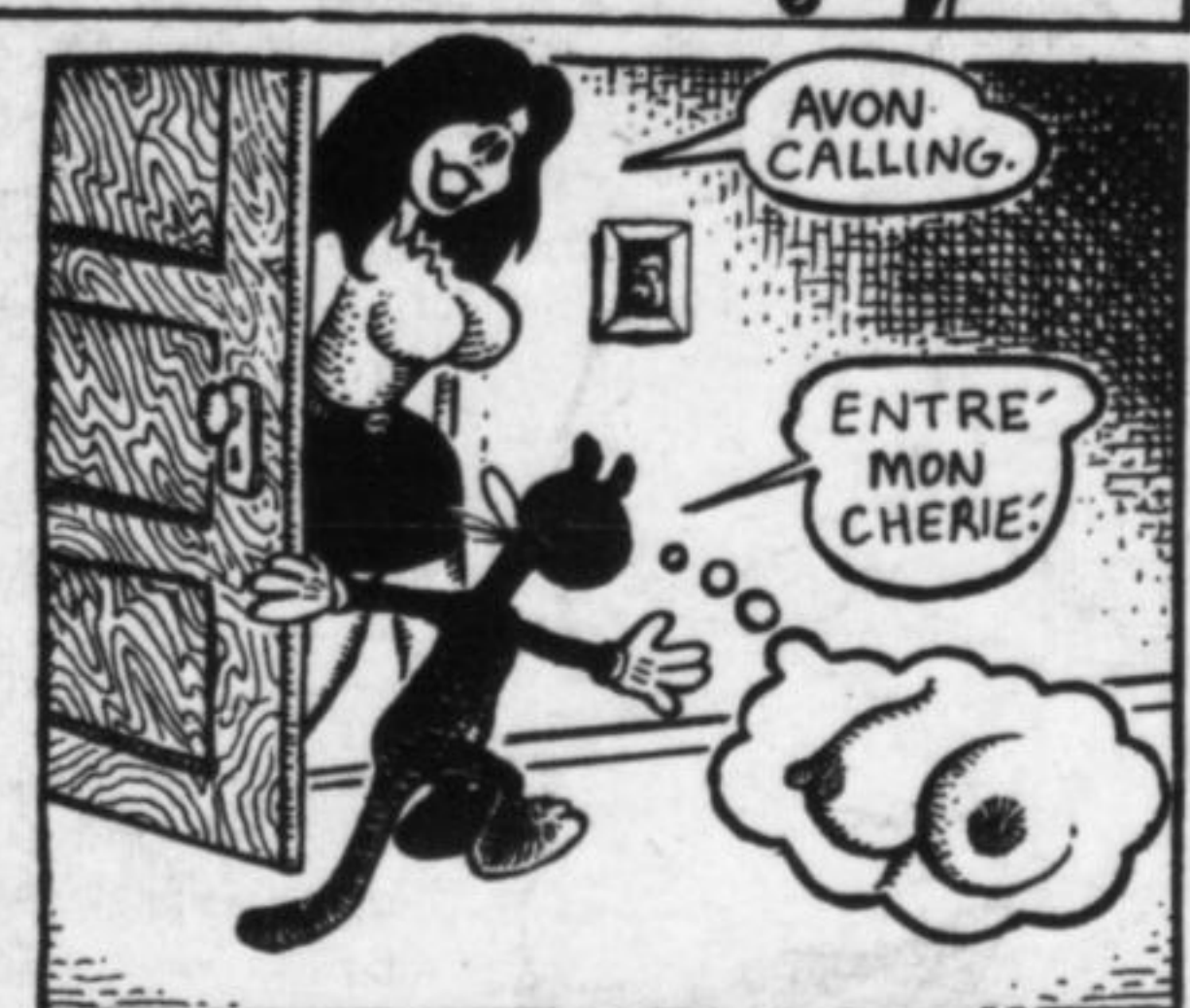
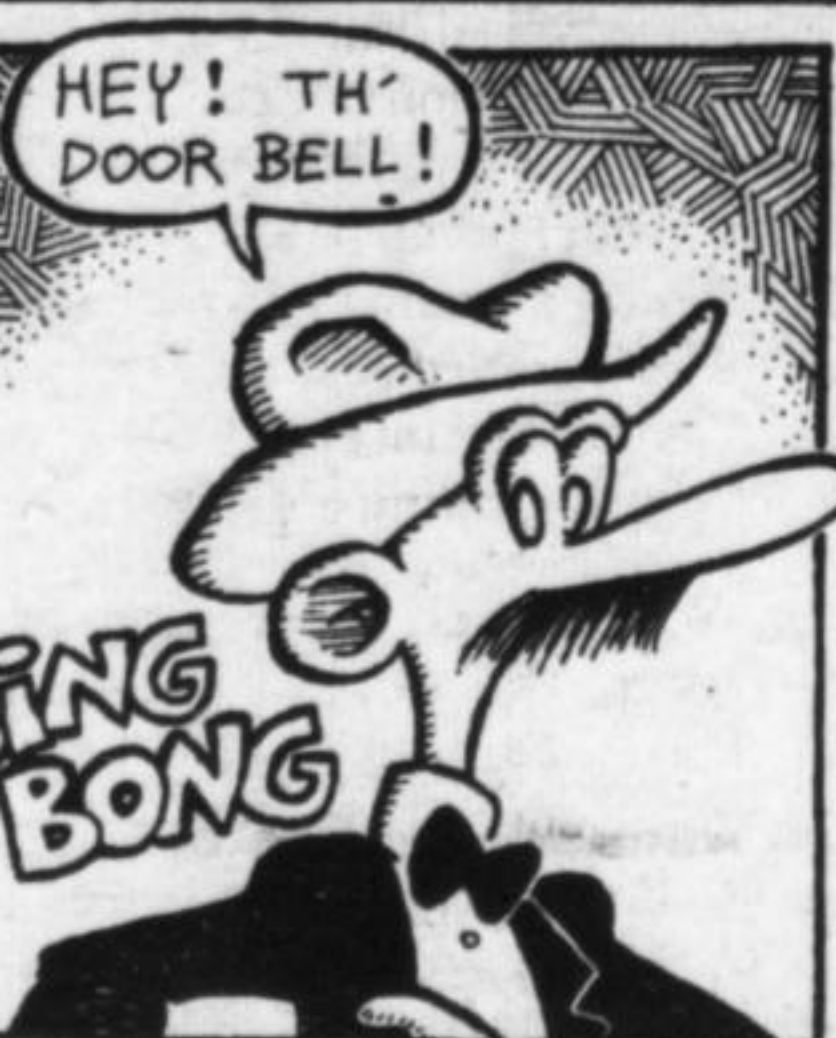

HIPPOCRATES

QUESTION: Everytime me and my boy-friend have intercourse, I always bleed a lot. It gets to be a real hangup because there is an awful lot of blood which gets all over the sheets, etc.

None of my other girlfriends have this problem and I was wondering if something could be wrong with me. Or is this normal in some people? Please advise because I'm worried.

ANSWER: Vaginal bleeding would be normal only the first few times you had intercourse; many girls do not have vaginal bleeding even the first time they have intercourse.

A gynecologic examination should determine the cause of this abnormal bleeding. Don't delay seeing your family doctor or gynecologist. Your county medical association or nearest medical school can recommend a physician or clinic in your area.

Here's some good news for those of you who have been worried about the status of your chromosomes. The largest and most scientifically valid study of the LSD-chromosome question has recently been completed and will soon appear in SCIENCE. The double-blind study concludes that there is no difference in the chromosomes of LSD users and non-LSD users. Another shuck.

MEDICAL WORLD NEWS for Feb. 7, 1969, reports the Federal government has sponsored 49 marijuana research projects. In order to supply pot for these projects, the government has let the following contracts: three contracts to produce synthetic pot or THC (tetrahydrocannabinol), two contracts to test THC production methods, one to determine which components of marijuana smoke enter the user's system, and a contract to the University of Mississippi to grow five varieties of weed on ten acres of top-secret land. Let's see now . . . Gulfport Gold, Biloxi Boo, Anslinger Red . . . any other ideas?

WARNING: Several 1969 model American cars have front bumpers shaped like battering rams or spears. The worst example I've seen is the 1969 Pontiac. The A.M.A., which supposedly supports automobile safety, regularly features ads for the '69 Pontiac-spear on the back page of its weekly newspaper. They declined to print my letter to the editor protesting their support of this dangerous weapon.

Another curious liason is the longstanding love affair between the A.M.A. and the drug industry which annually pays 12 million for ads in the JAMA.

When John F. Kennedy was taken dead or dying to Parkland Hospital in Dallas, he was first examined by a surgical resident physician who reported the President had been shot by a bullet entering the front of his neck. Confirmation of the route of this bullet was later shown by the famous 8mm films in which JFK is seen standing in his open limousine, both hands held to the front of his neck.

Now it's important to explain that a bullet entering a body leaves a small wound, but when it leaves the body, it causes a much larger, gaping hole. Any second year medical student should be able to tell the difference between an entry and exit wound of a bullet. The physician who first examined JFK had seen many bullet wounds. Q. The reason for this letter is that I've never seen this idea satisfactorily refuted, and I'd be most interested in your reaction. Basically, the idea is that all occult phenomena, with the possible exception of a few closely allied matters such as teleportation and materialization (matter matters!), can be subsumed under the heading of precognition. Let me give you a few simple, even corny examples. John Doe gets out the family ouija board and asks deceased Uncle Wilberforce where he hid that sock full of \$20 gold pieces. Planchete says "Lift up the floorboard next to the hearth." Sure enough, there is the loot. Was it really a message from Wilberforce or some pal of his, or simply John's automatism, controlled by a precognition that the sock would be found under the board? Richard Roe locates a spring in a most unlikely place by dowsing. Does he have occult power, is the dowsing rod operated on by some occult force, or was his automatism under control of a precognition that water would be found when a hole was dug at a particular spot? . . . You can take it from here. Think of any psychic phenomenon, and see if you can't come up with a reasonable explanation based on precognition. And tell me why, if this is the case, that we shouldn't respect the law of parsimony and call all these phenomena precognition rather than compartmentalizing them as shamanism, dowsing, contacting discarnate spirits with the ouija board, etc.? M.S.

Dear M.S.: - First of all, thanks for what is without doubt the most literate and amusing letter I've received since starting this column; it was like a breath of fresh air. I regret that I couldn't quote all 3 pages of it. I enjoy all the letters I get — I even genuinely enjoy reading the writings of confused children and nitwits, and derive some wry amusement from the often anonymous outpourings of outraged materialists; but it's a pleasure to get a letter from someone who knows something about the subject. Alas, however, if all writers knew as much as you, my comments would be superfluous.

As in this case, I have heard your theory before, and it makes a goodly amount of sense. My only cavil with this theory is — what does it matter what the possessors of these powers — or those who can summon them up at will — call these powers, if their name for such a power makes it work? Like a clear breath of fresh air after the "garbage can music" being peddled lately, the dangerous sound and antics of Frank Zappa and cronies invaded the hallowed Fillmore Theatre on second avenue last weekend. Disguised as a rock and roll band, their act encompassed everything from avant-garde jazz to opera to syrupy rock of the 50's (documenting the beginning of contemporary folk music as we know it today). With an opening 10 minutes of tuning and chatter to sort of get closer to his audience and antagonize the handful of irritated bourgeoisie in attendance (who headed for the exits), Zappa soon made it apparent that he is probably the strongest leader in music today and finds the universal sound through displaying the validity of all musical styles and showing that they are all really the same. At each performance he used a different theatrical show to display

his music. Late Friday night he opened with an alleged scientific-finite math professor reading from a technical textbook about time-space relationships. From this the band gradually began to accompany his reading until gradually the professor forgot about his textbook and become totally engrossed in playing a recorder handed him by Zappa. From this point of departure the band displayed some of the most demanding, direct and emotionally involving music being heard today. Zappa also revealed the dynamic talent as an out front vocalist-dancer of James "Motorhead" Sherwood who previously had been wandering about playing principally saxophone, harmonica, and tambourine. Doing a phenomenal boogaloo and displaying a funky, gritty vocal styling, Sherwood freaked the audience with a shaking epileptic-fit dance.

The Mothers are a welcome relief from the deluge of low energy pop which gets jacked off to by the dudes week after week just because they don't know any better. They read about it in the paper, see and hear the ads, hear the music on the radio and soon think "Super Session" really is. Some of the most awful shift gets standing ovations often to the surprise of the nodding out performers. But who was ever known to turn down a standing ovation and soon the surprised musicians begin to believe they deserve the

ovations without having to get down for the people. As Brother John Sinclair of the MC-5 has said, "The American and to a worse degree the British rock and roll scene is an enormous hype created by greedy personal managers, clubowners, record company executives, producers, public relations men and (for the most part) innocent or ignorant young musicians who go along with the program because they don't know any better." And the music columnists, who should offset hype generally endorse it. People just need to get their hands and ears on the right information. The music today (for most part) just isn't far out enough for the people who are digging it.

More and more hands are attempting to determine their own destiny. The Mothers is the definitive example. They played to sellout performances at The Fillmore without airplay on Top 40 or progressive rock stations in New York. The Mothers, king of Bizarre are being joined by a host of outragenous far-out units infiltrating the culture and destroying millions of minds in the process. Among them are the Fugs, the trio from Trans-Love Energies in Ann Arbor, Michigan — the MC-5 (who the Fillmore will not book), the UP, and the Psychedelic Stooges, as well as a host of acts signed to Zappa's record label (Bizarre). The popularity of these bands with virtual blacklisting by the fascists who run the airways is an indication of the demand for more far out music and theatre. "Being crazy — the only valid reason for being alive during times like these."

The MC-5's album has surged onto the charts (even though banned in many stores) but the single, "Kick Out The Jams", will no doubt not become a major hit due to its blacklisting in the major AM outlets such as New York (WMCA), who stopped playing it after finding out that Motherfucker was on the album.

Bizarre Records has signed five more artists to exclusive recording contracts, according to an announcement by Frank Zappa and Herb Cohen, founders of the label. The new artists are Judy Henske, Jeff Simmons, Captain Beef-

heart, the GTO's (Girls Together Outrageously); and Alice Cooper. The Mothers and Bizarre Records are now being distributed by Reprise which should be an improvement over MGM.

Cynthia, the infamous Plaster Caster came to New York last week minus her partner. It seems they have severed their partnership and Cynthia is in need of another partner to take care of giving the clients head while the casts are being prepared. A cast of Gerald Malanga at Warhol's factory was postponed due to lack of hot water. Everyone seems interested in helping Cynthia get into business. Some think she should do her work for the public. Others are interested in a number of schemes among them the manufacturing of lollipop casts of famous stars' members.

Jason, notorious servant-houseboy and central figure in the film "Portrait of Jason", is now being shared by Mickey Ruskin and Steve Paul. Steve Paul and Johnny Winter are both in Nashville where the albino bluesman is to record for Columbia. Steve has been busy in recent weeks creating a dubious life style in New York for the shy wraith-like blues singer-guitarist, who allegedly signed for \$300,000.

The Flying Burrito Brothers, composed chiefly of ex Byrds and International Submarine Band are holding forth for death defying patrons at Steve Paul's legendary Scene.

A new Underground paper is starting in New Jersey. Called "The Paper", it will cover the Hudson County area (Jersey City, Hoboken, Bayonne etc.). The first issue leaves the presses this Thurs. Affiliated with the paper is a concert (the first of a series) on Thurs. the 27 at the Loews Theatre in Journal Square in Jersey City featuring John Mayall, Procol Harum and a local blues band-Orange.

Poignant singer-composer Tim Hardin is at The Cafe Au Go Go until Sat. On Sunday James Stevenson's Jazz Circle will display the "auto physio psychic" phenomena of their sound at Au Go Go at a 4 o'clock matinee.

Last week, New York's Republican Senator Jacobs Javits embarked on a new crusade. Together with twelve medical school deans, he announced the formation of a select committee to look into possible instances of hunger in the Empire State. In announcing the program, Javits confidently predicted that only isolated instances of malnutrition would be found because of what he termed "the State's efficient welfare program."

To tens of thousands of New York's migrant farm workers, the Senator's pious pronouncements must seem like a pathetic joke. For hunger and the other manifestations of poverty are daily facts of life in the rural communities of Long Island and upstate New York.

Typical of these communities is Fredonia, a small town of 8,000. Located some 40 miles southeast of Buffalo, the town is a study in paradox. The progressive Grange movement was born here. But the town is also the center of one of the most primitive forms of exploitation to be found in the United States, the migrant system.

Just outside Fredonia, there is a large chicken coop that a farmer decided was unsafe for his poultry. He moved out his chickens and without substantially altering the construction, made the coop into living quarters for 400 migrant farm workers. Its walls are still covered with chicken shit.

Four hundred men, women and children live in small 9 foot by 9 foot cubbyholes that are separated by plywood wall dividers and loose electrical wiring. The six showers on the first floor are considered a great luxury by the 400 people who use them. No one really seems to mind the fact that the water pipes run through the building's sewage. A family of four will pay \$60.00 per week for the privilege of living in the coops, and eating a diet that consists largely of rice and beans. In Fredonia values are clear: chicken are better cared for than human beings.

Every year nearly 6,000 Puerto Rican and Negro workers journey here in the hope of finding jobs and decent wages. What they find instead are migrant camps with conditions

similar to those of the chicken coop and hard stoop labor that permits them to take home \$200 or \$300 at the end of a six month picking season. They are the harvesters of New York's grapes of wrath.

I first came to Fredonia at the request of a student group that had been working with some of the area's grape pickers. They had spent a summer attempting to get better services for the migrants and helping them in forming an embryo union. While they were not successful in starting the union, they did succeed in getting some health care for sick workers and even managed to have one particularly horrible migrant camp condemned. The students hoped that I might be able to write an article on the migrant situation because "no one here seems to care how they live."

Wages for most of Chatauqua County's farm workers were not regulated by any minimum wage law. As a result most migrants were paid in the area of 50c an hour.

Hours were long — 12 hours a day, six or seven days a week. The farmers found many devices to separate the grape-pickers from their meager paychecks. A migrant would be required to live on the farmer's property in order to have the privilege of working his land. Rent and board were charged, and the farmer would make a healthy profit by collecting \$10 to \$14 per week for \$2 worth of rice and beans.

Hunger could be seen everywhere, as small children filled their bellies with potato peelings and coffee grinds.

The farmers of Chatauqua County are clever old men. To make certain that their migrants don't break camp before the harvest, they have devised a "bonus system." Simply put, the "bonus," is a portion of a farm worker's rightfully earned wages. The grower, however, holds onto these wages until the end of the picking season. If the worker lasts the season, he collects his "bonus." If not, well, too bad. In one case, a grape-picker worked the season through, but his bonus was forfeited when he suffered an appendicitis attack two days before the end of the harvest. Although the man urgently needed his money to pay medical bills, the farmer refused to pay. "Rules are rules," he said.

Child labor is also a fact of life in Fredonia, and it is commonplace to see children working the fields. Schools for the migrant children do not exist. The children have become quite adept at picking strawberries and beans, two of the area's alternate crops. Their labor is necessary to help a family eke out an income.

New York State and Commonwealth of Puerto Rico agencies are allegedly responsible for the inspection of migrant camp conditions and wages. But few migrants in Fredonia have ever seen an inspector and the camps testify to decades of neglect. One migrant leader suggested that the state agencies work in collusion with the farmers. He pointed to a sign retrieved from a New York State Employment Center that stated; "Jobs on farms: wages are higher. Good housing is available." "The farmers need cheap labor," the migrant leader said. "Many of them sit on state migrant committees and tell the state to put up posters like that. Men come here thinking they can make a decent living. When they get here they find out the truth.

Two years ago, a Bronx born migrant, Lares Tresjan, began to organize her fellow farm workers into a union. A farm worker for more than ten years, she had read about the successes of the United Farm Workers Organizing Committee in California and was anxious to develop a similar organization in Fredonia. At first, things went slow. Many migrants were intimidated by farmers. The students working with the union were threatened with violence. However, when two men were burned to death in the former tractor shed in which they were

living, the migrants community realized it was time to start building a union.

Organization went well for awhile. But lack of support from the labor movement ultimately ended that effort. Today Mrs. Tresjan spends most of her time trying to win better services for the farm workers. "Perhaps," she says hopefully, "after they win in California, they'll start caring about New York. After all, we are grape-pickers too."

Each winter hundreds of migrant families stay on in Fredonia. Often they remain in the hope of finding a well paying job in one of the local industries plants. However, many simply remain because they haven't enough money to return to Puerto Rico. For those who stay, the winter becomes a time of incredible suffering and hardship. It is not easy to be a Latin American in frozen Northwestern New York. The temperature rarely rises above 10 degrees and malnutrition and disease plague the community. Few migrants actually find factory jobs, and so life is even harder than it was in summer. The poverty is more extreme. Mrs. Tresjan once wryly remarked that for the migrant in Fredonia, life was more severe than in an underdeveloped country. "We eat less than the poor of India," she said.

Local officials are not particularly anxious to make the farm workers feel comfortable in Chatauqua County. They would much prefer that once the farm workers finish harvesting the crop, they hit the migrant trail. The result is that it is almost impossible for a farm worker to get welfare.

Two winters ago, Mrs. Tresjan applied for public assistance. She was persistent and explained that she had sought work. For three weeks, welfare payments came, but then they stopped. After making angry inquiries, she was told that her landlord, a farmer, had contacted the County officials with a job offer. Lares was to prune vines for a penny and a half per vine or approximately \$15 per week!

Since a migrant cannot receive welfare if a job is available, even if the job does not pay as much as welfare would bring, Mrs. Tresjan was thrown off public assistance to prune vines for \$15 per week. Because the temperature was near zero and because she didn't own adequate clothing for the cold weather, she could prune for only a few hours each day and earned a good deal less than that. Lares and her husband pruned in the cold for three weeks before receiving any pay and in the interim, they lived on yellow rice and recooked coffee grinds.

There are those in Fredonia who mean well and who sincerely would like to help migrants live a better life. However, their efforts are hampered by the narrowness of their own experiences and more often than not, their attempts are tragi-comic. One local church has a migrant committee whose members include many who own farms. One summer, the committee organized a "fiesta" for the migrants, spending \$80 on shrimp alone — at a time when many farm workers' families needed milk, meat and other basic foods.

Among the committee's other activities is the preparation of a "Welcome to Fredonia" kit, distributed each year to the new farm workers. As the families begin to settle into their filthy coops and sheds, cheerful white-haired ladies present them with plastic bags filled with soap and toothpaste.

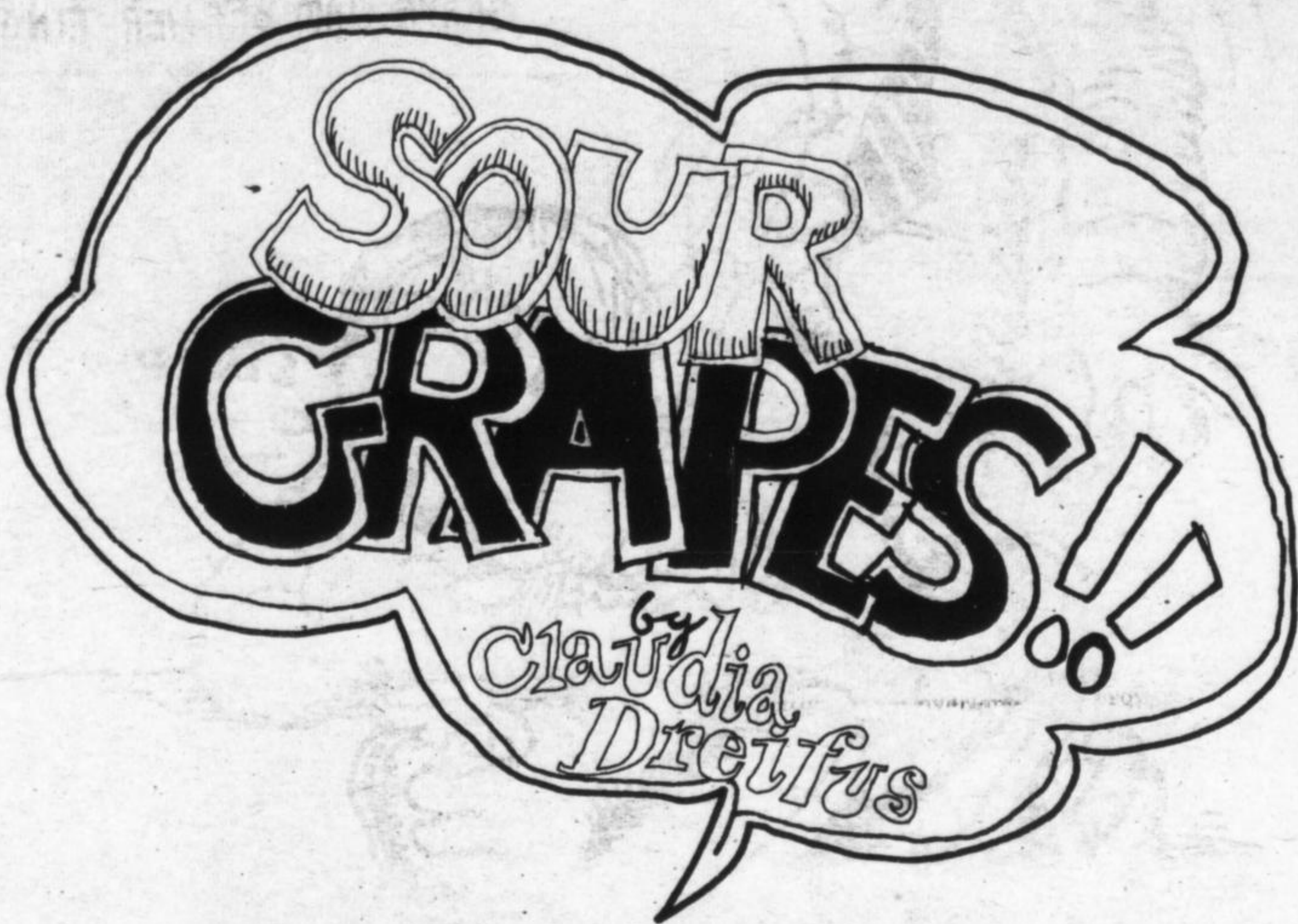
And then there is the clergyman assigned to the area. He was just enraged when he first saw the chicken coop described earlier. His solution was the organization of a team of divinity students who painted the place — chicken shit and all! A farm worker laughed at the yellow lumps on the cinder block walls, "I hear that he wants to put up orange curtains this year."

Fredonia is not a unique town. It is typical

of the hundreds of communities that prosper from the use of migrant farm labor. A poster in the town square announced that \$100,000 had been collected for the town swimming pool. (Farm workers will never swim in the pool: it is only accessible by car, and none of the migrants owns a car.) No one in the town seems to care that two miles away a shower must be shared by 400 people.

Starvation in New York? Senator Javits' little select committee may come up with some very surprising results. If hunger exists in

Chatauqua County, it also exists in the many other areas of this fair state that live by exploiting migratory labor. Suffolk County is filled with dozens of migrant camps that maintain conditions similar to those found in Fredonia. The Finger Lakes region famous for champagnes and sacramental wine, is also a center for incredible desperation. And just south of Fun City's summer playground, the Catskill Mountains, hundreds of onion pickers do backbreaking work for pennies an hour. Welcome to New York.

The sense of humor is subdued also, and instead of a certain freshness, there is vast femininity. These are the works of a woman — a comment I made to Mr. Duga who said he didn't think Irene would agree at all. Oh well; it does take difference to make a horse race.

I went to see *Romeo and Juliet* again and time hasn't staled that picture's variety, either. It is still as full and bursting as before, imperious and impatient, alive with perfect frames and Old Master colors and an Italian understanding of passion, no matter how young or old the lovers are. Part of the movies's very moving quality derives from the simplicity of the two lovers, their teeniebopper true love and comprehension of each other as perfection. One tries to forget the ending, which we all learned about in high school, and because the movie is so different from English class, sometimes you may even succeed; just as being told about orgasm is hardly the same as the reality itself, the movie has the extra dimensions vision and understanding can give to any theory. ELDRIDGE CLEAVER IS BEING HIDDEN IN A SOUTH-OF-THE-BORDER COUNTRY.

The FBI is thought to know the whereabouts of the Peace & Freedom fugitive, but no move against him is expected because of the political explosions which would be detonated.

The Newsletter learned a noted black literary agent is planning to meet the revolutionary leader for Lit Biz talks. The development came after Cleaver made contact through the black underground with friends in New York.

delusional system, acts as the gateway for her own clairvoyance, which her waking personality of Eileen Garrett cannot do; and that is what is important, not what psychologists choose to call the phenomenon. By their fruits ye shall know them, and so forth.

Q. The other evening I uncovered some metal rods, each about five inches in length, and seemingly of stainless steel. There were 39, 11 short of the amount for casting the I Ching. slender line technique, his nearly-transparent forms sculptured against great masses of solid black shading, Plastino manages to convey a sense of highly structured artificiality, like Park Avenue in the fifties. Batman himself is an affable bufoon, just like in the teevee series, and Robin likewise comes off all overenthusiastic and naive. When Plastino draws chicks, they're generally miniskirted and athletic and very good to look at.

Also in this realistic vein is Mary Worth, for whom Ernst Saunders does a marvellous job of drawing. He knows textures, this Ernst, and even if most of his chicks do look alike, hell, the world they move around in is undeniably real: it's the world of the late sixties, urban and suburban, rendered so realistically you can fairly smell the smog. They tell me Mary Worth is so abysmally middle-class, such a yenta herself, that she couldn't possibly be interesting: well personally, I think she's doing the community a service by exposing boredom where it exists — every episode of Mary Worth is an unforgettable experience in sheer unrelenting triviality and commonplaceness. I like the idea of teen-age kids reading this strip, it encourages them to drop out and take dope before they get trapped in a world like that. (Drop out, kids: it may be no bed of lilies here, but it's damn sight more fun than that.)

The Post has Pogo and Peanuts and Andy Capp, too I can't imagine anybody who doesn't read Pogo, the best all-around strip done today, so I will merely make the obligatory observation that it has affected the very language of America in a beneficent manner, and go on to Peanuts, which I detest. This daily collection of Presbyterian homilies has lost whatever charm it ever had: in the last few years the kids have become too stratified in their own neurotic poses and Snoopy has become too human and the Shulz imagination has become too threadbare to warrant reading any more. Ecco. Frankly, I think Andy Capp is infinitely more reflective of modern interpersonal conventions than Peanuts: Andy and Flo are bound together in the world by a force that transcends even love. They're human, they're both in the same bloody rotten boat and there's nothing to do but make the best of it, if you know a better 'ole, Existentialist, get your ragged arse to it. This whole Weltanschauung is gradually pervading all of society, and I am optimistic that if they don't blow us up we'll be living like Andy and Flo, all of us, in the bye and bye.

And finally, to the News. The scope of this article is too broad, EVO is too narrow to accommodate the News comics with any kind of justice. Dick Tracy alone deserves a 50,000 word article, which I'd be happy to compose for Cavalier or Esquire if they wanted it. L'il Abner too warrants a study in depth. Blondie and Dondi and Little Orphan Annie likewise cry for lengthy, detailed analysis. The whole thing makes me weep. In fact, and this is very unprofessional of me, I'm gonna cut off this article right here and go into the News comics next week. Hang ten, Y'all.

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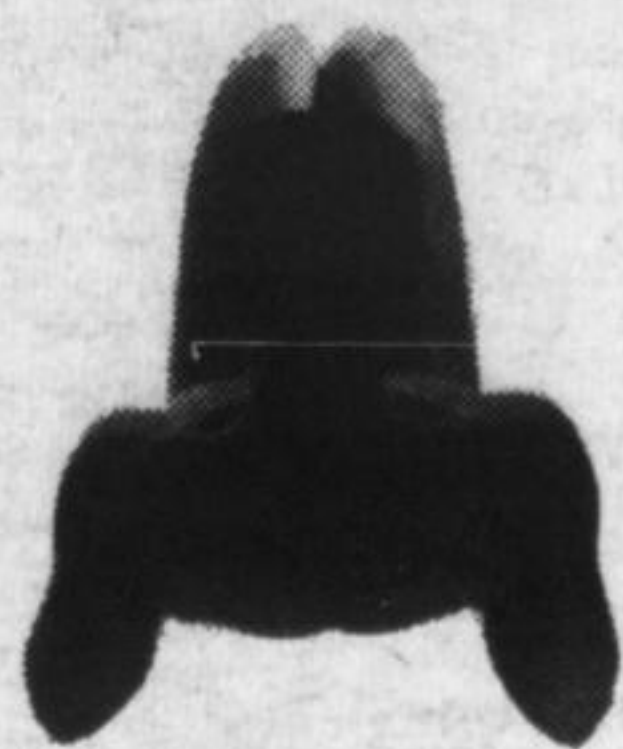
